



THE IRIBH SITUATION.

The Stuation in Ireland is rapidly becoming of such a character that the Government will be forced to choose between adopting an up-to-date version of Cromwell's "Thorough" method, or giving in to the malcontents. With the appointment of Sir Hamar Greenwood as Chief Secretary, and Sir Neville McCready as Commander of the Forces, a policy of concillation was determined on, and considerable leniency was shown to lawbreakers who did not deserve it. This policy, which it was hoped would result in a diminution of the lawlessness that had been so rampant for months past, has not only signally failed, but outrages have become more frequent than ever, and are considerably more desperate in character.

In seeking a remedy for present conditions in Ireland, it is necessary in the first place to ascertain the causes of them. 


