State slopshops thus become an essential adjunct of the common schools, and what will follow next who knows? One thing more, very certainly, provided that the Roman Catholic parochial schools are taken in as beneficiaries, as proposed in this city. The public school moneys cannot be thus granted to one denomination of religionists without giving others the same claim, and it will follow as surely as night the day that the claim will be made. Then there will be another class who may, perhaps with an equal show of right, insist upon anti-Christian teaching, and in the end we shall have the State supporting a rival set of schools, with intestine war in place of the harmony which existed before theorists and schemers began to dig their trenches about the common school system. As a final result, its total destruction may be fairly prophesied.
