CONSTITUTION
OF THE
MISSIONARY SOCIETY
OF THE
Wesleyan-Methodist Church in Canada.

ARTICLE 1.—That in consequence of the withdrawal of the British Conference from connexion with the Canadian Conference, the Canada Conference Missionary Society has ceased to be Auxiliary to the Wesleyan Missionary Society in England: it is therefore expedient that the Conference of the Wesleyan-Methodist Church in Canada reorganize and establish, as it existed previously to the year 1833, an independent Missionary Society, to be denominated THE MISSIONARY SOCIETY OF THE WESLEYAN-METHODIST CHURCH IN CANADA.

ART. 2.—The object of this Society is to excite and combine the exertions of the Societies and Congregations of the Wesleyan Methodists and others throughout the Province of Canada, in the support and enlargement of Missions among the Indians and destitute Settlers of this Province and elsewhere.

ART. 3.—The payment of One Pound and upwards, annually, shall constitute a Member; and the payment of Ten Pounds, and upwards, at one time, shall constitute a member for life, and shall entitle each to a copy of the Annual Report.

ART. 4.—The Officers of this Society shall consist of a Treasurer, Recording and Corresponding Secretaries, who, together with ten Managers, shall form a Board, by whom the business of the Society shall be transacted during the intervals of Conference. They shall be annually elected by the Society. At any meeting of the Board five shall form a quorum for the transaction of business.

ART. 5.—The President and Secretary of the Conference shall be, *ex officio*, Members of the Board of Managers.

ART. 6.—The Conference, at each of its Annual Meetings, shall appoint a Committee, consisting of the President and Secretary of the Conference, the Chairmen of Districts, and five others, whose duty it shall be to audit all the Accounts of the Expenditures, &c., during the past year, and make, as far as may be necessary, the appropriations for the support of the Missions during the ensuing year.

ART. 7.—All the Methodist Missionary Societies which have been, or may be formed in the several Districts of the Province of Canada, shall be entitled "Auxiliaries;" and all Societies in the particular Circuit of any District shall be entitled "Branches."

ART. 8.—All Benefactors of Ten Pounds, and upwards, and all Subscribers of One Pound, and upwards, annually, to any of the Auxiliary or Branch Societies, shall be deemed members of the General Society.

ART. 9.—An Annual Public Meeting of the Members and friends of the Society shall be held at the time, and place of the Session of the Conference; at which Meeting the Officers and Managers of the Society shall be appointed, according to Article 4.

R E P O R T.

CHRISTIANITY is from Heaven. The world needs her benedictions. Her truths dictated and revealed by plenary inspiration; her precepts invested with Divine authority; her promises full of grace; her spirit all love; and her institutions founded in them all,—in whatever country she is known and welcomed, there man's natural darkness is illuminated, his depravity sanctified, and his condition elevated.—“Wherever,” says Bishop Heber, “Christianity goes, civilization follows in her train; wherever she goes, the duties and the rights of mankind are practised and recognised; and the profession of godliness is shown to be great riches, as contributing to the wisdom, wealth, and happiness of the nation which receives it.” But the possessors of Christianity have received a spirit which must be diffused to be retained. It is the spirit of Christ, indignant at sin and the trammels of prejudice and party; bringing with it its native love, universality, and motives; and, with a majesty and mercy all its own, in celestial language commands—“Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself”!

Convinced of the scriptural correctness of these sentiments, the Committee of THE MISSIONARY SOCIETY OF THE WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH IN CANADA, in presenting their *Seventeenth* Annual Report, beg to say, they have been solicitous, during the past year, to see them powerfully influential throughout the entire field of the Society's operations. The visits to the Missions, of the Rev. John Ryerson, the Missionary Agent, have conduced to the advancement of the object desired. Having received “the glorious Gospel of Christ” themselves, the wish of the Committee has been to convey it, through their numerous Labourers, to others in different parts of Canada more or less deprived of it;—that they, too, might be enlightened by its truths and saved by its power.

In the discharge of their duties, however, the Committee have met with impediments not usually found in the path of evangetic enterprise—such as, the unjust interference of the Agents of the London Wesleyan Missionary Committee, and the illiberal advocacy of a certain exclusive ecclesiastical system by others. Thus has the work of the Prince of Peace been disturbed by some of his own professed children!

The last year was somewhat experimental, and very successful. This year, as last, principle—sound, deep-laid, and impulsive—has

produced a zeal which, but for its well-known origin, might have been deemed enthusiastic, on account of its unparalleled generosity. The Missions of the Society, in consequence, have increased: its congregations, schools, and members have increased: its contributors have increased. "Blessed be the Lord God, the God of Israel, who only doeth wondrous things!"

In confirmation of these general introductory statements, the Committee beg to present to the friends of the Society a particular view of its Missions;—first, among the Indian Tribes; secondly, among the White Settlers; with an Appendix containing the Subscriptions and Donations to the Society, and its Disbursements. This they will do succinctly, and, they hope, satisfactorily.

INDIAN MISSIONS.

This is a peculiar department of Christian labour which the Society occupies with anxiety and thankfulness: the objects of its anxiety being an ancient, migratory, and abused people; and its thankfulness arising from the fact of that people having to a great extent been sought and saved. In their salvation the Missionaries of this Society have taken precedence of all others; having been the first to follow them in their waywardness, and tell them of Him who came to seek and to save the lost;—the first to settle them in villages, and give them, by the blessing of God, the privileges of religion and the arts and comforts of civilized life. Not only was this Society first in the work, but, at present, the greater part of the Indian Missions in the Province belongs to it. This honour the Committee acknowledge with humility and gratitude. The rapidity of this work at its commencement they can never forget. The Apocalyptic angel flying through the midst of heaven, having the everlasting Gospel to preach, seems then to have lent his swiftness to the progress of conversion among the Indians.

The work, since, has spread and been established, notwithstanding numerous forbidding circumstances;—the stubbornness of wandering habits—tenacity of prejudice—vanity of ignorance—pride of paganism—bewitchery of independence—filth of indolence—thirst of intemperance—love of sensuality, and the resolution of the mercenary and merciless white man to make hereditary the degradation of the red man. But in the embryo-towns of the natives which beautify our land may be found the Indian farmer, mechanic, tradesman, school-teacher, and christian minister. There is the *living* solution of the question, "Can the Indians be civilized?" Though they have difficulties connected with the right to their lands, and other matters, they advance in their improvements. His Excellency the Governor-General, Sir Charles Bagot, is eminently their practical wellwisher, whom they revere and esteem. It is needless for us to say, that the change which has taken place in their views and condition, as social beings, has heightened their estimate of British benignity and care, and that there are none of the Canadian subjects of our beloved

Victoria, nor of these any more so than the Indians instructed by the Missionaries of this Society, who, with greater sincerity and zeal, "fear God and honour the Queen."

There, too, at the Indian villages, is the living solution of the question, "Can Indians be Christianized?" They can; and are indebted for their Civilization to their Christianization. On this felicitous topic we shall willingly let the Rev. Dr. John Harris be heard. Speaking, in his "Great Commission," of the power of the Gospel over them, he says:—"Under its subduing and humanizing influence, the convert from the Frozen Zone has been hailed as a brother in Christ by the Christian Indian in his native wilderness, and the once savage warrior of America has sent letters of peace and love to the fisher of Greenland. At its sound the barbarian veteran of a hundred battles, and of a hundred years, has become a little child; and a host of warriors, each of whom would once have preferred death to a tear, have wept, 'so that there was a very great mourning, like the mourning of Hadadrimmon.' What other evidence can be necessary? Instruments, which had never been used but for war and murder, it has converted to useful and even sacred purposes; and tribes, which had never met but in deadly conflict, it assembles together around the table of the Lord. It has declined no contest through fear of defeat—and wherever it has gone, it has erected monuments of its saving power."

CREDIT MISSION.

Here are some of the monuments of which Dr. Harris so eloquently speaks,—monuments more costly than the Corinthian pillars of Greece, and more durable,—monuments of grace. Here the Indians, sunk in sensuality, have been "born" of God; and their broad river has carried their praises, and their woods have echoed them. Here has there been a kind of Normal School for the Tribes of the Wilderness, from which, as from other of the Committee's Schools, native preachers, teachers, and interpreters have gone to important places in Canada and the States; and, of all their Missions, none has so much attracted the attention of foreigners visiting the Colony, or so fully, and at once, won their admiration. The Indians residing at this village are preparing to remove to Munceytown, under the direction of their leading chiefs, the Rev. Peter Jones and Mr. Sawyer; and when they do, it will be with many a lingering look at the place where they, polluted Pagans, were made praying Christians. Among them the Society has a Missionary, a School-Teacher, and an Interpreter. Near the village are several White Settlements, regularly supplied with the Gospel by the zealous Missionary; and, in all, the total number of members in Society is 122.—Increase 41. This Mission more than maintains its character for piety and usefulness. The Rev. David Wright says,—

"This indeed is one of the oldest Indian Missions, and this people were once the most ignorant, drunken, and miserable of any of the Chippeways in Canada. They are now among the most worthy members of our Church; and several who were converted at this Mission are actively employed as Ministers and Teachers, &c., in

our extensive and still-extending field of usefulness. Our people raise nearly all their bread, large quantities of potatoes, beef, and pork; and some of them have sold considerable to their neighbours. There has been a small increase in the Tribe, as also in the Church, and the Connexional funds have all improved greatly.

"The Sabbath School at this Mission, under the superintendence of our excellent friend, Mr. JOHN JONES, has been in successful and continued operation during the entire year. The average number of children in attendance is about 30, who have committed to memory and recited a great number of verses of Scripture. The Day School also has been in active operation throughout the year. Some of the children have made great improvement in spelling, reading, figures, geography, &c.

"The means of grace are very regularly attended; our congregations are much improved, and so is the singing. Several old and confirmed drunkards have been reclaimed. Our Total Abstinence Society is doing wonders. The Lord is with us; the 'God of Jacob is our refuge.'"

GRAND RIVER MISSION.

This Mission presents itself under more promising, though yet clouded auspices, than it did last year,—a number of the members, hearers, and children who had been drawn away having returned to their former fold, into which they were first gathered by the Society's Missionaries. None of the believers in the truth among the Aborigines evince a more decided and ardent piety than these Mohawks—most of them the worthy descendants of a debased and sanguinary people, who were the first to learn the law of love from Christ. They have a Missionary, a Teacher, and an Interpreter among them; and there is an increase of 34 members to the Church, belonging to the Mission; which is an object of the Society's constant care. The Rev. Kennedy Creighton writes:—

"It is matter of deep regret that the progress of scriptural holiness amongst these Indians has not been so extensive as it undoubtedly would under more favourable circumstances. Amongst the numerous obstacles with which the *truth* has had to contend, I would particularly mention two:—1st. The unsettled state of our Indian brethren as it regards their temporal affairs. The anxious suspense consequent on it has operated rather unfavourably to their advancement in civilization, and to their spiritual improvement. 2nd. The division that has been effected amongst the Indians by the exertions of the so-called British Missionaries. It is true they succeeded in turning away but a few of our members—and of these, some of the most pious and devoted have, in the course of the year, returned to our Church—yet the division still exists; in consequence of which some of the weak brethren have stumbled, the prejudices of others against Christianity have been confirmed, and much injury has been done to the cause of religion. But these and other impediments have been, by the blessing of God, in a measure surmounted. Sinners have been converted; and our members, with a very few exceptions, have held fast their profession, and are endeavouring to live in the practice of godliness. To God be all the praise!

"I have had occasional week-day services this year in three other places within the bounds of the Mission, besides those in our church on the Sabbath. The number of members in connexion with the Mission in this place is,—Indians, 56; Whites, 30; total, 86. The Sabbath morning congregation in the church, at present, averages 200. The number of children attending the School is,—males, 20; females, 22; total, 42. The Teacher has diligently discharged his duty, and the School is in a prosperous state."

MUNCEY MISSION.

This is the most extensive and important Indian Mission of the Society, and is in charge of the Rev. Peter Jones—the Indian's friend. On it, besides himself, the Society has employed *four* labourers during the year, and to it looked with an expectation which has not failed. The villages connected with it, and the congregations, classes, and schools, have prospered, and a large increase of members is reported. The Camp-Meeting spoken of in the following communication was peculiar in its character and happy in its results. Indians belonging to many different Tribes, speaking several tongues,—besides English, Canadian, Scotch, Irish, French, Dutch, and Africans,—crowded Nature's sanctuary to worship, and 75 individuals were converted. Their languages and voices were various—but their song was one:—

"JESUS is worthy to receive
Honour, and power divine."

During the year, the Muncey Indians, at the expense of the Society, have had printed, at the Conference Office, an edition of Hymns for their use, translated, and corrected while going through the press, by Charles Halfmoon, a useful Native Local Preacher and Interpreter. The Manual Labour School hereafter referred to has had the attention of the Conference, and it is hoped that several preliminary inquiries now being made will be favourable to such an institution. At the Muncey Mission some of the *last* conquests over Pagan prejudice and pride in Canada have been gained, in the casting down of idols many, now in the hands of benevolent persons, who, looking at them, while they wonder at the worship that was paid them, wonder more at the grace which has brought the idolaters to say, "Great is God above all gods." Mr. Jones, in his own pleasing manner, thus addresses the Committee:—

"The friends of Indian Missions will rejoice to know, that, in the midst of paganism, superstition, and ignorance, the Indian converts at the Muncey Mission have steadily advanced in christian knowledge and piety. Our religious services have been well attended, and the Spirit of the Lord has been poured out upon the congregations. The Indian Camp Meeting, held in September last, was greatly owned and blessed of God in the awakening and conversion of sinners, the reclaiming of backsliders, and in the strengthening of believers. We have 241 members in good standing, showing a cheering increase of 97 members. During the year we have baptized 66, many of whom were adult Indians recently converted from paganism. Three in our Society have died in faith, and entered into their eternal rest. We have one School amongst the *Ojebways* and *Munceys*, numbering about 35 scholars. We also have a School amongst the *Oncidas*, taught by Mr. A. W. Sickles, containing about 25 scholars. The Sunday School at the Mission church averages about 35 scholars.

"We have ten appointments on the Mission in each week, which are supplied by ourselves and our Indian Local Preachers and Exhorters, to whom we feel much indebted for their co-operation in the work of the Lord, and especially to brothers Abram W. Sickles, Thomas Magee, and Charles Halfmoon, whose zealous labours have been sanctioned by the Divine Spirit. During the past year the Oneida brethren have built (out of their own means) a neat frame church, which is well filled every Lord's Day with attentive hearers. No one can visit the Oneida Settle-

ment without being highly delighted with the rapid improvements they are making on their new farms. Many of them work like good white farmers, and bid fair to become a prosperous and a happy people. The Ojebways and Munceys are also beginning to turn their attention more to agricultural pursuits, and less to the chase. Our Indian and white friends here did well last year in their contributions to the Missionary Society of the Wesleyan Methodist Church. This year they have far exceeded their former doings, by raising the noble sum of £49 12s. 8d.

"In conclusion we would say, that although much has been accomplished amongst this people since the first introduction of the Gospel to them, very much still remains to be done; and, in our opinion, nothing can facilitate the object of their entire civilization so much as a well-conducted Manual Labour School. So anxious are the Indians of Munceytown to have a School of this kind, that they have pointed out an excellent piece of land, of about one hundred acres, which they would appropriate for this purpose should the School be established at this Mission. It is very desirable that a place of worship should be erected at Lower Muncey for the use of our Muncey brethren, who are anxious to have one, and are ready to assist to the utmost of their ability. We know of no place in Canada better calculated for an extensive Indian Settlement than Munceytown. The quality of the soil, the climate, and its secluded situation, render it a desirable location for all the scattering Indian Tribes. In our opinion, every true friend of the Indian race ought to give his influence and aid in the accomplishment of this object. May the Great Spirit continue to be with his servants, and crown their labours with abundant success!"

LAKE SIMCOE MISSION.

This Mission comprises two Indian Settlements, *Rama* and *Coldwater*, and several White preaching places adjacent to the Narrows of Lake Simcoe; and its duties are not performed by the Missionary without much toil and some danger. The former place is across the Lake, and the latter at Wabwahsheene, in a bay of Lake Huron, and cannot be reached but by canoe, in which he very often goes alone. There are 114 Indians in Society, and 18 Whites. The Committee are not aware that any Indians have been more disturbed in mind and circumstances by the manner in which their lands have been taken from them, than these have. Their former houses and farms lie waste, and of course the money of the Indians expended on them; and though those at Rama have had land allotted to them, the others at Wabwahsheene are literally living on a rock, where they have looked long and wistfully—and as yet to be disappointed—for news that land was allotted to them also. There they are without a School, and cannot possibly have their Missionary with them oftener than once a fortnight. But for his guardianship, they would, ere this, have plunged into their former vices, driven to the act by hopelessness. His untiring exertions, aided as he has been by Miss Pinney, the excellent School-Teacher, and two Indian Local Preachers, who are Interpreters—all employed by the Society—have been successful. The Indians at both places are pious, industrious, and honest; which is apparent from this fact, stated to the Committee by the Missionary, the Rev. S. Hurlburt. He says, "I was informed, by a merchant of this place, that the Indians paid their accounts more promptly than the White people." They are indebted to their religion for this testimony; which is the more remarkable, as, in consequence of their peculiar

trials and temptations, they have had their Christian consistency put to the severest test. In reporting the state of the Mission he observes :—

“The difficulties complained of in my last year's report still remain: nothing having been done to place the temporal condition of the Indians on a more permanent basis. Consequently, these causes still continue to operate, and are still producing their legitimate results. The schedule at the close of the year does not show much, if any, increase of members above that of last year. We are gratified, however, in being able to state that the moral character of our people, the Indians, never was better since our acquaintance with them than at the present time. The Society has, at the same time, experienced some variation, some new ones having been received during the year, and some having been expelled for intemperance and other causes, which leaves the number of members about the same it was last year. Could we, in reporting the numbers in Society, adopt the method of other Churches, and consider all members that have been baptized, we could greatly swell the list. My labours embrace the townships of Rama, Orilla, Oro, and Coldwater.

“We have no Sabbath Schools in this part of the country, except among the Indians. Of these we have two, numbering fifty scholars. The Indian School in Rama is necessarily subject to a good deal of interruption, on account of the wandering habits of the Indians. I wish also to state, that I think it highly necessary that the Indians in Rama should have an enterprising and active man devoted solely to them.

“The only way, in my opinion, that the preventives to the improvement of the Indians can ever be obviated, is by a Manual Labour School, where the rising generation can be brought up entirely away from the instruction of their parents. If by any means we can save the young, we may hope in time to see them a virtuous, prosperous, and happy people.”

SNAKE ISLAND MISSION.

This is a picturesque Island, near the entrance of Lake Simcoe, inhabited only by a body of Indians who were once incorporated with those living at Rama, near the outlet of the Lake, and have shared with them the perplexities attendant on their removal from the Narrows by Sir F. B. Head. The watchfulness of the Society has preserved their piety, and prevented them from returning to the woods. Theirs at present may be considered a happy, isolated home, where the preaching and care of Mr. John Williams, and the instructions he has daily bestowed on their children, have benefited them. It is not an Island in the Pacific Ocean, where another Williams fell a martyr to his Missionary intrepidity; but it is one where the God of Rarotonga has a people, once superstitious, who now love and serve the same Saviour. The number of members in class is 51, and their sobriety, tranquillity, and advancement in civilization, are very praiseworthy.

SAHGEENG MISSION.

Sahgeeng is the most remote of all the Society's Stations, and quite detached from the White community; but not too remote and secluded for the influence of the prayers and gifts of Christians to reach it; for they have found their way to the very deserving Tribe living there. There is to be seen a large congregation of attentive and converted Indians, a Day and Sabbath School, and a Society of 137 members, who walk before God in the way of his commandments, and have learned to say—“Thy law is my delight.” During the year, Mr.

Herkimer, whose sententious and stirring Addresses were heard at many of our Missionary Meetings, last winter, was the Missionary, assisted by an Indian School Teacher; and it is a circumstance meriting observation, that this Mission has for several years been entirely dependant on Native Pastors for its preservation and prosperity. Thus, they who a few years ago were themselves almost too debased to learn, do now, in their efficient instruction of others, afford undeniable evidence that they have, as Mr. Wesley expresses it, "*grace, and gifts, and fruit.*"

BALSAM LAKE MISSION.

Here the Preachers at Peterboro have laboured actively, and during this year a School Teacher has been placed there. A letter from him contains some particulars, of which we shall avail ourselves. It is eight years since the Indians removed to Balsam Lake, during the first seven of which they had not seven sermons preached among them. A year ago the first Missionary efforts were made on their Lake; a School was commenced, now attended by 30 children, 20 of whom are reading the Bible tolerably well, who at that time did not know the alphabet; something has been done in farming; every Indian over twelve years of age has signed the Total Abstinence Pledge; and 50 are members of our Church.

MUD LAKE MISSION.

The Indian Mission at Mud Lake has been connected with the Peterboro Circuit, and there are 14 Indians in our Church. The Preachers on that Circuit have likewise gone regularly into the Townships of Asphodel, Dummer, Otonabee, &c., and raised several classes and not a few congregations, which were found sufficiently interesting to induce the Conference to detach those Townships from the Circuit, and form them into what is now known as the "Asphodel Mission." This was done at the repeated solicitation of the people, and it is believed another Missionary will soon be needed by them.

OWEN'S SOUND MISSION.

The Indians have a small settlement, at *Big Bay*, a part of this Mission, composed of families long there, and of others who removed from Coldwater, because of the disappointments already noticed by the Committee. They have a Missionary, the Rev. John Neelands, and a Native School Teacher. There are 30 Indians in membership; all the children of sufficient age attend Day and Sabbath School; and 35 individuals of the body are members of a Total Abstinence Society, established for their benefit. The Mission embraces the inhabitants of the important, fast-peopling "*Owen's Sound Settlement.*" Their indefatigable Missionary finds the houses "few and far between," and, in travelling through the swamps and bad roads of several Townships, has no rest for the soles of his feet. He has been in journeyings and perils oft—gone from settlement to settlement with the "unsearchable riches" of His Master—opened Sabbath Schools for

children—held many social Prayer Meetings—distributed books and tracts—pushed the Temperance Reformation; and now has a lot of land for a church, given to the Conference, seven regular preaching places, 46 Whites in Society, 63 in the Schools, and 94 Temperance Members; and the people everywhere are grateful for the attentions of the Committee, and ask another Missionary.

Thus are the agencies of this Missionary Society extending from one Tribe to another, and the circles of the loving-kindness of the Divine Being enlarging to them;—and the day is not distant when every hand of Canada's Aboriginal thousands shall be lifted in adoration to Him, and every tongue acknowledge "God is love."

DOMESTIC MISSIONS.

This, to the Committee, is a deeply-interesting department of Christian labour, occupied, as well as the Indian department, with growing satisfaction. More than half a century ago Upper Canada was a wilderness of moral want, sending up its beseeching voice for help. There was solitude, poverty, hardship, toil, and sorrow, but no Gospel ordinances among a people who had them once. Their eyes could not see their teachers, and they and their children and children's children generally dwelt in ignorance and sin. Then some who remembered better days often said, "How amiable are thy tabernacles, O Lord of Hosts! My soul longeth, yea, even fainteth for the courts of the Lord." "When shall I come and appear before God?" Ah! there was no house of prayer: and when afterwards there was, the sorrowing complainant as often observed, "I was glad when they said unto me, Let us go into the house of the Lord."

When that was their condition, to accomplish this result the Methodist Minister came and found the entire country a field for Missionary labour,—contemplated it as such; and, with an apostolic heroism of purpose and of action, hailed the destitute in their shanties with—"I bring you good tidings!"—and by day and by night cried, in every settlement he could reach, "Behold the Lamb of God!" Other men of hardihood and faith came to the rescue of dying souls, and from day to day, and month to month, and year to year, the forest heard and felt the exclamation and the reverberation—"God is with us!" The Rev. Dr. Ryerson has well said, "In the spirit of primitive Christianity those devoted men went forth, not counting their lives dear unto them, * * * to testify to the pioneer-settlers of the country the 'glorious Gospel of God our Saviour.'"

The work, thus commenced, has every following year been favoured of God with glorious progression. And still it moves; and still it spreads; and still it saves. What it was in the beginning, it is now—evangelical in its character. To this is attributable the delightful fact, that, at the present moment, the Wesleyan Methodists

have nineteen thousand members in their Church, and a hundred thousand hearers in their congregations. Of the Methodist Ministers in America, the Rev. Thomas Jackson, in his Centenary volume, remarks—"The Ministers in general are eminently *Travelling Preachers*, * * * oftener seen on horseback, each carrying with him his limited wardrobe and his Bible, than in the study or the parlour." In a paragraph devoted to "The Methodist Church in Canada," he truly and honourably remarks—"Were it not for the ministry of the Wesleyan Preachers in *Upper and Lower Canada*, many thousands of the British settlers would be entirely destitute of the ordinances of Christianity."

GUELPH MISSION.

The labours of the Society's Missionary stationed at Guelph extend into seven Townships, which require much travelling on bad roads, that the settlers may have the "bread of life" broken to them. In Guelph, as was stated in the last Report, the church had been taken from the Canada Conference; but land has been obtained by our people for another, to be erected ere long. The members have increased from 60 to 99; and the Rev. Ezra Adams writes that he has "formed four new classes, making nine on the Mission;" and recommends the employment of a second Missionary. In some Townships there "has been an extensive awakening and revival, and the fields are white for harvest;" and, in faith, he says, "There will be an extensive and precious ingathering of souls there the coming year, unless some enemy arise to oppose the blessed work. * * * * May the Lord pour His Spirit on this dear people, and gather them with an almighty arm!"

BARRIE MISSION.

The eight Townships embraced in this Mission were, not many years ago, a part of the Lake Simcoe Mission, and in charge of one Missionary. Now there are *four* Missionaries among the Whites and Indians who had his single services;—at Barrie alone there are two Preachers,—where there were but a few irregular appointments there are more than twenty regularly supplied,—where only some dozen members were, there are 190 Whites,—the increase last year was nearly 50 members,—several Sabbath Schools are doing well,—the Temperance Reformation extends,—and in the town of Barrie, where we worshipped in the public School-house, the Conference has a very eligible plot of ground granted by the Crown, and a neat church and parsonage just erected on it at the expense of our Church and congregation there. Last year the Rev. Messrs. T. McMullen and Michael Fawcett were stationed there; and, when they left a people to whom they were attached, thanked God that His word had "run," had "free course," and been "glorified."

BROCK MISSION.

Here there are eight or nine Townships, where the people are visited by two Missionaries, who have nearly thirty appointments each in a month. It was verily a dark section of the country, but light has broken in upon it, and many of the settlers "rejoice in the light." There are 169 members—some good Sabbath Schools—and a growing attention to the Temperance enterprise. Here, as in other places where the Society's Missionaries have gone, was it said when first visited by them—"How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him that bringeth good tidings!"

MARMORA MISSION.

There are four Townships connected with this Mission, which have had the word and ordinances from the excellent Ministers on the Sidney Circuit; nine regular appointments; seven classes containing 94 members, and 29 on trial; and a cheering work of grace in progress. The Rev. G. F. Playter says:—

"A circumstance may be mentioned to encourage Missionary operations. Hungerford is a township of but late settlement. Almost from the commencement our Ministers have attended it, but with little encouragement. This year a special effort was made. The Lord blessed that effort; and now there is a Society of 34 persons in the principal settlement, and a neat school-house erected. The moral change in this settlement is noted by the inhabitants around. On the 8th of May, I administered the Sacrament of Baptism to 33 persons, infants and adults; and afterwards, the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, (the first time, I believe, of its administration in the township,) to about 50. The services of the day continued from 10 in the morning to 4 in the afternoon."

WARWICK AND ADELAIDE MISSION.

Some persons here, who had been induced to leave our Church, have returned, and others been converted; so that we have an addition of hearers, and of nearly 30 members. Our untiring Missionary, the Rev. David Hardie, is much encouraged in his arduous work, which extends through several Townships, where he has many congregations, 82 members, and signs of greater success. Greater, we have no doubt, he will secure, by his faith and fortitude.

HURON MISSION.

An extent of country lying between London and Goderich, where some interesting congregations have been collected, and classes formed, and where there are hopes of much good being accomplished. The settlements are numerous, and have too long been without the ordinances; but, at last, the dwellers in the dark "Huron Tract" can point to its radiant traces of the Saviour's goodness.

WALPOLE MISSION.

This Mission, united as it is with the Simcoe Circuit, has repaid the Society for its services in a growth of members and pious activity, and much fruit is expected where the "seed" of the kingdom has been sown liberally. The Rev. Peter Kerr thus writes:—

"The Walpole Mission embraces the eastern parts of the Townships of Woodhouse and Townsend, the entire Townships of Walpole, and parts of Rainham and Cayuga. There are seven appointments on the Mission, embracing 102 members. We have admitted 11 on trial. The 'encouragement of success' is now far more favourable here than was intimated in the general Report last year. In Walpole our members and friends have erected a comfortable church during the past season, which is nearly ready for *dedication*, and without encumbrance upon it. It will seat between 3 and 400 persons, and is the *first and only* place of worship in the township."

SCHOOGOG MISSION.

The Townships of Cartwright, Manvers, &c., where this Mission is situated, contain hundreds of scattered colonists, who were, until within a year or two, destitute of religious instruction. Now they have it from the Rev. Moses Blackstock, who preaches at twelve different places, and has a society of 63 members, whose earnest wish is that their Missionary may be continued to them. They cannot spare the cup of life.

MISSIONS IN THE EASTERN DISTRICTS.

Clarendon, Plantagenet, Bonchire, and Pembroke. On these extensive Missions there is ruggedness as to the country, and destitution as to the people; and consequently no rest for our hardy Missionaries. But this year they have added 50 persons to the Church, and number now 300 members; are multiplying Sabbath Schools; inducing many of the settlers to hear the Gospel regularly; exerting themselves in the promotion of Temperance principles; and in various ways raising up a virtuous and happy people.

Besides these Missions there are distant and destitute portions of several Circuits of an evidently Missionary character receiving the Gospel by means of the Society. We refer to the *Perth, St. Andrews, Amherst Isle, and Thames* Circuits, and others, where, though we speak of those portions as destitute, they are deserving, welcome the Word with joy, and contain many congregations, and hundreds of persons belonging to our Church.

After this apostolic manner does the Society seek out the sons of spiritual necessity, and become their friend; and, led on by the hand of a waiting and directing Providence, and aided by the Spirit of God, every settlement and family of our magnificent Country shall hear the Truth, and every settler may receive the Saviour;—that, where a Colonist is found, there may also be found a Christian.

CONCLUSION.

At the close of this imperfect survey of the Stations of the Missionary Society of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, the Committee would unite with the friends of the Society in presenting an oblation of praise to God for the success of its operations during the year. He hath honoured the Committee with a share in the evangelization of the world: He hath directed them to the best means for its attainment: He hath secured for their plans and labours cheering efficiency: He hath moved the contributors to an augmented liberality: He hath extended the sphere of sacred toil, and found the Society men of grace and gifts to occupy it: He hath rendered all the Missions more than ever the scenes of Gospel triumph, and unfolded to faith still brighter. Thine, O God, "is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory."

"Thou *only*, LORD, the work hast done,
And bared thine arm in all our sight."

The warmest *thanks* of the Committee are offered to all persons who have in any way, or on any occasion, contributed to the support and success of the Society;—to the Gentlemen who have so ably presided at the Public Meetings; to the Ministers and Gentlemen who have kindly and effectively delivered addresses at them, especially the speakers not of our own Denomination; to the Ministers composing the Deputations, who, at no small expenditure of time and personal convenience, attended the Meetings; to the Officers of the different Circuit Branch Societies, more especially the Ladies who were Collectors; and though last, not least, to the entire body of Subscribers and Donors, both old and young, of our own Church, and of other Christian Churches, (for in others there are not a few,) who have evinced so generous and prompt a spirit in replenishing and sustaining the funds of the Society. Their individual and united, diversified, important, and very successful services and gifts, will not escape the notice, nor be uncrowned with the smile of Him who says, "He which *soweth* bountifully, shall *reap* also bountifully." For men of Christian beneficence there is an immense reserved reward of immortality and joy; and already are the supporters of this Society participants in the eulogiums and glories resting on the promoters of CHRISTIAN MISSIONS; of which the Rev. Richard Winter Hamilton, in his "Prize Essay on Missions," says, "Like the ecliptic, they girdle our globe as with a sun-track, with a belt of ever-spreading splendour."

And now for the FUTURE—glowing with hope. Will not the next year be as the past, and much more abundant in benevolence and zeal? The abounding of Christian charity for the Society heretofore is the reason for present confidence. The Income of the Society has been scrupulously applied to its intended object, so that the judicious Treasurer, with a Karen when once about to leave America for Burma with benevolent offerings, has said, "This no me money—this Jesus Christ's money." But at present he has in hand a balance very

inadequate for the ensuing year's expenses; which is regretted, as the year of the Society ending in June, and the Missionary Meetings not being held till winter, the balance should always be large to carry on operations. This year's Missionary Meetings were occasions of noble effort and inexpressible delight, and the list of Subscriptions and Donations is to the Committee a catalogue of promises for the next year. To their friends they say—Come near to the altar of God and perform a fresh act of consecration. Advocates of, Collectors for, and Givers to the Society, come; and He, whose cause it is, shall pour on you, in plenitude of effusion, blessings from his fulness of unfathomable, immeasurable love. Sacrifice here is a reasonable obligation. Dr. Duff, of India, thus appeals to the Church of Christ:—"Let her revive the golden age of the Christian Church, when professing believers * * were ever prepared to testify, not only the sincerity, but the height and depth, and length and breadth of their gratitude and love to the blessed Redeemer, by submitting to the amplest sacrifices of comfort, life, and all."

Be that lofty, inspired prediction frequently read and devoutly regarded:—"He shall live, and to Him shall be given of the gold of Sheba: PRAYER also shall be made for Him continually; and daily shall He be praised." Prayer shall be made! Without it our plans, our powers, our performances, our property, cannot avail. There may be a sacred engine prepared,—massive in its parts, symmetrical in its forms and finish, and adapted in its design for transcendent effect,—but unless there be superinduced the omnipotence of God, all is futile. The Missionary work is holy, and the Holy Ghost is to inspire it. The propelling power *must* be Divine. To God, then, go, bearing the Society to the throne. "Pray without ceasing." More than eighty years ago the Missionaries of the Moravian Society divided among them the twenty-four hours of day and night for supplication, to the intent that *continual* intercession might be made. O that this may be the practice in Canada!

The INDIANS in charge of the Society call for the continued solicitude, liberality, and prayers of their many friends. Are they not an *injured* people? The "Report of the Imperial Parliamentary Committee on Aboriginal Tribes, for 1837," frankly states, "It is not too much to say, that the intercourse of Europeans in general, without any exception in favour of the subjects of Great Britain, *has been*, unless when attended by MISSIONARY exertions, a source of *many calamities to uncivilized nations.*"—Are they not a *needy* people? We rejoice that it does appear, from the survey of the Missions already taken, that much has been done for this people: but some are yet debased by paganism; others are only nominally Christian; and too many, both of their adults and youth, are but partially instructed, and little elevated in civilized life.—Have they *disappointed* the reasonable expectations of their benefactors? The hundreds of sober and pious members of our Church among them shall answer. Their crowded churches, their useful school-houses, their orderly dwellings, their new-made farms shall answer. Their active Native Preachers, Teachers,

and Interpreters on remote Missions shall answer. Their death-beds, where the Redeemer's Name is heard, and their Red company before the Throne, shall answer. To lay before their friends this enumeration of benefits is a duty; but to plead for this people the Committee believe is scarcely necessary. They believe their Missions among the Aborigines will be supported; and they will add no more on this subject than the simply affecting incitation to activity of the Rev. Anson Green, President of the Conference—"Send them the only blessing which they crave at our hands—SEND THEM THE GOSPEL OF PEACE."

The WHITES who have the Gospel sent them by this Society deserve the undiminished sympathy and services of the Missionaries of, and the contributors to, it. The claims of the Destitute Settlers are *just* and *urgent*. There is a relationship between them and us, as in the case of the Aborigines. Are they descendants of the same primeval parents? So are we. British subjects? So are we. Bought with blood? So are we. Born heirs to the spiritual privileges of Christendom? So were we. Their number has been greatly increased the past year by emigration. Some of them have made the most distant solitudes of the Canadian wilderness their abode;—and remembering the felicity of former associations, and the Sabbath-day scenes and songs of a *foregone* home, exclaim in sadness verging on despair, "How shall we sing the Lord's song in a *strange land*?" Without this Society the Whites who *have* had the Gospel sent them by it must have been without it; and the imploring, piercing voice from far-off human households *now* must be vain. Shall no friend hasten to them, and weep over, and relieve their wants? Shall no messenger of peace hail them with the olive-branch? Shall no tidings of mercy be borne to the unsaved among those settlers? Shall the pious among them lose their piety through *our* neglect? Shall no Missionary of *your* Society proclaim Christ to them, that they may have the Gospel *again*, and, for it, fill the wilderness with their thankful acclamations?

And now for RESOLUTION founded in weightiest reasons. Indians and Whites are perishing, some saying to us, "No man careth for my soul." Will we care for them? The command comes with imperiousness from the place of the Eternal—the God of love, "Do good unto all men." Shall we do them good? Past success in the momentous and merciful work we are engaged in is not to be forfeited by present omission of duty. We have become the instructors of the ignorant; they must not again be enveloped in darkness:—the shepherds of once wandering Indian tribes, now gathered and watched; they must not wander again:—the defenders of the defenceless; they must not be left to the destroyer. If we go not to the destitute with the truths of the Bible, the impostor may go with his errors. Shall we delay till he does so? The object of the Society is stamped with catholicity. Its Missionaries, in their long and arduous search for souls in the forest, fix not their attention and love exclusively on Methodists, but on men of every name, and, as they have opportunity, are the friends of all, and the foes of none,—fervently breathing a charity which allows no difference where Christ and our Christian

Government have made no distinction. May His blessing rest on all who love Him in sincerity! The piety, peace, and progress of the community are promoted by this Society, and are the pledges of its excellence and utility in days to come. Self-interest dictates for it an *onward* course. Never were its energies so free, nor its influence and benefits so diffusive as this year; and never had our Church such an amplitude of success in the salvation of souls. The glorious fact is, she is bound up to duty by her blessings. As a Missionary Church she has been guided by Providence; sanctioned and sustained by the munificence of the Canadian public; honoured by the Spirit of God with prosperity in all her operations;—and, to maintain her present position, and keep her glory from decay, she must remain what she is—A MISSIONARY CHURCH.

And now for ACTION. The *Cross* claims action—wise, combined, energetic, unwearied—action from *all*. Who can deny its claims? Who will not allow and answer *them*? The Society has its instrumentalities planted in the shade of the Cross. Who now will rally—give—labour—die *there*? There only is salvation for the world, the mighty power for its renovation, and the reward of *perpetual* Christian devotedness. The Hon. and Rev. Baptist Noel, in his address at the last Anniversary of the Church Missionary Society, with an earnest eloquence, observes—“If the honour of the Saviour is dear to us; if we wish to express our gratitude for privileges we feel to be inestimable; if, as we take our peaceful way to glory amidst the various labours and conflicts of life, bearing them all the more cheerfully because we know there is a resting-place beyond; if, while we feel happy in our own souls, and see our families blessed by the principles God has given us to know, to receive; if these great principles and motives can act upon our minds as the disciples of the Redeemer, by bringing them all to bear on the great work which, as it has the sanction of his authority, nay, is urged by his express command, so has the assurance of his continued blessing—let us endeavour *liberally* and *fully*, as we have the power of doing so, to accomplish the great commission he gave to his disciples, ‘Go ye into *all the world*, and *preach the Gospel* to EVERY CREATURE.’”
