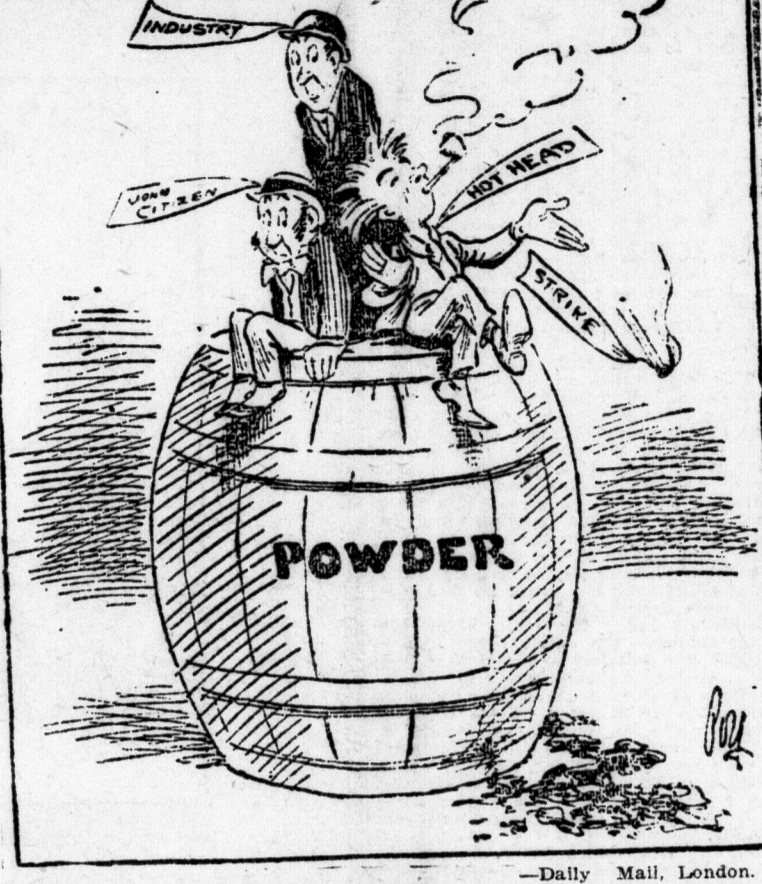

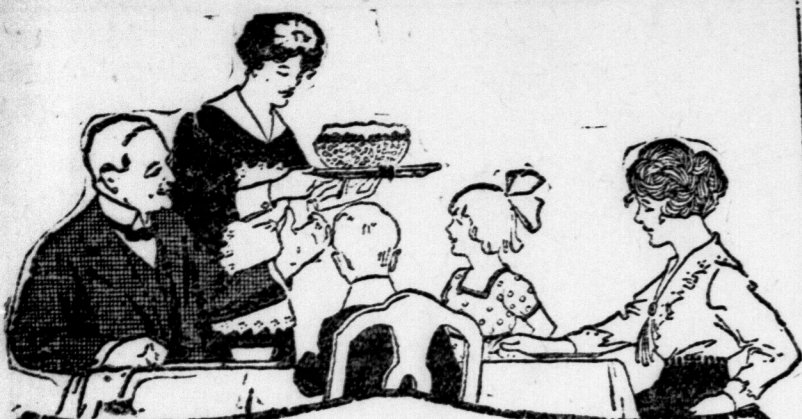

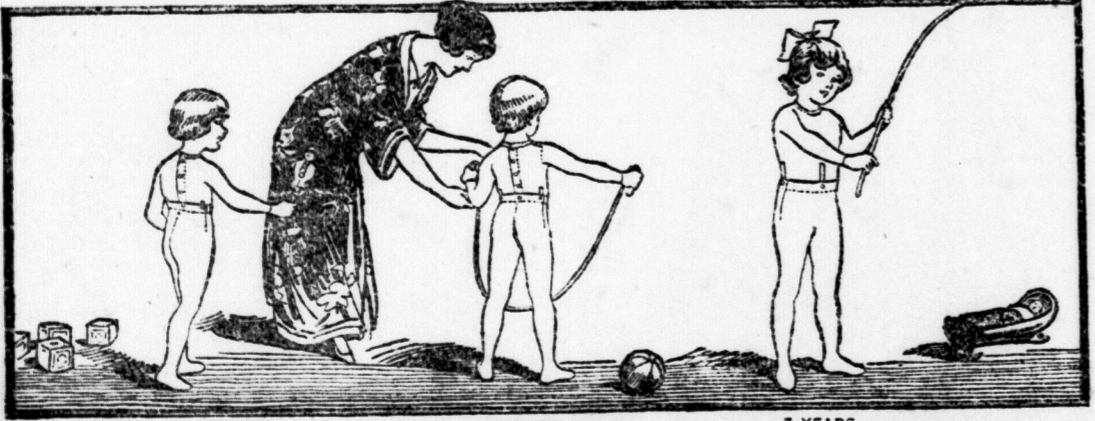

NORTH OF IRELAND RESIDENTS ANXIOUS TO COME TO CANADA

Hon. J. A. Calder Foresees Big Influx of Old Country Citizens Next Year.

SELECTED WITH CARE Special Effort Made to Secure People Who Will Go On the Land.

NEW YORK, Sept. 26.—(By Canadian Press)—Hundreds of residents of the north of Ireland are anxious to emigrate to Canada, according to Hon. J. A. Calder, minister of immigration in the Dominion cabinet, who arrived here Saturday on the Mauretania on his way back to the capital after an extended trip of inspection of the Canadian immigration offices in the old country.

Not Visit Ireland. Mr. Calder visited the agencies of his department in England and Scotland and found the organization working efficiently. He did not go to Ireland, but to a Canadian Press correspondent he stated that reports he had received from the Belfast office showed that there was unusual activity there.

Big Tide of Immigration. Mr. Calder stated that particular care was being taken by the old country representatives of the department in passing upon the immigrants and that every effort was being made to secure people who would go on the land. He declared that those who were being accepted at present were of a remarkably fine class, and that judging from the inquiries at the various offices in England and Scotland, there would be a big tide of immigration to the Dominion next year.
