The world's stock of sheep has de-reased by 54,000,000 head since the ar began. Millions of cattle aud wine have also been destroyed swine have also been destroyed. While the war lests the resulting shortage in cattle and hogs will have to be in part endured in order to conserve grain for ashipments oversees. But the immense gap between supply and demand must be bridged as far as possible to save a desperate situation. The most effective step that we cartake at present is to greatly increas: the number of sheep. These can successfully be maintained on pasture in summer without any supplementary lood, and in winter on hay and roots with a very trifting amount of grain in the present crisis, and especially in view of the shortage of mill feed which must follow a low yield or grain in the West, it is imperative to increase the stock of sheep in Eastern Canada. In this connection we direct attention to the joint policy of the Federal and Provincial Departments of Agriculture which is advertised in a late issue of this paper.

Male citisens of the United States living in Canada or AGES 21-30, both inclusive, MUST RECISTER BY RR GISTERED POST with the Registrar under the Military Service Act of the district in which they live, during the TEADAYS NEXT FOLLOWING SEPTEMBER 28th, 1918; and such CITIZENS OF THE AGES 19, 20 AND 31-44, both inclusive, must so register during the TEN DAYS NEXT FOLLOWING OCTOBER 12th, 1918, it must be emphasized that THIS INCLUDES AMERICANS LIVIN 3 IN CANADA OF THE ABOVE AGES, MARRIED AND SINGLE, and OF THE ABOVE AGES, MARRIED AND SINGLE and Cludes ALSO ALL THOSE WHO HAVE REGISTERED WITH AN AMERICAN CONSUL, or HAVE REGISTERED FOR MILITARY SERVICE IN THE UNITED STATES.
