



THE Lord is my shepherd; therefore can I lack nothing.


2 He shall feed me in a green pasture; and lead me forth beside the waters of comfort.

The following resolution was passed by the Board of Management, M.S.C.C., Montreal, P.Q., October 15th, 1913:

Moved by Hon, S. H. Blake, Seconded by the Bishop of Toronto.

Resolved: "This Board feeling deeply how wide-spread is the omission of daily family prayer and reading of the Word in the households of the Church of England in Canada, and the great loss in spiritual power that must arise from the neglect of these means of grace and from the failure thus daily to acknowledge God as our Creator, our Father, our Preserver, and our continual Benefactor. Resolved that a Committee to be named by the Primate with power to add to its numbers, be appointed to take up and deal with this question and to formulate a plan having for its object the introduction of Daily Family Prayer and the Reading of God's Word in every household of our Church throughout the Dominion."

And be it further resolved that the said Committee shall report to the Executive Committee of this Board, which shall have power to take up the matter and deal with it in co-operation with the House of Bishops so as to carry out to the best of its ability the intention of this resolution."

Whereupon the matter was taken up by the Executive Committee and on the 17th of January, 1913, the accompanying compilation was considered and approved of and the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

Moved by Hon, S. H. BLAKE, Seconded by Archbeacon Cody.

Resolved: "That that the Compilation of "Morning and Evening Prayers for Family Use," presented to the Committee, be approved and be recommended to the House of Bishops for its consideration."
