The First Fifteen Hundred Reached Winnipeg Yesterday

Winnipeg, April 18 .- The population of the west will be increased to the extent of ten thousand people by the immigrants that are due there this week, and of this number, at least fif-teen hundred will arrive in the city before noon tomorrow. # MILLER AN I-BETTING BIL

Different Classes Who Supported and Opposed

OUESTION OF BREEDING PLAYED IMPORTANT PART

Interesting Sketch of the Conditions During the Big Debate

Ottawa, April 16.—It might perhaps be asumed that after the exhaustive debate of the Miller anti-gambling bill in the house, the latter part of the week nothing would be left to be said on the subject; also, that in the light of the fate which overtook the proposed measure, the question relative to race track gambling through the nedium of the bookmaker, is a dead

But assuming that at least a goodly percentage of the members who sup-ported the measure as it came from the special committee were actuated by a motive having its inspiration in by a motive laying its inspiration in an ethical line of reasoning apart from any form which the discussion took the floor of the house, and which seemed to be the case, it may be fairly ged that the question not only ot dead but that there is somethin urther to be said in relation thereit To one who listened to the debate hroughout, one circumstance in con nection with the proceedings was impressive. That was that numerous conspicuous gentlemen on the government side of the chamber in particular and of the opposition members as well, took no part in the discussion but in voting gave silent support to the bill. Apparently, these members recognized that there is a real evil in recognized that there is a real evil in relation to the matter dealt with in the bill, but were not altogether sat-isfied with its terms, felt possibly, that structurally it was not perfect in plac-ing too extreme limits upon human conduct but being unable to accept the spacious alternative of the substitute uncommend in the McGelly emergedment presented in the McColl amendment gave support to the measure.

The advocates of the bill laid stress, in their arguments, on the great harm society suffers through persons who bave not the money to spare, squand-ering their substance in race track gambling while the stock argument of those opposed to it was that to stop book making would stop racing and that would have an adverse effect on the breeding of thoroughbred horses But the gentlemen who took no ac-tive part in the matter and contented themselves with voting with the friends of the bill, seemed to be act-Friends of the bill, seemed to be act-uated by a consideration higher than any that was dealt with in the debate. As was subsequently learned from one of them, this was, that Canada has been growing very fast in the last fact and of other contributing factors, a radical change in conditions a radical change in conditions has come upon society. One of these factors is that several of the states of the American union have of late years passed legislation restricting race track gambling and this fact together


