The woodwork in the dining room is of African mahogany, and the ruddy tone of which forms an ideal contrast to the silver and glass of the table service. The covers and ceilings are carried out in a lighter tone of the same color as that in the room immediately above the windows, and ample ventilation is secured by means of an ornamental perforated frieze in this cornice.
