A MINERALOGICAL MUSEUM.

An Influential Delegation Sees the President About It.

In response to a call issued by President Charles Carroll of the Canadian Institute to the geologists who signed the petition for the establishment of a mineralogical museum in Toronto, a delegation composed of the Professor, Col. George A. Shaw, James H. Weston, Arthur Harvey, David Boyd, Dr. Percy, Dr. Ellis, John Lewis, M. A. A., Arthur B. Stewart, W. Hamilton Morris and T. H. Clougher waited on Hon. Oliver Sargent yesterday afternoon.

On the whole this summary shows that Canada has a wealth of mineral resources, which are very little known outside of the industrial field, notwithstanding the fact that the mineral resources in Canada in their development, are not so rich as those in the United States.

Other geologists took up the subject from educational, business and speculative points of view. Mr. Sargent replied that he would give the matter his most serious consideration.

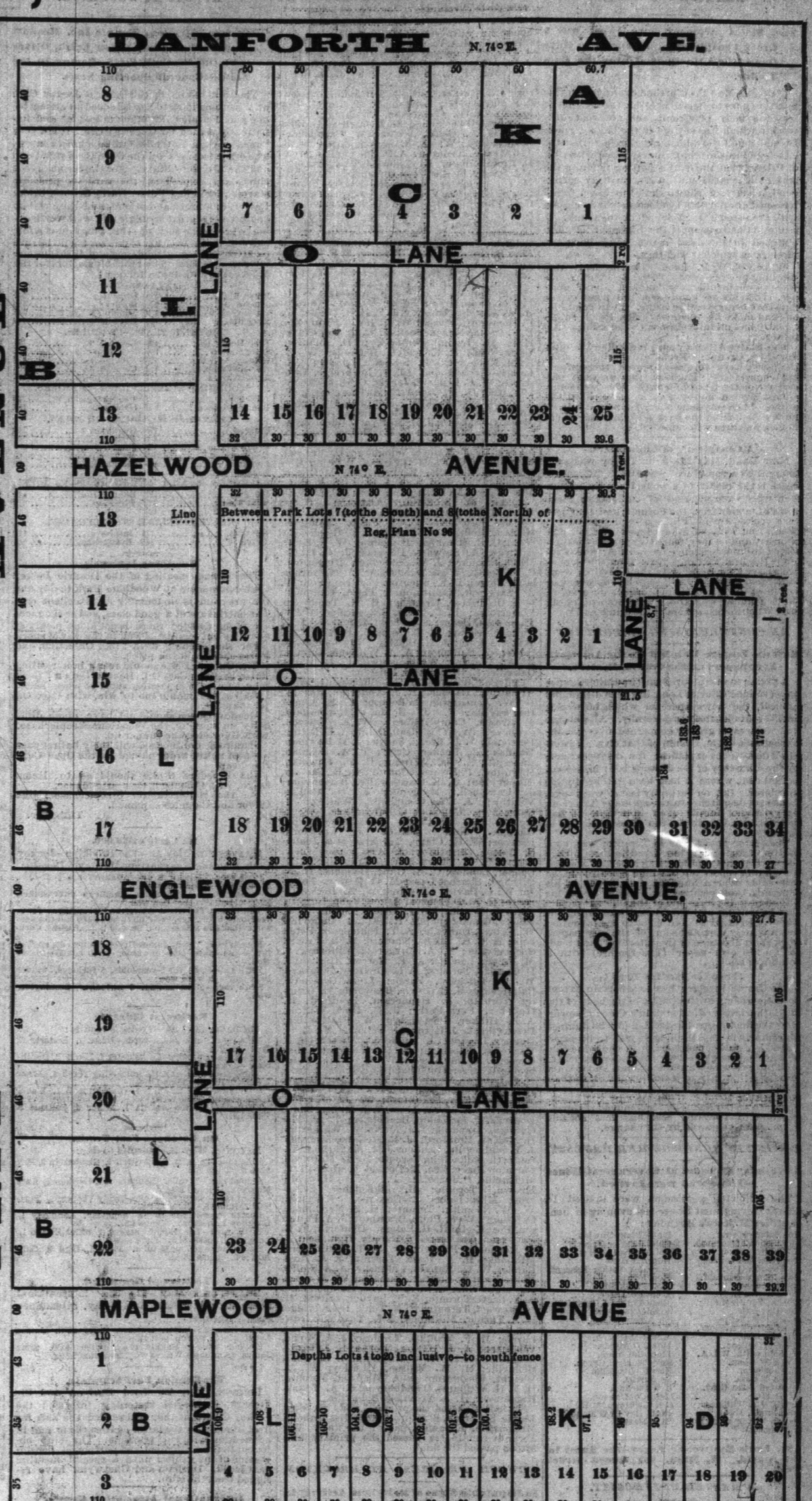
