
## INTRODUCTION

This Reference Paper is intended as a guide to the main sources of information relative to Canada, both official and private.

Dominion and Provincial Government Departments and National Associations and Federations are primarily concerned with disseminating information within Canada in either or both of the official languages, English and French. Government Departments and organizations engaged in the distribution of information about Canada in foreign countries are the Departments of External Affairs and Trade and Commerce, the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation (International Shortwave Service), the National Film Board of Canada and the Canadian Information Service. They operate in the field through the following channels:

External Affairs:	Diplomatic Representatives
Trade and Commerce:	Trade Commissioners or Commercial Secretaries
Canadian Broadcasting Corporation:	C B C International Service
National Film Board:	Its own Distribution Officers and through Canadian Diplomatic Missions and Trade Commissioners
Canadian Information Service:	Its own Officers and through Diplomatic Missions and Trade Commissioners.

It is intended to publish six-monthly revisions of this Reference Paper.

## PART I: OFFICIAL SOURCES OF INFORMATION

*NOTE:* The Department of Public Printing and Stationery, Government Printing Bureau, Ottawa, under the King's Printer, is responsible for printing and publishing all Dominion Government publications.

The Department also publishes the *Canada Gazette* (weekly), a record of official Government notices. In close co-operation with the House of Commons and the Senate, the Department issues sessional reports on parliamentary proceedings: These are:

The Senate - Debates  
Minutes of Proceedings  
House of Commons - Debates  
Votes and Proceedings  
Orders of the Day  
Bills of the Senate and  
House of Commons (Public and Private)

It also publishes Annual Statutes and Acts (Public and Private), with Amendments to date.

All Departments of Government as well as a number of governmental organizations and commissions issue Annual Reports for consideration by Parliament and for allocation of operating monies. Copies of these are available at various prices upon application to the Department of Public Printing and Stationery.

*Nearly all publications issued by Government Departments are available in English and French.*

- - - - -

The Department of Public Printing and Stationery issues an annual catalogue with quarterly supplements, containing titles and selling prices of official publications (Price: 25 cents).

When ordering, the exact title of the publication desired should be given, and prepayment of charges is required with each order. Remittances by postal money order, express order or accepted cheque made payable to the *Receiver General of Canada* should be mailed to the *King's Printer, Ottawa*. Postage stamps and foreign money will not be accepted. No extra charge is made for postage on documents forwarded to points in Canada and the United States; but cost of postage is added to the selling price as indicated when publications are to be mailed to other countries.

In the case of certain publications a limited free distribution is made by the King's Printer under authority of Order in Council.

**MEDIA:**

Publications: Periodicals: The Department issues a *Farm News Press Clip Sheet* (weekly, English) containing brief news items of interest to Canadian farmers. Distributed to farm papers across Canada.

Other Publications issued from time to time are listed in the Department's official *List of Publications* (annual, English and French). Publications on this list cover such subjects as the care and feeding of livestock, dairying, field crops, horticulture, crop protection, fertilizer, farm machinery, farm management, poultry, bees, food conservation, insects and plant diseases, marketing, etc. The Department also publishes reprints from leading agricultural and scientific periodicals.

Films,  
Filmstrips:

Documentary films (16mm and 35mm, English and French) and filmstrips of interest to farm audiences; these are produced and distributed by the National Film Board.

Graphics:

Lantern slides, posters, wall-hangers and other graphic material as well as travelling exhibits dealing with rural and farm activities.

Reports in the *Conference Series* cover the proceedings of certain international conferences in which Canada has participated.

The Department also publishes a list of "Canadian Representatives Abroad and Representatives in Canada of the British Commonwealth and Foreign Governments" as well as a "Diplomatic List with which is included the list of British Commonwealth Representatives and of Consuls General in Ottawa".

Publications Publications issued from time to time deal with specific aspects of fish culture, processing and marketing of the most common varieties of fresh and salt water fish, and with statistical information of interest to the fishing industry.

Others deal with methods of canning and preparing fish, home salting and canning, and with the nutritional value of fish in the normal diet.

Other publications issued from time to time deal with such subjects as wage rates, strikes, collective bargaining, vocational training for veterans, labour management production committees, industrial relations, price and wage control, etc. (English and French).

The Department is about to issue a booklet listing all professional and business associations in Canada with their full addresses and short descriptions of their aims.

Films: Documentary films produced by the Parks Bureau deal with general nature subjects and are circulated through the distribution facilities of the National Film Board and through the Branch's own contacts. While this Branch has produced a number of films in the past, its current production program is handled by the National Film Board.


