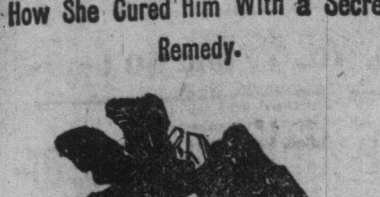

A NEW COMMERCIAL TREATY

Sugar Duty Trouble May Be Removed in That Way.

St. Petersburg, Aug. 2.—Count Cassini, the Russian Ambassador to the United States, who arrived here recently, will be received in audience by the Czar on Wednesday next. The Ambassador will remain here a fortnight, and will spend two weeks at Metchenod, and will then return to Paris. He has not yet seen the Finance Minister, M. De Witte, and it is considered unlikely that Count Cassini's presence in St. Petersburg will substantially change the situation respecting the sugar duties. It is understood that the Ambassador is to throw light on the question which the United States Supreme Court, should it decide against Russia. There is a disposition that the government will hope for a settlement through a commercial treaty.

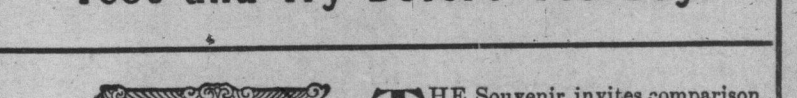
