

ANNUAL MEETING.

The eleventh annual meeting of the Diocesan Church Society, of Prince Edward Island, (and third since its Incorporation), was held at the Infant School House, on Thursday evening, the 17th October, 1854, at 7 o'clock, the Rev. C. Lloyd, E. C. in the chair. After singing the 100th Psalm, and Prayer being offered up, the Chairman made some very appropriate observations connected with the business of the meeting, and the general interests of the church, after which he called on the Secretary to read the annual Report.

On the Report being read, a statement of the accounts of the past year, as far as could be made out owing to the unavoidable absence of the Treasurer, was handed in, shewing that though the sums collected fell something short of those of the previous year, it was owing more to the departure from the Island of some of the Society's best contributors, than to a want of interest in the Society's operations.

It was then moved by Capt. Orlebar, and seconded by the Hon. the Chief Justice.

That the Report now read be adopted and printed under the direction of the Committee.

The following amendments in the By-laws which had been previously adopted at two quarterly meetings of the Committee, were then put and carried, viz: That owing to the inconvenience of the days now appointed for the holding of the quarterly meetings of the Committee, the days in future be altered from the 1st to the 3d Tuesdays in January, April, July and October, and that the last Tuesday in October, be the day fixed on for the holding of the Annual General Meeting of the Society.

That in the event of there being no quorum at any Quarterly Meeting, the members present have power to adjourn for any period not exceeding seven days, and of which adjournment the members of the Committee shall be notified.

Moved by the Rev. R. Roach, and seconded by the Hon. Joseph Hensley,

Resolved, That this meeting desires to acknowledge with heartfelt thankfulness the manifold mercies which Almighty God has vouchsafed to this Island in giving to her people the return of an abundant harvest, as well as deliverance from the ravages of a desolating pestilence, but especially, for making known to them the blessings of Redeeming love through the gospel of his grace.

Moved by Mr. H. Haszard and seconded by Dr. Kaye,

Resolved, That this Society desires to bear in grateful remembrance the continued liberality and ready aid which the Society for the propogation of the Gospel has for many years extended to the Church in this Colony.

Moved by Mr. Charles Palmer and seconded by Mr. Theo. DesBrisay,

Resolved, That this meeting thankfully acknowledges the very valuable assistance which the Colonial Church and School Society has through her Missionaries and Catechists, rendered to this Island.

Moved by Mr. Cundall and seconded by Mr. Hutchinson. Resolved, That this meeting feels much pleasure in recording its obligation to the Ladies' Branch of this Society, for its very active and efficient services, and trusts that it will continue to put forth its best efforts for the general welfare of the church.

Moved by Mr. H. Haszard and seconded by Capt. Orlebar R. N.,

Resolved, That the following names be added to the Executive Committee for the ensuing year, viz: Messrs. Charles Desbrisay, Henry Palmer, Thomas Essery, William Lowe, William Pethick, Thomass Desbrisay jr., Daniel Davies, J. Aldous of Georgetown, and Thomas Hunt of St. Eleanor's, and Mr. Theophilus Desbrisay be appointed Assistant Treasurer, and Capt. Orlebar Assistant Secretary.

The Doxology was then sung, and the meeting dismissed by the Ecclesiastical Commissary with the usual benediction. yo L see pri th Fo to esp me the the the the the the the sire town

REPORT.

In laying before you, on the present occasion, an account of the progress and state of the Society for the past year, your Committee would desire to record their heartfelt thanks to the Father of all Mercies, for the merciful deliverance he has graciously vouchsafed to the inhabitants of this Colony from the fearful and devastating pestilence which has lately ravaged the neighboring province, and is now hurrying to an untimely grave so many thousands of our fellow creatures in the parent kingdom, and to join with you in ascribing praise to Him who is the Bounteous Giver of all good for that abundant harvest which he has in his good providence enabled our husbandmen to reap and gather into their barns.

Since last your Committee had the privilege of meeting you, this Island has been favored with a visit from the Lord Bishop of the Diocese who publicly expressed his sense of thankfulness to the Head of the Church for the prosperity of the Society and the increase of its income the past year, and trusted that its motto would be "Go Forward," as he regarded the Diocesan Society as that to which the Church in this Island must in future more especially look for support; to obtain which, he recommended the enrolment of every member of the family on the books of the Society, even though the printing of their names should cost more than the sums contributed, and looked upon it as the bounden duty of every person who had right feelings towards the church and who desired the Glory of God to give liberally of their substance towards the support and stability of your Society.

In bringing before your notice the practical working of your Society for the past year, your Committee have to report, that in Charlottetown the sum of £50 or as much as may be necessary has been voted by the congregation towards the rent of a house for the newly appointed minister, the successor to the Rev. Dr. Jenkins, who has retired from the exercise of the ministry after having been engaged in its sacred functions for upwards of thirty years. A general library containing nearly 600 volumes, value £126 has been established and an increased desire appears to be generally manifested for sound, useful, and religious information.

At New London the resident minister has been for some time comfortablysettled in the newly erected Parsonage, and the congregations that attend the stated services of the church are numerous and attentive, and efforts are being made throughout the mission to erect a new church in the neighbourhood of Irishtown, which will accommodate increasing worshippers.

At Westmoreland Harbor renewed efforts are being made towards the completion of the Parsonage which cannot, however, before next summer be made habitable for the lately arrived and highly recommended minister, Rev. D. B. Parnther from the Colonial Church and School Society.

At Porthill by means of a grant of £24 from your Committee and the present laudable exertions of the people, it is expected that the Parsenage long since built but uninhabitable, will be made somewhat oomfortable against the winter for the resident minister, who has hitherto been obliged to lodge at an inconvenient distance from the church.

The congregations at Milton and Rustico under the pastoral care of the Rev. C. Lloyd have subscribed largely to the funds of our Society, and during the past year have completed some necessary repairs to the church at Milton, for which a sum not far short of £50 has been expended.

In addition to the usual Sunday services at Milton and Rustico, services have been held of late years at Spring Vale in the school room, which have been attended by regular and attentive hearers.

At Georgetown, the recent appointment of the Rev. Mr.Roach has been instrumental in calling forth new instances of liberality on part of the congregation, and this theyearthey have subscribed about £100 towards his salary, besides completing necessary repairs to the church.

At St. Eleanor's, the Rev. Mr. Read reports most favorably of the ready zeal and liberality of the people and of their attention to the church services. Mr. Read holds alternate services at Green's Shore and at Barrett's, and hopes ere long to be able to erect in both places a suitable building to the solemn worship of God.

At Cascumpec and Kildare there is a good opening for a clergymen, £50 having been already subscribed among the members of the church for that purpose. It is most seriously to be wished that this mission may not be lost sight of, but be filled up against the ensuing spring.

Various changes have taken place among the Clergy. The Rev. Mr. Lloyd has been removed to Charlottetown. Rev. Mr. Roach to Georgetown. Rev. Mr. Stewart to Cherry Valley, and Kev. Maurice Swabey, lately ordained and temporarily stationed at Cascumpec, to Rustico, all which your Committee hope will be of benefit to the people and tend to the furtherance of the Glory of God.

Your Committee would call your attention to an observation made by His Lordship the Bishop of the Diocese during his recent visit. He considered that many parts of this Island must be without the service of a clergyman unless helped by the Diocesan Church Society, for he knew, that anxious as the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel were to aid this Colony, they could not continue to do it much longer, as demands were making upon them day after day from new and more distant The knowledge of this fact should stir up the Colonies. members of the church throughout the Island to renewed, more diligent and self-denying exertions, so that by their united efforts they may be enabled in some measure to relieve the venerable Society who have so long cheerfully and liberally given of their funds towards the preaching of the word of God and the due administration of his Holy Sacraments. The Treasurer will now lay before you the receipts and expenditure of the past year, which your Committee trust will be found satisfactory, and give you additional cause to thank God for his past mercies, and encourage you to continue, in faith and hope, your work and labour of love.
