Report of the Board of Home Missions, 1892-3.

The Board of Home Missions, in again presenting their Annual Report, do so with an expression of thankfulness to Almighty God for the blessings vouchsafed to the work of the Diocese, undertaken in His name, and pursued under His protection. There is at present scarcely a vacant parish, the clergy are active and zealous, and the missions are actuated only by the generous emulation of those who can best work and best agree.

The Board of Home Missions are essentially a Financial Committee, since through their hands pass all funds of a general character contributed by the people for the support of the clergy in their various missions. Hence the Board naturally scan the returns of subscriptions and donations with an anxious eye. Many have been the schemes propounded to the Board by their wise and able members for raising the amounts of funds at the Board's disposal. Many and diverse have been the attempts made to carry them out into practice. At one time it has been special appeals by circular letter from the Bishop or the Board. Then personal endeavours have been made by agent or by deputation. None have as yet succeeded in giving to the Board any very marked increase in funds. Nevertheless the true chord has been struck, which the Board are most anxious to cherish and develop. The Society of the Treasury of God, with its scriptural and practical method of weekly giving in proportion to income, is the ray of light, but faintly shining yet, which is destined under God's blessing to beam with brightest lustre over the fields now white to harvest. This Apostolic provision for the wants of the Church must be pressed upon her members in season and out of season. The experience of town and country parishes alike already proclaims its entire suitability to our varied circumstances. And if only our people could be prevailed upon to adopt this plan of including all their contributions for Church purposes in one weekly offering, to be apportioned by themselves in Parish or Vestry meeting assembled, the Diocese would speedily find its total resources much increased; and what is given will be given with a holier motive and a better will.

The actual amount sent in during the year, Jan. 1892 and Jan. 1893, is larger than for several years past.

The increase for W. and O. is to be partly accounted for by a mission of mercy on part of Rev. F. H. Almon into P. E. Island in the interests of the Fund, but also in part from increased systematic contributions from Parishes who have adopted proportionate giving every week. There may be some Parishes or Missions, and probably there are, who from the peculiar avocations of their inhabitants, would find it impracticable to make their offerings every week. But they must be few. And it is in the sincere conviction that herein lies our extrication from the constantly recurring financial difficulties, and the only hope of our ever receiving an adequate provision for our sustentation and growth, that the Board ventures to emphasize still more this method of giving, and urges upon Clergy and Churchwardens everywhere in the Diocese the adoption of these sacred principles. With their prevalence would cease at once the irritating and constant appeals for special funds, which give incumbents so much worry and church officials so much annoyance, and which certainly do have the effect of diverting into spasmodic and almost casual directions what should rather be the premeditated and deliberate choice of the cause which most needs and claims support.

Report of W. and O. Fund Committee.

The Committee on W. and O. Fund are glad to be able to report the reduction of the debt which has gradually been increasing for the last few years. The average income of the Fund is about \$2000. At a period when there were few widows on the Fund, the yearly payment was raised from \$100. to \$200. This was kept up until there were 15 widows receiving pension. The Committee always hoped that the Diocese would supply them with donations and annual subscriptions sufficient to meet the extra amount required to keep the pension up to \$200. When it was found that this expectation was not to be realized, the pension was reduced to \$150, and then last January to \$100. Thus the expenditure is now \$1500 a year in pensions besides office expenses. This gives a saving of about \$350. to \$400. to be applied to reduction of deficit. In addition to this, the Fund is much indebted to Rev. F. H. Almon for his unceasing exertions in behalf of the widows of the clergy. His appeals and journeyings have awakened during the past year fresh interest in the needs of the Fund, and have brought in subscriptions and donations, some of which go to current account, and some to the diminution of the debt. It is therefore to be expected that in a short time the deficit in the capital may be made good, and the pensions raised again if possible. There is no object outside of the actual demand of the Board of Home Missions which appeals to the generosity of Churchmen with greater force than this. And by keeping it persistently before their attention its claims must be ultimately acknowledged and met. Already by the adoption of the principles of systematic and proportionate giving in some parishes the amounts from those parishes are steadily increasing, and there is much hope of eventually obtaining from our people sufficient money to meet our most pressing needs.

Report of Church Endowment Fund Committee.

The Church Endowment Fund Committee, in submitting the accounts of the Fund, together with the present state of the classes, desire to call the attention of the Synod to the following statement embodied in the proceedings of the Committee, which will it is believed remove a misapprehension existing in the minds of some of the clergy who are participants in the benefits of the Fund.

The Committee desire to bring to their notice that in clause 7 of the Prospectus of the Church Endowment Fund there is an error in the estimate of the amount to be paid. The three classes of claimants make a total of \$11,100 or in other words \$1500 beyond the full yield of the Fund of \$160,000 at six per cent., which would be \$9600.00.

And as the payments to the claimants on the Fund were based upon a yield of six per cent. interest, no allowance being made for expenses in administering the Fund; and the net yield of the Fund making a net return of only \$7000, at 6 per cent. representing only a capital of \$120,000; the Committee do not consider the Fund complete as contemplated by the Prospectus: and are therefore unable to give the beneficiaries the full amount anticipated for the respective classes.

Report of the Board of Domestic and Foreign Missions, 1892-3.

The cause of Domestic Missions, that is, work among the Settlers, Indians, and Chinese within our own Dominion; and that of Foreign Missions to the heathen elsewhere, continues to grow in the affections of our people. The record of missionary work during the past few years is indeed a noble one; and contains examples of heroic self-sacrifice which equal that of any age of the Church's history. The interest hitherto felt in the foreign work of the S. P. G., finds its outlet in unappropriated amounts given by our parishes for Foreign Missions. But the tendency appears to be towards individual missions selected by the donors, and especially in the direction of the work of missionaries either sent out or adopted by us. It matters little which policy prevails, that of allowing the Central Board to decide to what portion of the great mission field the contributions of the Church in the Province of Canada shall be sent, or that of the designation by the donors of particular objects; so long as the cause and the givers are alike benefitted and stimulated by the gifts. It will probably be always a matter of opinion as to which is the better course to follow, and there is no need whatever for trying to force the inclinations of the members of the Church into one stereotyped form.

It has been thought better, in printing the list of contributions, so as to make the Diocesan account tally with that of the Central Board, to print the list from April 1st, 1892, to April 1st, 1893; and in order that the amounts from January to April 1892 be not omitted, to give the list from Aug. 1st, 1891. After this, the account will be printed from April to April in each year.

Summary of Reports from various Parishes.

COW BAY, CAPE BRETON.

I am sorry that our remittance towards B. H. M. for 1892, is a few dollars less than that of last year, whilst I am pleased to note that the sum total of our contributions—as they appear in our report, is about \$34.00 in advance of last year.

The fact that we are only a few dollars short of last year in B. H. M. work, is, however, an evidence that an extra effort has been made by some of our people this year, because we have, of late, lost several parishioners who were always subscribers to the fund.

The \$30.00 marked for Indian Work (Shingwauk) represent the Children's Lenten offerings, which I trust will not be less, for the same purpose in 1893.

The past year has been a poor one for our colliers and fishermen, but we hope for better times under a new *regime* in the near future. Restore to us the parishioners and good times of ten years ago, and with our increased knowledge of and love for the Church of God, we will give tangible proof of our gratitude for the same, by a material increase in our offerings to the cause of Missions.

I desire to thank the Board for restoring to us the grant which was taken from us last year. This parish cannot be worked without that grant in full, and we flatter ourselves that we are doing our very best to carry on the work for God and His Church in keeping with the object for which the grant is made.

In addition to ordinary parochial work, I have done more or less work amongst the seamen and fishermen who have come into port during the summer and fall. I am grateful to S. P. C. K. and R. T. S. for free grants of books tracts, &c., for this work,—the good results of which I have had many forcible evidences. I shall be equally grateful to any person who will kindly send me copies of illustrated and church papers for this work, as the demand is often greater than I can supply.

The "Church," our localized parish paper has a circulation of 150 copies per month, and in its department is doing its share of good. The work amongst the seamen—as well as that on the land, is done on strictly Church lines, and no literature is distributed but that which has been carefully perused by myself and found to be such as will "Teach the truth as taught by Christ."

DEPUTATION REPORT.

THE RECTORY, RIVER JOHN, February 14th, 1893.

TO THE SECRETARY BOARD OF HOME MISSIONS.

Dear Sir,—On Tuesday, Nov. 29, I left by the evening train, I. C. R., for Wallace. A Missionary Meeting was held there the same evening, at which I advocated the claims of the various funds of the Diocese, but especially the B. H. M. There was a good attendance, and considerable interest was manifested. The Rector, Rev. A. Bent, very zealously seconded my efforts. The offertory was \$3.43.

On Wednesday, Nov. 30th, the Rev. A. Bent, and myself proceeded to Pugwash where, in the evening, a very fair meeting was held. The offertory was \$1.00

On Wednesday, Dec. 7th, a most interesting meeting was held at Springhill. The attendance was very large, (much energetic and good work is being done here for the Church of Christ)—the attendance was all that could be desired. After a short service, the Rector, Rev. W. C. Wilson, gave a most interesting address upon Missionary work in general, calling upon his parishioners to show their interest in the Missionary work of the Diocese by doubling their subscriptions to the B. H. M.

I followed with an address upon the needs of the B. H. M., pointing out the duty and pleasure of giving systematically to God's Treasury, and explained the card and envelope system. The collection was \$5.52.

On Tuesday, Dec. 13th, the deputation proceeded to Parrsboro, where the Rev. Chas. deWolf White, Deacon in charge, received us with his hospitality, where in the evening a Missionary meeting was held in the Parish Church, and was attended by many of the business men, who evidenced great interest in the explanation of the card and envelope system, and the duty of giving regularly and liberally to the Treasury of God. The offertory was \$4.73.

On Wednesday Morning, Dec. 4th, the Rev. C. A. W. White and myself proceeded to Port Greville, where, in the evening, one of the best meetings was held. The Church was well filled and much interest was manifested. The collection was \$1.30.

On the following evening a very good meeting was held at Diligent River. The collection was 37c.

TO THE SECRETARY.

Dear Sir,—I send enclosed my returns (A) and (B) for this Parish from Aug. 21, 1892, when I took charge of it, until Dec. 31st, 1892. You will observe that the statistics of the Parish differ but little from Rev. Dr. Bowman's account in his last report to the B. H. M. Ex. Com. Considering the utter failure of last autumn's mackerel fishery, and the small number of Church of England people in this Parish, you will notice that in point of liberality in giving it compares very favourably with most of the Country Parishes in the Province. The proportion of communicants is over a third of the whole number of adherents. The services are bright and hearty, and very fully attended, especially at Herring Cove. My health has been so far restored that I am now quite strong enough for three and occasionally four Sunday Services, with 15 miles travel, besides holding services on the evenings of Wednesday and Friday in each week. I am visiting the outskirts of the Mission, as well as doing occasional duty among the sick in a neighbouring Parish, at present without a clergyman.

ST. PAUL'S, RAWDON.

There have been 151 regular services held in this Parish during the past year. There are three celebrations of the Holy Communion each month. At these services the attendance has been good. Some of the parishioners have to travel from three to five miles to the Parish Church, and it often occurs that the roads and weather prevent their being able to get to Church as often as they desire, then we have not, as yet, any stable to accommodate the horses, this in cold weather is a great drawback. The Sunday Schools have been well maintained through seven months of the year. Provision is being made for improvements in the Parish Church. Our farmers though blessed with good crops, have not found as good a market as usual; and then the deficit in the new Rectory has been required; and a call to respond to the needs of St. John's; all of which have made money harder to collect for extra parochial objects during the past few months. I am, however, happy to be able to send, through the efforts of our workers, the sum of _____ to the B. H. M. There are quite a number of names not on the list this year which were last year, but I hope next year their contributions will be doubled towards the B. H. M.

One Miner gave \$4.00 ; another \$2.00 ; several widows left desolate by the awful explosion gave \$2.00 each, and one fatherless household contributed \$3.25. God bless the givers and make their example stimulate richer brethren to cast great and self-denying gifts into the Treasury ! Our local needs are many. All working expenses have been met and there is no debt of any kind upon the Church property. The Kindergarten and the Cooking School are successful and of great utility. The Reading Room and Game Room are well patronized. A Church to seat seven hundred persons is in course of construction. The Cottage Hospital is nearly completed and needs a few endowed beds for "the poor and the stranger." Fifty-three persons were confirmed during the year. The Communicant List has increased 25 per cent. "It is God that giveth the increase."

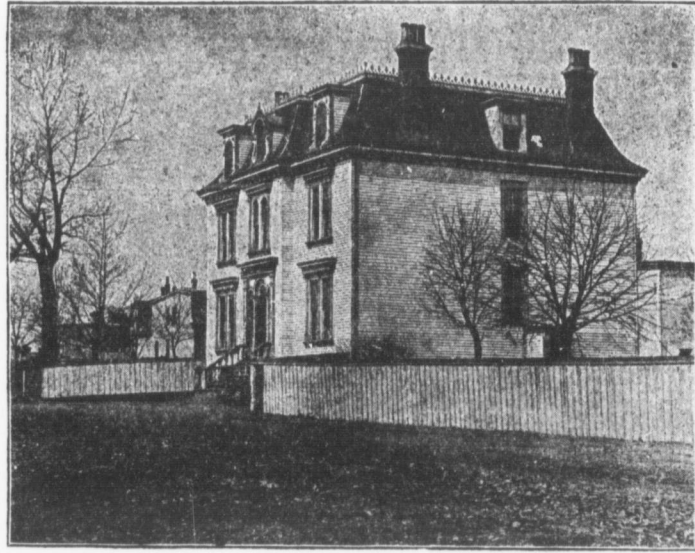

The work of conducting a nursing hospital for paying patients begun in August 1890 was taken up by the Association on its formation and continued until March 1893.

The opening of a number of private rooms in the Victoria General Hospital in the summer of 1892, not only largely increased the accommodation for paying patients, but created such a serious competition with our institution, that not feeling able to compete with the "Victoria General," with the resources of the Province at its back, the Committee reluctantly decided to cease receiving patients—and have suspended operations until definite arrangements can be made—for taking up some distinctly charitable branch of work as set forth in our objects—say a Hospital for Incurables—or what has been recently suggested as a real need, a Home for Convalescents.

As the work of the Association is calculated to enlist the sympathies of the benevolent throughout the Diocese, further information will be gladly furnished as to the plans for payment of the property—privileges to those contributing to Endowment, &c. on application to the Secretary. Aid for the Work either by Bequest—Endowment, Donation or Annual Subscription, is greatly needed and will be gratefully received.

Report Church Woman's Missionary Association.

AT THE ANNUAL MEETING, MAY 23rd., 1893. THE BISHOP OF THE
DIOCESE, PRESIDING.

My Lord :—We close another year of successful work, and as is our bounden duty with the grateful acknowledgment "Hitherto the Lord hath helped us," and we cross the threshold of one more period of recognized and accepted duty, with the prayer, made hopeful by past experience, "Prosper Thou the work of our hands upon us, O, prosper Thou our handiwork."

Reviewing the condition of our Society, from its modest inception in the Parish of S. Luke, to its present enlarged sphere of work, we see cause for thankfulness and encouragement in the fact, that our record shows no entry of steps backward, and that on this twenty-sixth anniversary we can make as full a grant to Mission work as in any previous year.

At the same time we are compelled to question whether we ought in our maturity to rest satisfied, and whether the time has not come for breaking our old record by a substantial advance in the measure of our annual gift.

This desirable result, we are aware, can only be obtained either by the co-operation of more Country Parishes, or the enlargement of our

roll of City members. It is a matter of surprise as well as disappointment, that our Association with its special claim on Nova Scotia Church members should have hitherto failed to enlist the sympathy and aid of so few supporters outside Halifax, and that a Society working solely for Home Missions, should gather its harvest from only two Country Parishes, and we submit once more, whether it is not expedient again, either by written representation now, or in the Synod later on, to make a statement of our aims, and appeal to the whole Diocese.

The increase of our City membership is made imperative by the diminution of our band of helpers either by departure or death, and we look to our Sisters, the younger daughters of the Church to do more than fill the gap. The recent Confirmations in the City Churches cannot but suggest, that to many of those confirmed, our Society offers an attractive field of work, and that without delay, means should be taken to enlist some of the quickened love and zeal, and sense of responsibility of these young Churchwomen in the doing good to the household of faith in the ranks of "The Church Woman's Missionary Association," and thus make practical the counsel of using "opportunity" so forcibly urged by your Lordship in the address given at the Confirmation in the Cathedral Church.

Our income this year has been chiefly derived from subscriptions, the contents of the Mite Boxes, and the proceeds of our needle work.

"An evening with Dickens," rendered successful by the energy of our President, Mrs. Courtney, and the willing co-operation of several ladies and gentlemen, who took with much spirit and skill the parts assigned them, made us richer by \$135.25, and an interesting lecture by Mr. William Hill, entitled "Rambles through the leaves of my Scrap-Book," yielded us a profit of \$23.25.

To Canon Partridge we are indebted for an Offertory at St. George's on the occasion, on which your Lordship addressed our Association in that Church,—and for the same benefit, we are under obligation to the Rev. E. P. Crawford, Rector of St. Luke's. To all our helpers we now offer our hearty thanks.

Amherst and Truro both show sustained interest in the good cause, and their appended reports show that they are in earnest.

Two boxes, the contents of each being of the value of \$100.00, were this year forwarded by the Society in Halifax, also two by the Truro Branch valued at \$84.00, and \$99.50, to four of our Nova Scotian Missions, and were received with great thankfulness.

Many orders for plain and embroidery work have been satisfactorily executed, but there is a great need for additional workers both for plain and Church embroidery, and for the latter there has been a suggestion that some sort of class should be arranged to further this object.

Having thus rendered an account of our stewardship for the last twelve months, we face cheerfully our responsibility for another year, with the knowledge that the favour and love of God are with the

SOME REASONS FOR SUPPORTING KING'S COLLEGE.

THE CHURCH UNIVERSITY of the Maritime Provinces is King's College. This College belongs to the members of the Church of England. It was founded with great wisdom and foresight by the first Bishop of Nova Scotia, as a necessity of the Church then and always. The College has had many vicissitudes; has been sometimes flourishing, sometimes in the back ground, and like all institutions insufficiently endowed, has varied in its success. It has now many competitors, and has hard work to maintain its position. But at the present time its prospects, after a period of depression, are most encouraging. Some reasons for this statement follow.

1. It has a staff of most competent professors, capable of imparting a thoroughly sound education, and equal in ability and zeal to those of any similar institution.

2. It has a splendid Library of between twelve thousand and thirteen thousand volumes, of which a new catalogue has just been published, and containing many rare and valuable books. This Library is open to students for their use.

3. The College building has been thoroughly renovated and modernized, being now heated with hot water, and all the students' rooms being comfortable and pleasant. Board is furnished by the College, and all profits therefrom accrue to it.

4. It has a large list of scholarships and prizes, by which needy and clever students may derive helps for their Collège course, thus reducing the necessary expenses to a minimum. There are also existing many "Nominations," a list of which is published in the Calendar, by means of which students receiving them may pass through College free of fees, including that for the B. A. Degree.

5. There is a beautiful and commodious chapel, in which the morning and evening prayers of the Church of England are conducted.

6. There are no religious tests to be subscribed to of any kind except for degrees in Divinity, so that the advantages of the College Courses are free and open to all.

7. Students may reside out of College, though the resident system is preferred.

8. Last, but by no means least, there is attached to the College, and a feeder to it, a Collegiate School, which is now in first-class order. Its staff consists of three resident and three non-resident masters. The resident masters are all graduates of Cambridge or Oxford, the Head Master being a Wrangler of the former University. This School is rapidly growing in public favour. The buildings and grounds have been recently improved, and everything is provided which is needed by a school of high intellectual standard: while the fees for board and tuition are very reasonable. The New Calendar has just been issued and can be obtained from Dr. H. Y. Hind or Rev. Dr. Bowman, Windsor, N. S. All these are reasons why the College should be supported by Churchmen.

A new professorship has been suggested, to be called the "Churchmen's Professorship"—of which the salary is to be raised by subscriptions of not less than one dollar. Every Churchman and Churchwoman therefore, however small their means can thus help to encourage and sustain their College, and the Province will during the year be thoroughly canvassed for these subscriptions.

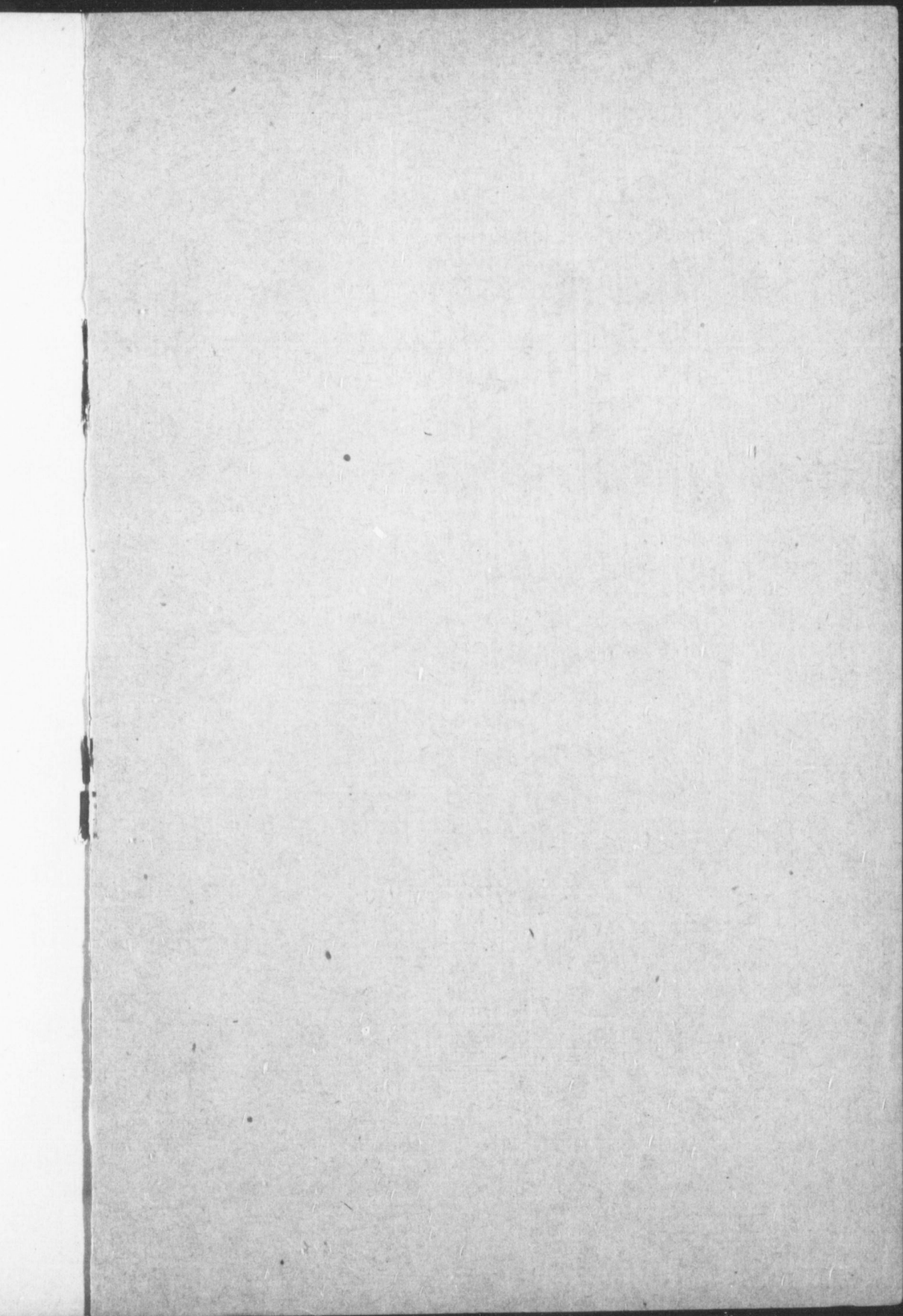
The buildings and endowments are worth together nearly \$200,000; the income being between \$9000. and \$10,000. At the present about \$5000. a year more is needed, which could easily be raised if the people would do it. And it is now the ardent hope of the Governors and Alumni that good reasons are shewn to the Church for advancing and improving their own Institutions, which justify their existence by their success.

The Church School for Girls.

Every Church person is earnestly urged to procure and circulate the last Calendar of the Church School for Girls, which is in a highly successful condition. The Church is thus fully equipped for her educational work, and will make her mark upon the rising generation. The Church people of the Maritime Provinces should feel proud of their College and Schools, and seek to spread their influence as widely as possible.
