# RULES

ADOPTED BY

RELIGIOUS VISITING COMMITTEE

OF THE

*"Home for Aged and Destitute Females,"*

AT THEIR FIRST MEETING, 18TH JULY, 1880.

---

I.—That this Committee shall consist of twelve ladies, called the Visiting Committee of the Home for the Aged, and shall have power to add to their number, should circumstances render it necessary.

II.—That these ladies shall have a general superintendence of the spiritual affairs of the Institution, each taking a week in rotation for visiting the inmates, either separately in their rooms, or collected, for the purpose of reading, prayer, &c.

III.—That this Committee hold meetings on the same day of meeting of the Executive or General Committee, either before or after, having one of their number presiding, to report what may be deemed worthy of notice.

IV.—That this Committee shall do all in their power to supply the Institution with religious instruction through books, tracts, &c., approved of and subject to the supervision of all the members. They shall also converse with the inmates on their spiritual concerns, in a wise and tender way.

V.—The Visitor for the week shall make it her business to obtain the services of a minister or some person acting in that capacity, for any old person more than usually indispos-

ed, and entirely confined to the house—such person to be approved of by the church to which the aged inmate professes to belong. Should the invalid wish to receive the Holy Communion occasionally, and the same be approved of by her minister, the visitor shall attend to the gratification of her wishes.

VI.—Should any of the inmates be deprived by illness of the privilege and benefit of public ordinances, it is considered desirable to obtain the services of theological students from any evangelical denomination, to read or deliver an address as often as practicable on the Lord's Day, or other convenient season—said student must first be named and approved at a meeting of the Committee. The services of an ordained minister in connection with one of the orthodox denominations to be preferred, whenever they can be obtained.

VII.—This Committee shall make it their duty to see that family worship is regularly maintained. They shall visit alternately, entering the day and hour of each visit in a book kept for the purpose in the public room. The visitor for the week shall see that the Sabbath service be supplied.

## REPORT.

---

THE Committee of the Home for the Aged are again permitted, in the Providence of God, to present to their friends and the Public, this their Annual Report; and in doing so, they have many pleasing and encouraging facts to record, which will, they hope, call for the sympathy and patronage of some, and shew that this Benevolent Institution has indeed prospered in their hands, and to the Father of Mercies they would ascribe all the praise. It is now three years since the Committee were induced, amid many discouragements, to found and establish a Home for Aged Females in the city of Halifax, who, having once seen better and happier days, have in the reverses of fortune, become reduced in their circumstances, and, in consequence, exposed to many trials and hardships. The Committee have realized their expectation, and the Home for the Aged is now reckoned among the Benevolent Institutions which adorn the city, and bespeak the praise of those who have so generously contributed towards its endowment and support.

The Committee were induced at the close of the last year to purchase the Cleverdon property in Gottingen street, opposite the Deaf and Dumb Institution, and thereby secure a permanent Home for the Aged. A subscription list was opened to defray the expense of repairing the old building, and making a large addition; through the kind exertions of R. W. Fraser, Esq., and the benevolent contributions of the community, the Committee have, with the blessing of God, realized their hopes and expectations. The Home is now finished, affording at present a comfortable and happy home to twelve respectable aged females.

The property has been purchased at the cost of £800; there is a mortgage on it for £600, and the cost of the new addition, together with the repairing and expenses of the old premises, have occasioned an expenditure of £775 1 0. £459 3 2 towards paying off this expenditure has been raised by private subscriptions, leaving a balance of £326 0 0 to be collected, which sum will, we hope, be made up when the appeal is made to a generous public. The Home will now afford comfortable accommodation for twenty-four inmates, each will be provided with a sleeping apartment and comfortably boarded for £10 per annum, which must be paid quarterly or half yearly in advance with satisfactory securities.

The Home is sustained by the annual payments for board, £10 or more, for the inmates; by the interest of the Endowment Fund, £1500, and by the annual subscription of private individuals. The Committee meet at the Home on the first Thursday of every month, at 3 o'clock, when business is disposed of, and applications for admissions received and discussed, and the blessing of God invoked upon the institution and all connected with it.

The Committee desire to exercise a sound judgment in the selection of persons to be admitted into the Home; all applications must be made in writing, stating the circumstances and character of the individual for whom the application is made. The Home is open to visitors at all times, and the Public are invited to call and judge for themselves.

In their last report the Committee had no change in the household by the demise of any individual inmate. This year, however, the case is different,—two of their number having been laid in the silent tomb. Three others have entered the Home, and applications have been made for three others who have not yet entered. The Sabbath services have been regularly sustained, and the domestic arrangements have been highly satisfactory. The matron, Mrs. McKie, continuing unremitting in

"The matron and inmates of the Home beg leave to offer their sincere thanks to the Committee for all their kindness, but above all would they express their gratitude to the Giver of every good, and pray for a continuance of their unmerited mercies."

The Committee would gratefully accord their thanks to Mr. Findley for the perfect plan of building submitted by him gratuitously, and which has been successfully carried out under the superintendence of Mr. T. A. Anderson, for whose unwearied exertions in their behalf the Committee shall ever feel deeply indebted.

The Treasurer's account will shew the amount of debt incurred for enlarging the premises, and the Committee trust that when the collectors present their report to a generous public, they will experience the sympathy that their pecuniary circumstances demand.
