### LAIDLAW & CO'S CLOSING STOCK NEW YORK AND LETTER

New York, June 16.—With the establishment of fairly equitable conditions in the stock market, large banking interests which supported prices last week appeared to cease their efforts week appeared to cease their efforts to bring a further rise in the standard issues today, and in the absence of this initiative today's stock market lost its recent strength of tone. There was no positive weakness, but the demand for stocks looked to be confined to scattered bear interests and small investors. This development was far from disappointing to the market's well wishers for conservative interests, as a rule, were not in favor of a sustained upward movement at this time. It may be that the recovery has not fully run its course and that today's dullness and slight inclination to heaviness of tone refected mostly a desire upon the part of influential bull interests to test the market's ability to stand upon its own legs. If this is true the result must have been rather disappointing.

A further sustained recovery at this time will depend largely upon whether the short interest has been eliminated. The logical sequence of the recent culmination of liquidation is a period of rest and digestion and there is nothing to suggest that the present situation will prove an exception to the rule.
