LONDON, Sept. 3.—Er'g.

F. This afternoon the Emperor Alexander of Russia, accompanied by the Crown Prince and Grand Duke Vladimir, arrived at Berlin.

They were welcomed by the Emperor William and a throng of Prussian diplomats and Generals and escorted to the Russian embassy.

The procession of entry was very imposing, and immense crowds of spectators lined the streets.

The Emperor visited the Imperial Palace in the evening.

The Emperor of Austria has arrived at Dresden and is the guest of the King of Saxony to-day.

The International held a public session of their Congress at the Hague.

One American delegate has been refused admission to the Congress.

Troubles have arisen between the inhabitants of Narbonne, France, and the military there, and the authorities threaten a stage of siege.

Money Matters in the Upper Provinces.

The statement in the Money Market

which is now being felt in St. John, was

experienced some weeks earlier in the

business centres of Quebec and Ontario.

The Toronto Mail deals with the subject

the following being the closing re-

marks of an article in Tuesday's issue:

The pressure for gold for several weeks

past has been most severe, producing

such a depression in the ordinary

course of business as has not been

experienced for some years. Yet the

whole matter after all is little beyond a

temporary difficulty, and with a little more

firmness on the part of the Banks would not

have arisen at all. It was expected early

in the year that we should have heavy im-

port bills against us to meet in gold, and it

is now known that pools were going up, fast

in value. The demand for discounts was

so steady at the same time, and had been

so long as to give every certainty of its

continued action; the call for increased

capital on the part of the Banks was so

strongly anticipated that, in comparing

their resources, deposits, &c., we find

that they were furnishing a vast in-

creasing trade on a diminishing reserve of

specie, which had already been brought

down to a minimum even in the strongest

Banks, and in some was most im-

prudently small.

A rough and ready rule—for it is really

nothing beyond—is for a reserve of gold to

be kept of one-third the amount of notes

issued. This is found in ordinary times to

answer every need, but in the case of

Banks with heavy deposits at call, and no

means of raising gold, it is by no means

a safe standard; indeed, it is a very risky

one.

But, taking the whole of the Banks, we

find that they had only six millions of

specie to protect twenty millions of notes

and thirty three million of deposits at call,

with every certainty that as business en-

larged importations would demand large

supplies of exchange on England, or gold

to buy it.

When the pressure was becoming serious

the Banks sought to lay hands upon the

Government reserve of specie, by a heavy

circulation of Dominion notes. The
