INTRODUCTORY NOTE

This bouquet of family prayers needs no bush; its spiritual fragrance gives it all the recommendation it needs. Dr. Dickie's workmanship requires no introduction. But I seize the opportunity, given me by his invitation to write an introductory note, to say, as convener of the Genera? Assembly's committee on "Public Worship and Aids to Devotion," that this little collection of family devotions is not intended to take the place of the "Book of Family Devotion" which has come from that committee.

It is issued under the auspices of the Church Worship Society, which seeks, by the publication of Occasional Papers and otherwise, to promote the cultivation of worship.

Its prayers, I may add, are richly woven in Scriptural phrases, reminding one in this respect of Matthew Henry's "Method of Prayer," which some of us long ago employed for our aid in leading in prayer. It has the instinctive sense of fitting prayer-expressions, a healthy tone, a quiet, devotional spirit, with singularly apt and happy combinations and turns of hallowed phrase-Nothing of the kind can be produced withology. out long training, however easily it may read.

PREFACE

This little collection of prayers is sent forth in the hope that it may help in nourishing the spirit of godliness in our homes.

We fail so often in maintaining family worship because of the practical difficulties incident to the busy life so many of us lead. Perhaps many more would succeed if they attempted, to begin with, something simpler and less difficult by way of acknowledging God in family worship.

These short prayers are suggested as suitable for use instead of, or in addition to, grace at the morning or evening meal.

The following counsels are offered to the heads of families who wish to use them:-

Regularity is of the first importance. If we are to have family prayers they must become the habit of the home.


Let the person who leads in the prayer first become familiar with its words and thoughts, and then repeat or read them clearly, deliberately and reverently.

Kneeling is the most reverent atttiude, but if the prayers are said in place of grace they may be said at table with bowed heads.

On Sunday and special days longer portions may be read from Holy Scriptures, together with the singing of a psalm or hymn, and the Lords' Prayer said in unison. These prayers are not original; they belong to the historic church, and breathe her spirit and thought. They are merely rearranged for this special purpose.
