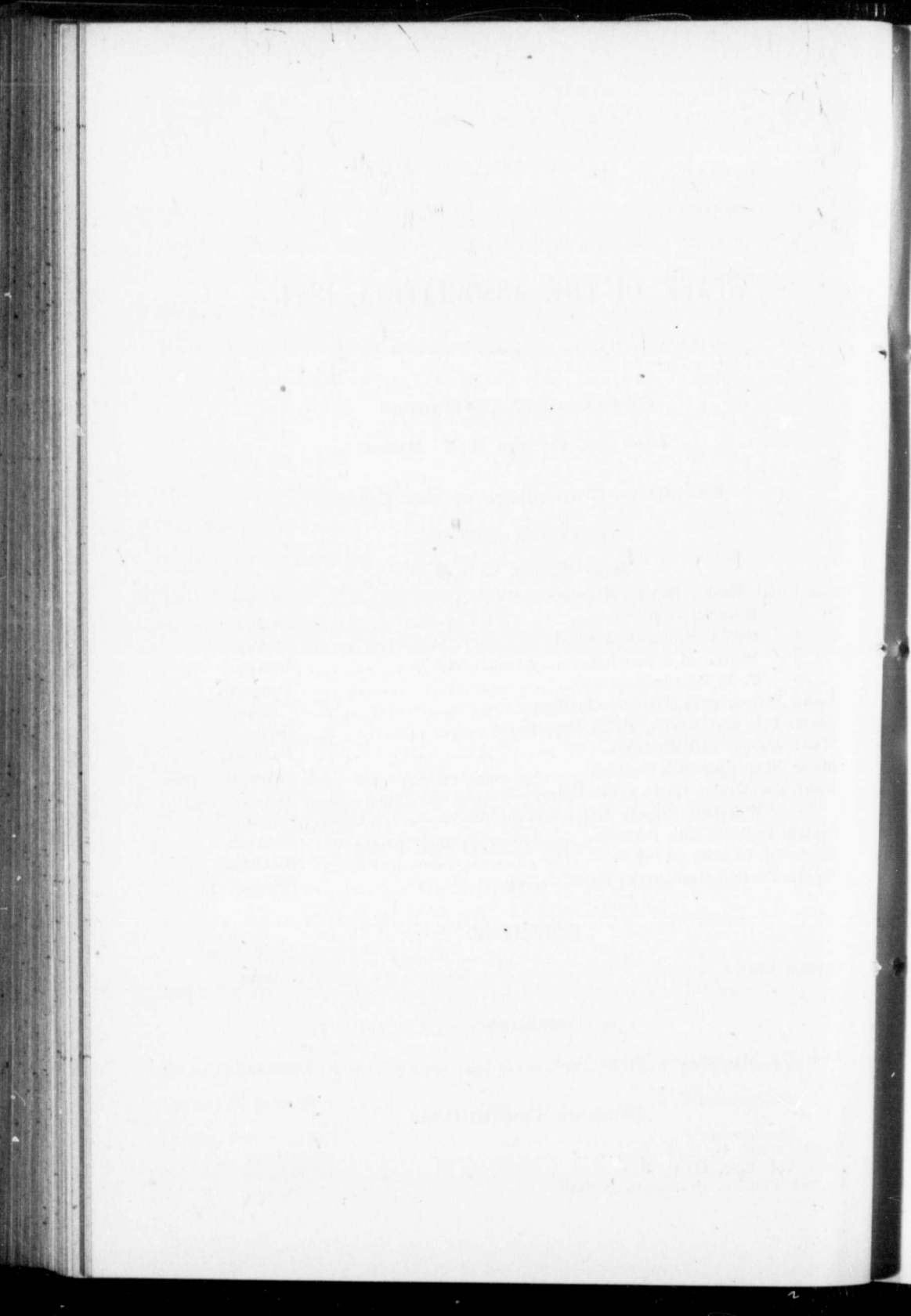

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL
OF THE
Dominion of Canada Rifle Association.

The Council have the honour to submit the Seventeenth Annual Report of the Proceedings of the Dominion Rifle Association.

1. They feel it to be their first duty to tender the thanks of the Association to all its supporters and specially,

To His Excellency the Governor General, the Marquis of Lansdowne, for his liberal donation to the Prize Fund and, for the encouragement held out to Rifle Shooting, by his gift of Silver and Bronze Medals to the several Provincial Rifle Associations.

To the Government and Members of the House of Commons for the increased grant voted to the Association at the last Session of Parliament.

To the Minister of Militia and Defence, The Hon. Adolphe P. Caron, M.P., for his gift of a Silver Challenge Cup.

To Col. Gzowski, A.D.C. to Her Majesty the Queen, for his donation of \$150.00 to the Prize List, of the Gzowski Challenge Cup, and of 25 Sovereigns to that of the British Challenge Shield Match.

To the Dominion Organ and Piano Company, of Bowmanville, Ont. for their second year's gift of an Organ valued at \$200.

The National Manufacturing Company of Ottawa, for their gift of a Tent and Camp Outfit.

2. It is with no light feeling of satisfaction that the Council can supplement the thanks they offer to those who have supported them, by a record of successes resulting from the aid that they have given.

Foremost among the successes of the year the Council with pride refer to the winning of the Kolapore Match by the Team sent to Wimbledon under the command of Lieut. Col. White, of the 43rd Batt.

From the registered scores of the match (Page xliii.) it will be observed that the contest was one of no ordinary character.

From the commencement of the competition at 200 yards as shot followed shot the Register showed that the Home Team were slowly but too surely going to the front, and when at the conclusion of the firing at 200 yards, it was known that their advantage amounted to 10 points, it seemed that there was but little hope of ultimate success for the Canadian Team.

Depressed in spirits, but far from acknowledging defeat, the Canadians moved back to the 500 yards range.

There by extraordinary coolness and determination they not only held their own, but scored three points more than the Home Team—and reduced their opponents' lead from ten to seven points.

At the 600 yards—In the first two rounds they gained three more points, but this further advantage was unfortunately short-lived, as in the third and fourth rounds the Home Team gained and stood eight points ahead. From that moment, however, the Canadians seemed to recover nerve, and, in the fifth round, gained two points, in the sixth round,—eight,—in the seventh and last round, still again, another two points, and won the match with the narrow margin of five points.

A more interesting and creditable ending to a Team match has seldom been witnessed, and to the representatives of Canada, who so well sustained her credit, the honour is due of bringing back the highly prized Kolapore Cups for the fourth time since the match was instituted in 1872.

The score made in the match by Private J. A. Armstrong, Governor General's Foot Guards, was the highest not only on the side of the Canadians, but also of all the Teams engaged.

To the Team of 1884, the Canada Club of London, to whom the thanks of the Association are due, again liberally presented a very hand-

some silver cup, which under terms of the gift, went to Private D. Mitchell, 13th Batt., as a reward for general shooting throughout the meeting.

3. Next on the list of the year's successes may be placed the Annual Prize Meeting on the Rideau Ranges, which commenced on the 1st and concluded on the 6th September.

The Prize List owing to the realization of the hopes expressed in the report of last year, was not only maintained as to the amount but slightly increased.

In addition to the usual matches, distinct competitions, one at 800 yards, and two at 500 yards, were established for the Martini Henry Rifle.

By the liberality of the Hon. A. P. Caron, M.P., a new Challenge Cup named the "Caron Cup" was added to the Prize List, and allotted as first Team prize in the Hon. the Minister of Militia's Match.

The entries for the several matches so far exceeded those of any previous year, that had it not been for the adoption and completion of the changes in the Range, as recommended in last year's report, derangement of the programme and detention of competitors must inevitably have occurred.

As it was, the unlooked for strain was easily provided for, and the work of the meeting conducted without confusion and to the entire satisfaction of the competitors.

In the Military Matches, stimulated by the liberality of Lord Lorne, an increased number of Battalions entered.

In the British Challenge Shield Match, out of 1400 rounds allowed to be fired by the 14 sections engaged, the hits made were as follows:

Dr. Bell, G.G.F.G. attended throughout the meeting as medical officer, and though no case of accident occurred, is entitled to the thanks of the Association for the time so generously given.

The Managers and Officers of the Intercolonial, Canadian Pacific and Grand Trunk Railways are also entitled to the Association's thanks for the facilities afforded to members and competitors attending at Ottawa.

At the close of the firing for the Governor General's Match, on the invitation of the Council, the Hon. A. P. Caron, Minister of Militia and Defence, assisted by Madame Caron and Major General Middleton, publicly presented the Prizes won during the meeting.

4. *Ranges.*—The recommendation made by Council in last year's report, in regard to the position of the Rideau Ranges, was at an early date brought under the notice of the Hon. Minister of Militia, and after due consideration received his approval and confirmation.

On tenders and specifications prepared by Captain Perley, a contract was made on behalf of the Militia Department with Major John Stewart, contractor of Ottawa.

The several works executed were duly certified to by Lieutenant-Colonel Bacon, of the Militia Department.

Among the many advantages that have been gained by the alterations, the following are worthy of note :—

1. The Ranges are now contained within the limits of the land leased by the Government.
2. The lost accommodations for 600 yards firing has been restored, and the position of the Firing Points greatly improved.
3. One more Target has been provided in the new trench.
4. The exclusive use of four Targets in the old trench has been secured for Extra Series Matches, and the uninterrupted use of the Long Range Targets throughout the meeting.

FINANCE.

For a full account of the Finances of the Association, the Council refer to the Treasurer's Statement duly audited and submitted herewith.

The Balance Sheet exhibits the total receipts from all sources for the year to have been \$16,844.26, while the expenditure amounted to \$15,511.46, showing a balance of \$1,332.80, which with the balance of \$40.97, carried forward from last year's Financial Statement, leaves a total balance of \$1,373.77, in favour of the Association.

This is exclusive of the balance of \$200, and \$17.61 interest thereon, at credit of Special Account for Provincial Prizes, part of the donation received last year from the Marquis of Lorne, held on account of the Provinces of Prince Edward Island and British Columbia, until they qualify for the competition.

On reference to the credit side of the account, it will be seen that the Grant from Government has been restored to the amount originally voted, viz., \$10,000. The increased aid so opportunely given, enabled the Council to maintain the Wimbledon expedition, and to provide such a Prize List for the Annual Competition at Ottawa, as would bear favourable comparison with that of preceding years.

In the ordinary sources of revenue, slight increases will be observed, viz:—in the Affiliation Fees from Rifle Associations, the receipts being \$631, as against \$595 in 1883, the numbers of Associations affiliating being as follows, viz:—

The Members' Fees for the past year amounted to \$230, as against \$174 in 1883.

The receipts from “Special Donations,” “Banks,” and “Manufacturers,” amounted to \$1,992.00, as against \$2,326.66 received in 1883; a decrease of \$334.66.

The entry fees this year, including sighting shots, pool gains, &c., amounted to \$2,917.10, as against \$2,584.91 in 1883; an increase of \$332.19. The steady increase in this source of revenue may be taken as pointing to the growing popularity of the annual competitions of the Dominion Rifle Association.

Comparison of the items on the debit side of the account with those of 1883, show certain fluctuations. The outlay on account of Wimbledon Team—of Special Works on ranges—and of Cash Prizes—being more than last year.

A detailed statement of disbursements made by Lieutenant-Colonel White, in connection with the Wimbledon Team of 1884, will be found in the Appendix.

REPORT OF
LIEUT.-COL. WHITE,
COMMANDING WIMBLEDON TEAM, 1884.

OTTAWA, 19th SEPTEMBER, 1884.

SIR,—I have the honour to report that, in accordance with the instructions given to them, the several members of the Wimbledon Team reported to me at the Brigade Office, at Montreal, at 10 a.m., on Monday, 23rd June, and, having been inspected, and signed the agreement, proceeded to Point St. Charles ; where quarters had been provided for them, and arrangements made for their practice.

This practice, which was on the whole satisfactory, was continued during the week, under the immediate supervision of the Adjutant of the Team, Captain Charles L. Bossé, of the 65th Batt. "Mount Royal Rifles."

The Team left Montreal by Steamboat on the evening of Friday, the 27th June, and embarked on the S. S. "Parisian," commanded by Captain James Wylie, the following morning. We arrived at Liverpool about eight o'clock on the evening of Sunday, July the 6th. Mr. J. Ennis, the representative of the Allan Line at Liverpool, and Mr. Dyke, the Agent of the Dominion Government, met us on the Wharf, rendered us every assistance in their power, and made the arrangements necessary for our journey to Putney the following morning, it being too late by the time our baggage had been examined by the Officers of the Customs, to proceed that evening.

We left Liverpool at 9.45 a.m., on Monday, and reached Putney in time to go into camp the same evening, our tents having, by the kindness of Major Rochford Boyd, R. E., been pitched ready for occupation.

My first care after arrival at Wimbledon was to secure for the team facilities for practice. The range at Wormwood Scrubs had been recently closed, and after spending three days in communicating with the Officers of several corps in London and the vicinity, I was able to obtain, through the courtesy of Major the Honorable J. Scott Napier, Adjutant of the London Scottish, one afternoon's practice for the team ; and the use of the ranges of the Civil Service Rifles for a second afternoon was obtained for us through the kind intervention of Lieut. Thos. Churchill of that Corps. The limited opportunities for practice in England told heavily against the members of the team of 1884, and accounts for the smallness of the individual winnings of its members ; but I am glad to say that Colonel the Viscount

Ranelagh, K.C.B., Commanding the 2nd South Middlesex Rifles, and Major Colebrooke Carter, Adjutant of the 1st Volunteer Battalion of the Princess Charlotte of Wales (Berkshire Regiment) and other Officers, kindly promised to obtain the use of ranges near London which will be of great advantage to next year's teams.

Sergeant Goodwin, of the 13th Battalion, was compelled by a severe attack of sore throat to leave camp for a fortnight, during which time accommodation was found for him at Wimbledon; with this exception the whole team remained in camp during the three weeks from the 7th to the 28th July; and their conduct was most satisfactory, every member seemed to endeavour to render the duties of the Officers in charge as light as possible.

The expenditure for entries may be considered large; but I thought it my duty to give the team every opportunity for practice during the matches, as they had so little before the meeting.

In the "Queen's," three of the team were included in the three hundred, but none succeeded in getting into the "sixty."

In the "Prince of Wales" we were more fortunate, Lieut. Fitch, of the 78th, winning the third prize of £15.

The contest for the Kolapore Cups to take place on the 23rd July. The competing teams were the English, the Indian, and the Canadians; a team from the Channel Islands was on the ground; but having omitted to make the necessary entry, the Council would not permit them to fire, notwithstanding that the other teams consented unanimously to waive the objection.

The English team was under the command of Colonel Wilson of Bannockburn, and was generally admitted to be a carefully selected and strong team. At the 200 yards range we were ten points behind the English team, three points were gained at 500 yards, and on completing the firing at the 600 yards range the Canadians were five points ahead, thus winning the cups for the fourth time since 1871. Our opponents acknowledged their defeat handsomely and, led by Colonel Wilson, gave us three hearty cheers which we returned with interest. Sir Leonard Tilley, C.B., K.C.M.G., and his two sons; Major General Luard and Major Holbech was present during the competition for the Kolapore Cups, and tendered their hearty solicitations at its conclusion.

The result of this match having been telegraphed to Canada, I was able to communicate to the team the same evening the congratulations of the Honorable A. P. Caron, upon their success, congratulations which were received with the utmost satisfaction as indicating the great interest felt in the team by the Minister of Militia.

Her Royal Highness the Princess Louise, accompanied by the Marquis of Lorne, and Mr. Eustace and Lady Elizabeth Ralfour, visited the

Canadian Camp on the afternoon of the 17th July. His Royal Highness entered into conversation with several members of the the team and evinced the greatest interest in our success.

The Marquis of Lorne visited the Canadian Camp on two other occasions, expressed his great satisfaction at our good fortune in the Kolapore competition, and shewed by many acts of kindness to us that the severance of his official connection with Canada had in no degree impaired the interest he had hitherto taken in the welfare of the Canadian Militia.

On the 23rd July, the Canadian team had the honour of being inspected by His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge, Commander-in-Chief, who expressed his satisfaction at again meeting a team from Canada, and congratulated the winners of the Kolapore Cups upon their success. Private Armstrong of the Governor General's Foot Guards, who had made the highest score in the Kolapore match, was specially presented to and heartily congratulated by His Royal Highness.

The Camp of the Canadians was, as is usual, visited by many distinguished persons, among whom, besides H. R. H. the Princess Louise and the Marquis of Lorne, may be mentioned Earl Fortescue, Viscount Ranelagh, Lord Headly, Lord and Lady George Campbell, Mr. Eustace and Lady Elizabeth Balfour, Lady Maude Hastings, Lady Harriet Fletcher, General McMurdo, Major General Luard, Sir Henry and Lady Wilmot, Sir Henry and Lady Fletcher, Sir Henry Halford, Sir Charles Shakerley, Sir Leonard Tilley, Sir Charles and Lady Tupper and the Hon. O. Mowat.

Advantage was taken of the visit of H. R. H. the Duke of Cambridge to present to Private Mitchell of the 13th Battalion, who had made the highest aggregate score during the Wimbledon meeting, the handsome cup so generously presented by the members of the Canada Club. This cup was presented by Sir Charles Tupper, accompanied by Mr. Gisborne Molineux representing the Canada Club, who addressed the team, calling attention to the constant endeavours of the Canadian Government to promote the efficiency of the Militia, so that they might be able, any time, to give to the service of the Crown, that support which only trained men can render in the hour of emergency.

The prizes were presented on the afternoon of Saturday, the 26th July, by Her Grace the Duchess of Abercorn. The Canadians on going up to receive the Kolapore Cups were loudly cheered by the large assemblage of distinguished visitors present on the occasion.

To Sir Henry Wilmot, M.P., President of the National Rifle Association, the Canadian Team are deeply indebted for many acts of kindness. To Colonel North, M.P.; Sir Henry Fletcher, M.P.; Captain Mildmay, Secretary, N.R.A.; Colonel Eaton, Grenadier Guards; Camp

Commandant; Major Colebrooke Carter, Camp Adjutant; Major Rochford Boyd, R. E.; Major Waller, Mr. Roche, and other Members of the Council and Executive Staff, our thanks are also due for their unvarying kindness and attention to our wants.

His Excellency the Marquis of Lansdowne, attended by Viscount Melgund and Lieutenant Streatfield, A. D. C. :—

The Hon. A. P. Caron, M. P., Minister of Militia and Defence, and Major General Luard, were also present.

The Meeting having been called to order,

1. It was proposed by Major General Laurie, and seconded by the Hon. G. Kirkpatrick, M. P., that the Annual Report for 1883, as printed and distributed be received and accepted as read.—Carried.
2. Moved by Col. Gzowski, seconded by the Hon. G. Kirkpatrick, that the Report be adopted.—Carried.
3. Moved by Lieut. Col. Ouimet, M. P. seconded, by Lt. Col. O'Brien, M. P., that the thanks of the Association be tendered His Excellency the Governor General for the honor conferred on the Association in becoming its patron.—Carried.

His Excellency in reply, expressed the pleasure it gave him to know

that the members of the Association desired that he should succeed to the position held by his predecessor, Lord Lorne, and become its patron.

He regarded it as a fact that the Association was engaged in a work of importance; a work benefitting both the Dominion and Imperial Governments. To the furtherance of that work, Lord Lorne had brought to bear, practical experience as a Rifleman, and wise counsel. For himself, he could only venture to say that the Association might rely on such aid as his personal good will and interest could afford.

He was pleased to learn from the Report before the Meeting that the pecuniary position was hopeful, and trusted that the effort being made to render it more stable might meet with success.

The President, Col. Gzowski, announced that he must now retire from the position he had held for sixteen years. During that period he felt that he had faithfully served the Association. Its influence had been extended east and west and now was recognized in every Province of the Dominion.

In taking leave of the Association, he would ask, that, whoever his successor might be, the staff would support him as efficiently as they had served him. That though he retired, any service which he could render the Association, would be as cheerfully given as in the past.

His Excellency then moved, that the Hon. George Kirkpatrick, M. P. be President of this Association in the room and stead of Col. Gzowski.

The motion having been seconded by the Hon. A. Caron, M. P., was carried. The President elect having acknowledged the compliment, His Excellency and suite left the meeting.

5. Moved by Lt. Col. the Hon. E. A. Botsford, seconded by Major Gen. Laurie, that the thanks of the Association be given to Col. Gzowski for his active and zealous efforts to promote the interests of the Association—for the sacrifices he had always readily and willingly made to encourage Rifle shooting throughout the Dominion, and perfecting the active Militia Force of Canada, for which object the Dominion Rifle Association was founded and is maintained—and that the members beg to convey to Col. Gzowski their sincere regret at his resignation.—Carried.

6. Moved by the Hon. J. B. Plumb, seconded by Lieut. Col. Vance Graveley, that the thanks of the Association be given to the Marquis of Lorne and Her Royal Highness the Princess Louise for their united contributions to the prize list.

To the Marquis of Lorne, for his personal efforts in securing for the Dominion Rifle Association so valuable a record of the feeling of the Auxiliary Forces of Great Britain towards the Militia of Canada as is represented by the British Challenge Shield.

For his gifts of Silver and Bronze Medals to the several Provincial Rifle Associations, and for his parting gift of \$500 for the encouragement of Military Shooting amongst those who attend from the distant Provinces, and for the many acts of kindness received at his hands.—Carried.

7. Moved by Lt. Col. Macdonald (Guelph), seconded by Lieutenant Macnachtan, that the thanks of the Association be tendered to the Government and Members of the House of Commons for the aid granted by vote in the last session of Parliament.—Carried.

8. Moved by Lieut. Col. Kaulbach, seconded by Capt. Brecken, M.P., that the thanks of the Association be given to the Hon. Adolphe Caron, M. P., Minister of Militia, for his third donation of \$200 to the Prize Fund.—Carried.

9. Moved by Capt. Perley, seconded by Lt. Col. Boulton, that the thanks of the Association be given to Col. Gzowski, A. D. C., for his liberal donations to the Gzowski Military Match and to the British Challenge Shield Match.—Carried.

Col. Gzowski announced, that he would contribute, to the same prizes, an amount, equal to that of last year; also that His Excellency had been pleased to inform him that he would contribute \$500 towards the Prize Fund for competition under the conditions laid down by Lord Lorne.

Moved by Capt. Hood, seconded by Sergt. Mitchell, Winnipeg—

That the thanks of the meeting be voted to Capt. Perley, and Lieut. Col. Bacon, for their services in connection with the alterations of the Ranges.—Carried.

The meeting then adjourned.

REGULATIONS.

The Prize Meeting of the Association will be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by the Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other Members of Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision or a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding, but they or a majority of them may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS.

1. Competitors must make themselves acquainted with the Regulations, as also with the Conditions of any Match for which they have entered, as in neither case will the plea of ignorance be entertained.

2. Competitors must refer to the Notice Board morning and afternoon to ascertain whether orders have been issued altering the original detail of the shooting, or affecting them personally.

3. Competitors must comply with all orders given by the Executive Officer or the Range Officers on duty.

1.—GENERAL REGULATIONS.

I.—No active Militiaman shall shoot as a member of more than one corps.

II.—No officer, non-commissioned officer, or private employed by the D. R. A. for duty at the firing points or in the butts shall shoot either for a prize or for practice.

III.—In competitions restricted to Active Militiamen, or in which they shoot as such, the uniform of their corps shall be worn, viz :—

a. Tunic, patrol or regulation fatigue jacket. A leather or other elbow cap will not be allowed.

b. Trousers.

c. Regimental head dress, or a cap cover, with or without a cap under it. Cap covers or puggarees may be worn over the regimental full or undress cap, and greatcoats or waterproofs over uniforms.

Officers of a corps must all appear dressed in the same order, as must also non-commissioned officers and privates. Where a duly authorized undress for officers exists, they (the officers) may appear in it, although the non-commissioned officers and privates may be in full dress. Waist or cross-belts need not be worn.

d. In competitions not restricted to the Active Militia, competitors must appear either in complete uniform or wholly in plain clothes.

Any objection on the score of a competitor's dress must be raised before he takes up his position to shoot.

NOTE.—In "Military Match" competitions the above rules shall not apply, but special details for dress will be issued.

IV.—All protests or objections should be made to the Executive or Range Officers on duty on the spot, and, when practicable, in writing. When a protest is in the first place made verbally, it must subsequently be put in writing, and handed to the Secretary not later than one hour after the "cease fire" next following the occurrence upon which the protest is founded.

V.—Competitors must submit their rifles and ammunition for inspection whenever required.

VI.—Hair triggers will not be allowed.

VII.—Fixed artificial rests will not be allowed, except in the Skirmishing Match.

VIII.—Competitors shall only use the mats and sheets provided by the Association. Cork beds and elbow rests shall not be allowed.

IX.—No rifle may be cleaned or wiped out between the shots fired with it at any single distance of a competition.

X.—When a breech-loader is used, the competitor must not load until he has taken his position at the firing point, and the Register Keeper has given the word "All clear."

XI.—Competitors may "blow off" in the pits at the firing points only before firing, and after the presentation of a "blow-off" ticket to the Register Keeper,

XII.—Slings may be used in all matches, but when the competition is restricted to military breech-loaders the slings must be of the Government length and pattern, white, brown or black, and attached to the rifles as in Government arms.

XIII.—In individual competitions—a competitor may use a binocular or telescope, *not mounted on any kind of stand*, provided his doing so causes no delay in the shooting.

XIV.—After a competitor has taken his place at the firing point, no person, except the Register Keeper or an officer on duty, will be permitted to speak to him.

XV.—In *Matches* where *both team and individual prizes* are being offered for competition, *coaching* of any kind shall be prohibited.

XVI.—In *Matches* where the prizes are offered to *teams only*, the members of such team shooting together will be permitted to “coach” or “spot” for each other, and to use binoculars or telescopes for that purpose, provided their doing so does not delay or impede the shooting. The duly recognized Captain or Adjutant of a team, although not himself shooting, will be permitted to assist his team in like manner, and to appoint a spotter to assist him. With the above exceptions no other person will be allowed within the ropes.

XVII.—Any violation of these rules, or any part of them, must be at once reported by the Register Keeper to the Officer in charge, who will caution the offender, and on any repetition of the offence shall report the same to the Executive Officer, that the case may be dealt with by the Special Committee as laid down under the head of “penalties,” and the person or persons offending may be removed from the firing points.

2—PENALTIES—DISQUALIFICATION.

XVIII.—Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fire in a name other than his own; or
- (b) Who shall fire twice for the same prize, unless permitted by the conditions of the competition to do so; or
- (c) Who shall intentionally discharge his rifle at the wrong target; or
- (d) Who shall offer money, or a bribe of any kind, to any employee of the Association, under any pretence whatever; or

(e) Who being cognizant of any attempt to defraud the Association shall fail to report the same with due diligence to the Council, Executive, or Special Committee ; or

(f) Who shall be guilty of any conduct which the Council, Executive or Special Committee may consider discreditable ; or

(g) Who shall be reported to the Council, Executive or Special Committee as having been elsewhere guilty of such conduct or the aforesaid offences ; or

(h) Who shall directly or indirectly make any arrangements with any other competitor for pooling or dividing any prize.

Shall, upon the occurrence being proven to the satisfaction of the Council, Executive or Special Committee, or on the receipt of such report from any affiliated or duly recognized Association, forfeit all his entrance fees and prizes, and be disqualified from competing at any Prize Meeting of the Association, until reinstated.

EXCLUSION FROM FURTHER COMPETITION DURING THE MEETING.

XIX.—Any Competitor—

(a) Who shall fire when the danger signal is up ; or

(b) Who shall discharge his rifle on the range except in accordance with the regulations for shooting ; or

(c) Who shall be found with a loaded rifle, except when at his proper firing point and engaged in competing ; or

(d) Who from a proper want of care discharges his rifle accidentally. [If such discharge is due to a defect in his rifle an ample and satisfactory explanation must be given] ; or

(e) Who shall fire a pool shot before delivering his ticket to the Register Keeper ; or

(f) Who shall alter or make any erasures on his firing ticket : or

(g) Who shall act in any way that might prove dangerous,

Shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Special Committee, be excluded from all further competition at the meeting, and shall forfeit all his entrance fees.

DISALLOWANCE OF SCORES.

XX.—Any Competitor—

(a) Who shall fail to comply with the conditions laid down for any particular prize ; or with the orders of the Executive or Range officers ; or

(b) Who shall infringe any of the instructions and regulations for the conduct of the meeting while shooting for any particular prize ; or

(c) Who, when competing for the Grand Aggregate, shall fail to fill up the aggregate score ticket, or shall enter his scores incorrectly, or shall fail to deliver the same to the Statistical Officer within one hour after the conclusion of his firing in the last match,

Shall, on the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Special Committee, have his scores for that particular prize disallowed, and if such disallowance refers to the Grand Aggregate, he shall also forfeit all claim to shoot in the Governor-General's Match.

XXI.—FINES.

Any Competitor—

Who in "blowing-off" shall fail to go close up to and point his rifle into the pit provided for that purpose ; or who shall "blow off" when the danger signal is up ; or who shall accidentally fire at the wrong target, shall be fined one dollar, to be paid forthwith to the Range Officer.

In cases where a competitor is "excluded from further competition," or where his "score is disallowed," for any particular prize, the *circumstances only* under which the penalty was incurred shall be posted on the notice board, as a warning to others, without the NAME of the individual implicated.

In cases of "disqualification" the NAME of the offender as well as the particulars of the case shall be posted on the notice board.

XXII.—MITIGATION OF PENALTIES.

The Special Committee shall have power to mitigate or remit any of the above penalties.

XXIII.—PRIZE WINNERS.

Unless otherwise specified, no one will be allowed to take more than *one prize* in any competition.

XXIV.—Winners of prizes must apply for their certificates at the Statistical Office, and on signing the receipts attached thereto will receive the amount or amounts due to them from the Treasurer of the D. R. A.

XXV.—If a formal presentation takes place, Winners, being Active Militiamen, must parade in the full dress uniform of their corps.

XXVII.—MARKING

1. The marking will be as follows :—
 - a. Bull's Eye..... White disc.
 - b. Inner..... Red disc.
 - c. Magpie..... Black and White disc.
 - d. Outer..... Black disc.
 - e. Ricochet..... Black bar.
 - f. *Misses* will *not* be signalled; but if a target is lowered under the impression that it has been hit, and if no hit is found on it, after raising it the marker will wave a *black* disc, to signify that the target has not been struck.

2. When *two* shots strike a target simultaneously, that which has the highest value will alone be marked with the *marking disc*, and the competitor whose proper turn it was to fire at the target will be credited with that shot, provided he has fired. *Both hits will*, however, be shown by spotting discs.

3. On a target being lowered, the position of a hit, if any, and its value, will be shown by the spotting disc when the target is again raised.

4. The marking when signalled shall not be questioned, but if a shot is not signalled, and the Officer in charge of the firing points be satisfied that a reasonable doubt exists as to whether the shot may not have struck the target, he may ask the Officer in charge at the butt to examine the target, and the result of such examination as signalled shall be final. Any competitor challenging a shot shall deposit the sum of *fifty* cents with the Officer in charge at the firing point, which shall be forfeited in case no hit is found on the target.

5. If at the moment at which a competitor fires, his target should be lowered in such a manner as to falsify the result of his shot, the Range Officer is empowered to cancel the result of such shot, and to permit the competitor to fire another shot in its place.

6. All alterations of the registers must be initialled by the Officer making them, but no alterations, except in the case of a clerical error, shall be made without his having first signalled to the butt.

7. No person will be permitted to go and examine a target during the meeting except the Executive Officer or such person or persons as he may duly authorize to do so in his behalf.

In Skirmishing.

When the number of hits counted on the target exceeds the number of shots allowed in the competition, three marks shall be deducted for every such hit in excess of the number of such shots, unless it be proved that such hits on the target in excess of the number of shots allowed could only have been made by competitors in the squad firing more than the authorized number of rounds, in which case the squad shall be disqualified.

XXVIII.—RIFLES.

The rifles shall be classed as follows :—

CLASS I.

MILITARY BREECH-LOADERS.

Snider (Long and Short) rifles and Martini-Henry rifles, either of Government issue or of *bona fide* Government pattern, and bearing the Government viewer's mark.

1. Weight of Snider not to exceed, without bayonet, 9lbs. 12oz.
Weight of Martini-Henry, without bayonet, not to exceed 9 lbs.
2. No pad or shoe for the heel plate of the butt will be allowed.
3. Minimum pull of trigger, 6 lbs.
4. Sights to be strictly in accordance with those of the Government issue. Filed sights will not be allowed.
 - (a) All sights may be temporarily blackened or whitened, but black and white must not be mixed so as to produce a grey.

No application of a permanent nature will be allowed. No shading of sights will be permitted.

- (b) The *back sight* may be tilted forward or backward, or supported at any angle by any extemporized means.
- (c) The sliding bar may be reversed, and used on either side of the uprights. *One* permanent centre line for the Snider, and *three* for the Martini-Henry will be allowed, and temporary marks or lines of any kind removable at pleasure may be used.

CLASS II.

ANY RIFLES.

1. *Weight*—Maximum, 10 lbs.
2. *Pull of trigger*—Minimum, 3 lbs.
3. A pad or shoe for the heel plate may be used.
4. Any description of sights, except telescopic and magnifying, may be used.

XXIX.—AMMUNITION.

1. *In Competitions Restricted to "Military Breech-loaders."*

- (a) None but the ammunition issued by the D. R. A. on the ground shall be used or allowed. Price for Snider, 17 cts. per package of 10 rounds, or 3 packages for 50 cts. Price for Martini, 25 cts. per package of 10 rounds.

2.—*In Competitions open to "Any Rifles,"*

Any ammunition may be used. Competitors will be required to bring their own supply.

No restrictions will be made as to the arrangement or composition of the charges or cartridges, provided that, *in the case of Breech-loading Rifles being used* :—

- (a) No part of the charge is inserted at the muzzle.
- (b) That the Rifle is not loaded until the word "all clear" is given.
- (c) That no time is lost, and
- (d) That no dangerous practice is resorted to.

XXX.—POSITION.

Unless otherwise specified the shooting at all ranges shall be from the firing points, and may be in any position, with the head to the target.

In the Standing position the whole of the left hand must be in front of the trigger guard.

XXXI.—SIGHTING.

Unless otherwise specified two sighting shots will be allowed at each range on payment.

If a competitor be stopped in his firing by the "Cease Fire" at mid-day or evening, he shall be allowed one sighting shot, without payment, when he renews his firing.

XXXII.—ORDER OF SHOOTING.

1. Competitors must be present at the firing points punctually at the time detailed on their tickets, otherwise they will not be allowed to shoot; the time to be regulated by the clock in the Secretary's office.

2. In all ordinary competitions competitors shall, when possible, be formed up by files, and fire shot and shot *alternately*.

3. Where but *one* competitor is present, he shall fire his shots without undue delay; but the Officer in charge of the firing point, or *some person named by him*, must witness the shooting, and countersign the register. Failing such verification the score will be invalidated. Any person present whom the competitor may name will watch the score recorded, and if need be raise objection *before* the next shot is fired.

4. In competitions restricted to "Any Rifles," the competitors shall be formed in a squad, and fire shot for shot in the order in which their names are called.

5. No one shall be allowed to join the squad after the commencement of the second competitive round.

6. When once a competitor has joined a squad, he shall not leave it before he has either retired from the competition or has completed his firing, but leave may be given by the Officer in charge to any competitor who, when firing with a muzzle loader, may find it necessary through a mistake in loading to fall out for the purpose of "blowing off."

7. No two competitors shall shoot in any competition with the same rifle; nor shall a competitor change his rifle at any range during a competition, unless his first rifle should become unserviceable through an accident, which must be verified by the Officer in charge.

8. The Competitor must, after delivering *each shot*, pay attention to the score called out by the Register Keeper, and himself see that such score is correctly entered on the register, so that any objection to the score recorded may be investigated before the next shot is fired.

9. In the case of unreasonable delay in firing on the part of any competitor, or of such delay as the Range Officer may consider likely to prolong the firing beyond the time allowed, the Range Officer shall have the right to caution and time the competitor by a sand glass purporting to run one minute, more or less, and if after such caution the competitor does not fire before the sand glass has run out, the Range Officer shall declare the shot forfeited and call on the next competitor to proceed with his firing.

XXXIII.—TIES.

Ties shall be decided as follows :—

A. *In Individual Competitions for a Series of Prizes.*

1. If at more than *one* distance, by the *range totals in inverse order, commencing at the longest range.*

2. By the fewest *outers.*

3. By the fewest *maggies.*

4. By the fewest *inners.*

5. By the *value of each shot in inverse order.*

6. FOR MONEY PRIZES by *division.*

7. FOR PRIZES IN KIND, by *shooting off*, as in Clause B.

8. In the case of a prize PART IN KIND AND PART IN MONEY, by *shooting off for the Prize in Kind, and dividing the Money.*

N.B.—In all competitions the *order* of the winners shall be decided by the foregoing rules, if possible, but in the case of absolute ties the names shall be arranged alphabetically and bracketted.

B. *In Individual Competitions for a Single Prize.*

1. By the aggregate score in *three* rounds at the longest distance.

2. By firing single shots until decided.

Absentees shall forfeit their claim to shoot.

C. *In Team Competitions.*

1. If at more than one distance, *by the aggregate range totals in inverse order.*
2. By the fewest *outers.*
3. By the fewest *maggies.*
4. By the fewest *inners.*
5. By the highest scores in each team *shooting off*, as in Clause B.

D. *Grand Aggregate.*

Ties for first place to be shot off, as in Clause B.

For other places :—

1. By the total score in each match in *increase order.*
2. By the *total scores at 600 yards.*
3. By the *total scores at 500 yards.*
4. By the *total scores at 400 yards.*
5. By the *total scores at 200 yards.*
6. By shooting off as in Clause B.

Ties for all places on the Wimbledon Team *except the last, which shall be shot off*, as in Clause B., shall be decided by the rules for the Grand Aggregate.

In the Governor-General's Match, ties for the first three places and for the tenth place shall be shot off.

E. *In cases not met by the foregoing.*

1. By any *special rules attached to the conditions.*
2. *By the fiat of the Committee.*

XXXIV.—ENTRIES.

The Executive and Special Committees reserve to themselves the power of refusing any Entry for any match, or of cancelling at any moment any entry that may have been previously accepted.

The privilege of Entry is restricted to members, who have paid their subscription (\$2.00), and to non-members, who pay the Association fee of \$1.00 at the time of entry.

1. Entries for the several competitions shall close on days to be named by the Committee.

2. Every competitor shall enter and shoot under his own name, and not oftener than once for a prize, unless specially allowed by the terms of the competition.

3. No entry shall be accepted after the hour fixed for the commencement of the competition to which admission is sought.

4. Entries shall be classified :—

(a) Ordinary (at the published rate of entrance fees). To include those made and received by the Secretary of the D. R. A. on or before 4 p.m., Wednesday, 27th August.

(b) Post (at an increased charge of 20 per cent. on the published rate of entrance fees). To include those made or received after 4 p.m., Wednesday, 27th August.

N. B.—The acceptance of Post Entries will be entirely governed by circumstances. As a rule the privilege will be withdrawn as soon as the target accommodation allotted for each competition is absorbed, and whenever the Special Committee may determine.

5. To meet the case where difficulty may be experienced in selecting the actual competitors in sufficient time to make the required entries by the 27th August, Officers commanding corps and Secretaries of Provincial or Local Associations will be permitted to send in their application for (state No.) competitors, accompanying such application with the amount of the entrance fees; and to postpone the rendering of the actual names of those for whom they make the entries until the selection of the competitors is definitely made. In such cases, the Register Tickets shall not be issued before the nominal return is handed to the Secretary. Any payment made for entries in excess of the number of competitors nominated will be returned in full, as provided for under paragraph

1. A, (a), "Return of Entrance Fees."

6. Entrance fees must be paid at the time when entries are made.

The Register Tickets will be issued on application at the Secretary's office on the Range.

XXXV.—RETURN OF ENTRANCE FEES.

1. Entrance Fees in full will be returned to those—

(a) Who are prevented from being present at the meeting ; or

(b) Who attend the meeting but are incapacitated from illness or accident ; or

(c) Whose entries the Executive or Special Committees may have cancelled.

2. Claims based on other considerations than the above will, if allowed, be subject to a penalty of half forfeit.

XXXVI.—SQUADDING.

1. In the case of competitors classified as Ordinary Entries, arrangements will be made and detail published of the day, hour, and target at which each competitor will be required to attend to fulfil his engagements.

2. In the case of Post Entries, the hour of shooting cannot be predetermined or announced, and competitors so classified must await the orders that the progress of the meeting may render practicable.

XXXVII.—ALTERATION OF SQUADDING.

1. Any alterations which the Executive Officer may find it necessary to make will be duly notified on the notice board, and such notice shall be a sufficient authority for the change. In the absence of such notice, tickets will be available only for the target for which they were originally issued, and any erasure or alteration will cancel the ticket, unless verified by the initials of the Executive Officer.

2. The place of publication for all notices affecting the detail of shooting shall be the board fixed without the tent of the Executive Officer, and the posting of a notice on such board shall be taken as a good service on all affected thereby.

XXXVIII.—REGISTER TICKETS.

1. Should a competitor lose his ticket, or omit to take it to the firing point, or fail to attend at the hour detailed, or give a wrong ticket, and so by *his own neglect* miss the opportunity of competing for the prize for which his ticket was issued, he shall forfeit his claim on the Association in regard to such competition, *and no duplicate ticket shall be issued to him except under special circumstances.*

2. Any *erasure or substitution* of one name for another shall invalidate the ticket.

XXXIX.—SIGHTING AND FOULING TICKETS.

Tickets for sighting shots, 10 cents, and for fouling shots 2 cents, can be obtained at the Secretary's office. They must be delivered up to the Register Keeper before a shot is fired. Such tickets to hold good in any match during the meeting.

The Council reserves the right to alter, amend or rescind any of the foregoing regulations as circumstances may require.

CONSTITUTION.

ADOPTED AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

1.—That this Association be denominated “THE DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION.”

2.—Any person being a subscriber of \$2.00, and paying the same before the first day of September, or the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting, shall become a member of the Association for the current Association year; and any member may continue his membership by the annual payment of \$2.00.

Any person may become an Associate Member of the Association for the current year upon payment of the sum of \$1.00, and shall have the privilege of taking part in the annual matches, but shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Association.

3.—Donors of \$40.00 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a Prize of not less value, to be competed for at the Annual Prize Meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Life Members of the Association, they having the full rights and privileges of ordinary members, and their names to be published in the Annual Reports.

Donors of money or prizes in kind of Five Dollars value and upwards, but less than Forty Dollars, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Members for the year in which they contribute to the Prize Fund, with rights and privileges of membership.

4.—Any Provincial Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$25.00 annually, and any other Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$12.00 annually, to the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it. Each Affiliating Association shall be entitled to receive a Silver Medal for competition by its *bona fide* members. The winner of such medal, being an efficient member of the Active Militia, or an officer retired retaining rank, to be entitled to compete free of entrance fee in the “Dominion of Canada” and “Affiliated Association” matches at the First Prize Meeting of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association at which he is present after he wins the medal; provided always that the name of the win-

ner and details of the match at which it is won shall be communicated to the Secretary of the D. C. Rifle Association not later than the first day of such Prize Meeting.

5.—There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons, to be named by the Council.

The Governor General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."

6.—There shall be a President, to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.

7.—There shall be a Vice-President for each Province, to be elected in the same manner as the President.

8.—There shall be a Council composed of Fifty members of the Association, who shall be elected in the following proportions:—

Fourteen,	[14]	from Ontario.
Ten,	[10]	" Quebec,
Six,	[6]	" New Brunswick,
Six,	[6]	" Nova Scotia,
Four,	[4]	" Manitoba,
Four,	[4]	" British Columbia,
Four,	[4]	" P. Edward Island,
Two,	[2]	" N. West Territories so soon as an Association is formed in said Territory and is affiliated with the Dominion Rifle Association,

one half in each case to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Dominion Association, the other half by the Provincial Association of the respective Provinces at their annual meeting; the names of those elected by the Provincial Associations to be notified to the Secretary of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association on or before the day of the Annual Business Meeting each year. Six members of the Council shall form the quorum.

9.—The Council shall at its first meeting choose from its own members the Chairman of the Council.

10.—The Council shall annually elect at its first meeting an Executive Committee, consisting of fifteen (15) of its members. Five (5) to be a quorum. The President of the Association and Chairman of the Council shall be *ex officio* members of the Executive Committee.

11.—The President of the various Provincial Associations in connection with this Association, and the Deputy Adjutants General commanding districts, being members of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be *ex-officio* Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents shall be members of the Council.

12.—There shall be a Treasurer and a Secretary at Ottawa, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure who shall receive such compensation for their services as may be voted by the Council.

13.—The Council shall have the management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

14.—The Executive Committee shall give effect to such instructions as the Council may from time to time order, respecting the management of the affairs of the Association.

15.—The Council may from time to time make such rules for their guidance as they deem necessary.

16.—The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held at Ottawa, at such time and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Executive Committee, as to all points not previously decided upon by the Council; and such Prize Meeting of the Association shall be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by the Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other Members of the Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision or a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding, but they or a majority of them may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

17.—An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the Finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary under the direction of the Council, and shall be published and sent to members of the Association at least one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting.

18.—The Annual Business Meeting of the members of the Association for the Election of Officers and the Council, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at Ottawa on the third Wednesday after the Assembling of the General Session of Parliament of the Dominion, At the close of such Annual Meeting or any adjournment thereof the Association year will terminate.

19.—A General Meeting shall be held on the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting for the discussion of all matters that may be brought forward by any member or competitor attending the matches, but no changes in the constitution shall be made except at the Annual Business Meeting.

20.—No alterations in the constitution shall be made except by a resolution duly passed at the Annual Business Meeting or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all members of the Association of such proposed amendments.

21.—The Council shall have power to fill any vacancy occasioned by death or resignation in their number, from among the members of the Association.

GENERAL BY-LAWS OF THE ASSOCIATION.

ADOPTED AT

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

Meetings of Council. There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council. The first of which shall be held immediately after the Annual Business Meeting of the Association, and the second, on the first day of the Annual Prize Meeting.

Extraordinary Meetings. Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required, by the Chairman, or by any four of the members of the Council, at such place as the Chairman may direct—notification being sent to each member of the Council, at least fifteen days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the Meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meetings.

The Council to keep minutes of all proceedings. The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all Meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary,—and open to inspection of any member of the Council

Finance Committee. There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council, to be chosen at the first meeting.

Treasurer to deposit sums received in Savings Bank. The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, in such chartered Bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association.

Expenditure of sums for current expenses. All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary must be authorized by the signature of the Chairman of the Executive Committee, or in his absence by some member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Expenditures

Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

Annual
Accounts.

A detailed statement of all receipts and Expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer, made up to and closed on the 30th November.

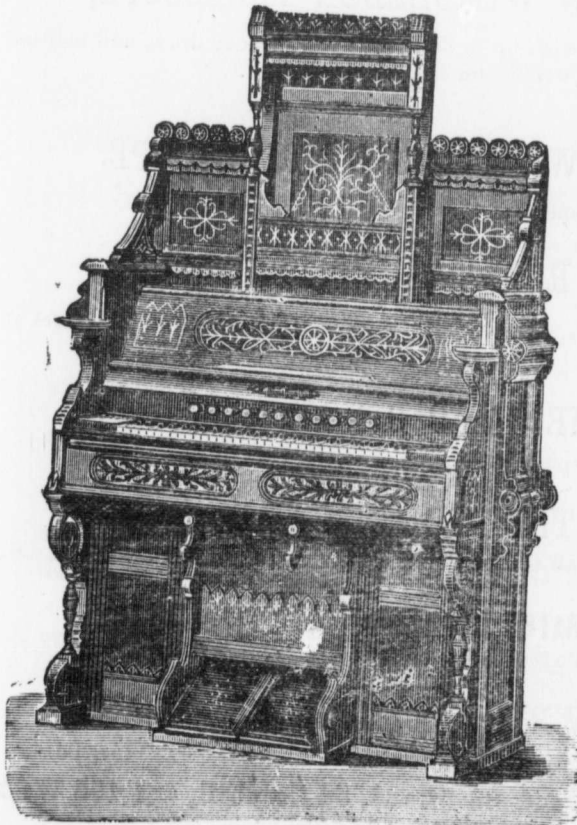
