Father Mon, an eloquent Jesuit, has been banished from Spain for delivering sermons offensive to royalty.

The Emperor of Morocco has declared El Mehdi an impostor. Gen. Gordon telegraphed that he was advancing on Khartoum by the Blue Nile with 8,000 men.

Gordon advised the appointment of Zobeir Pasha to succeed himself as governor of the Sudan. He thanks Zobeir, who is already supported, would disapprove of the appointment.

He denounces the proposed expedition to reconquer the Sudan, and expresses deep anxiety for the situation at Khartoum.

The Austrian Archduke John has issued a pamphlet on spiritualism, in which he states that its adherents number two millions, and that the doctrine is cherished in huts and hovels.
