POLITICAL PROGRESS IN EUROPE.

The last two years have been prolific of political changes in Europe, all of which have been made in the direction of the enlargement of the power of the people. Russia emancipated her serfs; Italy established a limited monarchy, swept away an overgrown monsstic system, regained Lombardy and Venetia, and arranged a treaty for the annexation of the States of the Church upon the death of Pius IX. In Turkey, religious and political liberty have been decreed, and in Spain an overpowering public will has deposed an obstructive Bourbon, and left open a practicable way for modern progress, In England, the representation has been widened and deepened, and a firm resolve taken to wipe out the anomaly of the Irish Church. Surely this manifest advancement should give hope and courage to those who seek to elevate the people to, and educate them in, the rights of self-government; placing citizenship before mere birth, and implanting a true conservatism by giving to the masses rights which have hitherto been regarded as the privilege of the few.
