The Clyde Leads in Shipping.

The largest steamers launched in the United Kingdom during the year 1892 were the Campania, 12,500 tons gross; the Australia, 6,901 tons gross, and the Himalaya, 6,898 tons gross; whilst the largest sailing vessel was the Somali, of 3,537 tons gross.

This is shown in a summary of Lloyd's shipbuilding returns for the year, which gives important particulars. Exclusive of warships, 681 vessels, of 1,109,950 tons gross, have been launched in the United Kingdom, the output of the year falling short of that the output of the year falling short of that of 1891 by about 21,000 tons. After deducting shipping destroyed the After deductions of the control of the con of 1891 by about 21,000 tons. After deducting shipping destroyed the sales to foreigners, and adding purchases from foreigners, the net increase of United Kingdom tonnage during 1892 appears to amount to about 650,000 tons. Of the principal shipbuilding districts the Clyde takes the lead with a total output of 299,352 tons. More than half the tonnage is, however, made up of sailing vessels. After the Clyde, and surpassing it in the production of steam tonnage, comes the Tees ports and the Hartlepools (202,348 tons), the Wear (186,440 tons) and the Tyne (181,508 tons). Belfast and Londonderry follow with 100,545 tons.
