## BARNEY DANSON

The Department of External Affairs confirmed today that Barney Danson, Consul General in Boston, received two extensions to his appointment from the Government.

1. An original decision to complete Mr. Danson's term as of June 30, 1985 was conveyed to him by the Right Honourable Joe Clark on February 15, 1985 (letter attached);

2. Following discussions in Cabinet, a Government decision to extend his term to December 31, 1985 was relayed to his lawyer on May 7, 1985 (letter attached)

3. Upon further consideration by Cabinet, it was agreed to extend his appointment to June 30, 1986 and that decision was conveyed to him by telephone.

4. On March 26, 1986, the Secretary of State for External Affairs wrote Mr. Danson to tell him his term was to be completed at the end of June 1986 (letter attached).

Dear Mr. Danson,

I wish to follow up on our discussions on Ottawa in November and to confirm to you that you should finish your assignment in Boston on June 30, 1985, and return to Canada by that date.

I would ask you to set in train the administrative arrangements for your removal in the normal manner and to submit your travel plans to the Department for approval. I would point out to you that any unused annual leave that you have accumulated, as of June 30, 1985, will be paid to you in cash.

While this letter is perforce administrative in tone, I wish in closing to express the appreciation of the Government for the highly effective and very dignified manner in which you have carried out your responsibilities as Consul General since taking up your duties in Boston last year.
