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SYNOPSIS.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE,
KINGSTON, 6th JUNE, 1855. }

The Annual General Meeting of the Board of Trustees of Queen's College, was held in the College, on Wednesday, the 6th day of June, 1855, pursuant to adjournment. In consequence of the non-arrival of members, it was resolved to adjourn until a quorum could be formed.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE,
14th JUNE, 1855. }

The Board met this day pursuant to adjournment. The following gentlemen having been re-elected Lay Trustees of the College, the Secretary was instructed to place their names upon the Roll of Trustees as required by the Charter.

JOSEPH BRUCE, ESQUIRE,
THE HON. JOHN HAMILTON,
THE HON. JAMES CROOKS,
THE HON. WILLIAM MORRIS.

The Hon. John Hamilton was re-elected Chairman for the present year.

It was resolved that the minutes and proceedings of the Executive Committee for the past year be sustained and approved.

It was resolved that the College School be continued on its present footing for another year.

It was resolved that the College Lots on Church street, Toronto, be offered to Allan N. McLean, Esq., for eleven hundred pounds currency; two hundred pounds being paid down, and the remainder in annual instalments of one hundred pounds each, with interest on the unpaid balance.

The Board then adjourned to meet on Wednesday, the 20th instant.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, }
20th JUNE, 1855. }

The Rev. Dr. Williamson and Mr. Mowat were appointed a Committee to make the necessary arrangements for the accommodation of the Medical Department for the ensuing year.

The Board having taken into their consideration the desirableness of a Faculty of Medicine being instituted in connection with the College, also the communication of the Medical Practitioners, bearing date the seventh February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, the large attendance of Students at the lectures delivered during last Session by the Interim Lecturers on Medicine and Surgery appointed by the Executive Committee in terms of the resolution of the Board of date second August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four; and further, having received the assurance of the concurrence of a large number of the absent Trustees in the object proposed, the Board resolved:

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That a Medical Faculty be now established in this University, and that the following Gentlemen be appointed Professors in the different branches, subject, in conformity with the terms of the Charter, to the approval of the first full meeting of the Board, viz:

JAMES SAMPSON, M. D., Professor of Clinical Medicine and Surgery, and President of the Faculty.

JOHN STEWART, L. R. C. S. Edinburgh, Professor of Anatomy, Physiology, and Practical Anatomy.

JOHN A. DICKSON, M. D., Professor of the Principles and Practice of Surgery.

HORATIO YATES, M. D., Professor of the Principles and Practice of Medicine.

FIFE FOWLER, M. D. L. R. C. S. Edinburgh, Professor of Materia Medica and Pharmacy.

L. P. LITCHFIELD, M. D., Professor of Midwifery and State and Forensic Medicine.

And the Board further resolved:

That the Medical Professors, before their admission, shall subscribe a declaration of their belief in the authenticity and inspiration of the Scriptures, and in the great doctrines contained therein, and that they will do nothing contrary to, or subversive of the same, and that they will at all times endeavour to promote the rights and interests of this University.

That the Senatus Academicus shall meet annually, for the granting of Degrees, on the day before the close of the College Session, and on such other occasions as may be appointed by the call of the Principal, or of the person acting for the time being as such: that the members of the Faculties of Arts and Theology shall meet together from time to time as heretofore, for the superintendence of the studies and discipline of their own Students; and that the Medical Faculty shall meet together as often as they deem necessary, for the same purpose, with reference to their own classes: and

That no portion of the funds of the University be de-

voted to the support of the Medical Faculty, but the Professors thereof shall derive their emoluments from their fees, and such other sources as may, by the liberality of Government or of individuals, be specially devoted to that purpose.

The Board then adjourned to meet on Tuesday, the 3rd July next.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE,
3rd JULY, 1855. }

The Board met this day pursuant to adjournment.

The Secretary was instructed to transmit to the Medical Faculty a copy of the resolutions passed at last meeting of the Board.

The Committee for making arrangements for the accommodation of the Medical Faculty were re-appointed, to report at next meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board.

The Board adjourned to meet in the College on the first Wednesday of June next.

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SYNOPSIS.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE,
10th AUGUST, 1855. }

The Executive Committee met this day, pursuant to adjournment.

The land belonging to the College in Toronto was reported to have been sold to Mr. Rice Lewis, for one thousand three hundred and thirty-two pounds; the amount payable one-tenth down and the balance in ten years, with interest payable half-yearly.

A letter was read from the City Clerk, in which the Council offered to grade Arch street, on condition that the College would grant the land requisite to make the same sixty feet wide, on the Council's paying at the rate of six hundred and forty pounds per acre for as much as the same would exceed one quarter of an acre. In reply to this the Secretary was authorised to state that the Trustees would accept their proposition, on the additional condition that the Council should erect a substantial fence between the said street and the property of the College.

An extract from the minutes of Synod was read, reporting the re-election by that body of the retiring clerical Trustees.

The Secretary was directed to inform Jarvis Albertson, the occupant of a College lot in Portland, that the Board were willing to sell the lot to him at fifteen shillings.

per acre, on condition of his paying twenty-five pounds on the first of November next, and the remainder in annual instalments of twenty-five pounds, and that in default of such payments, legal proceedings should be taken against him.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, }
23rd AUGUST, 1855. }

An extraordinary meeting of the Executive Committee was held this day.

A letter from the City Clerk was read, stating the willingness of the Council to construct a fence as required by the Trustees, on condition of the land necessary for the street being given gratuitously. In reference to this the Chairman, Mr. Mowat, and Mr. Bruce were appointed a Committee to confer with the members of the Council on the subject.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, }
2nd October, 1855. }

The Executive Committee met this day, pursuant to adjournment.

The Committee appointed at last meeting, to confer with members of the City Council, respecting the granting of the land necessary for widening Arch street, reported that they had agreed to grant the land necessary for that purpose, on the conditions of having said street graded—a fence erected along the street, and, in case drains or sewers were opened into the stream passing through the College property, said stream should be covered over by the Council in its entire length, in a proper manner.

The action of the Committee in this matter was ap-

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proved of and sustained, Professor George dissenting, and protesting, leave being granted to Professor George to give reasons for his dissent.

The Secretary was directed to write to Toronto, requesting transmission of the Mortgage of Mr. Rice Lewis, securing payment of the purchase money of the Lot sold to him, and also payment of the first instalment.

The Treasurer was authorised to effect Insurance to the amount of £1000 additional on the College buildings.

A letter having been read from the Secretary resigning his office, the resignation was accepted. The Treasurer was directed to pay the Secretary the balance due to him for Salary, together with his account for Postages and other disbursements.

The Committee agreed to offer the Office of Secretary to Mr. John Paton, with a salary of £50 per annum.

The Committee adopted an Address to His Excellency the Governor General, on the occasion of his intended visit to the City.

Professor George was requested to take charge of the class in Church History during the approaching Session, in the absence of Professor Smith, to which request Professor George acceded.

Professors George and Williamson were appointed a Committee to request Dr. Machar to undertake the class in Oriental Languages during Professor Smith's absence.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE,
13th NOVEMBER, 1855. }

The Treasurer reported the receipt of the Mortgages given by Mr. Rice Lewis, and the payment of the first instalment of the purchase money.

Dr. Machar expressed his willingness to serve the interests of the young men composing the class in Oriental Languages so far as his health and his Ministerial duties would permit him, and, in reply to the request to that effect, stated that

he would undertake the first elementary class in Hebrew twice a week.

It was resolved that in case Dr. Machar should be at any expense in finding supply for his pulpit while engaged in the duties thus undertaken by him, the Board should reimburse him for the same.

Leave was granted to Professor Weir to procure Maps requisite for his department.

A letter was read stating the inability of the Secretary of the Ordnance Department to comply with an application from the Trustees for a grant of land.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, }
4th DEC., 1855. }

The Secretary was directed to acknowledge receipt of a donation of £10 from Mrs. Logie, for the building fund.

The Chairman read a letter from Rev. Professor Smith, dated Marseilles, 27th Oct., 1855, which was ordered to be filed, and the action of the Board in reference to the vacant classes, communicated to him.

The Chairman and Mr. Drummond were appointed a Committee to obtain immediate payment of amounts over due on College lands.

The usual Scholarship of £10 from the Board, was granted on application of the Senatus.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, }
15th Jan., 1856. }

Mr. Drummond stated that he had renewed the Insurance of £1000 in the "Beacon," and had transferred a

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policy for same amount from the "Montreal" to the "Phoenix" Insurance Co.

Dr. Williamson stated that the Bursary granted at last Meeting had been bestowed upon James D. McDonell, in consequence of merit.

The Secretary was directed to acknowledge a donation of £10 from Mrs. T. Wilson, for the building fund.

A letter was read from Hugh Allan, Esq., in reference to the annual grant from the clergy Reserve Commissioners, stating that while the Commissioners have resolved to make a yearly grant to the College, the sum is not fixed. The College can claim as a right the amount of the interest on the Commutation effected by the four Professors. What that was Mr. Allan had not yet ascertained, but would write again. If the funds will admit of it, the Commissioners will make it up to £500, but they cannot pledge themselves to do so.

The Rev. Drs. George and Williamson were requested to prepare the Annual Statement for the Colonial Committee.

The Committee were informed that the Rev. Dr. Machar had undertaken both classes in Hebrew.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, }
5th Feb., 1856, }

A letter having been read from the Rev. Professor Smith, dated Rome, 15th Dec., 1855, and making application for the payment of his salary during his absence, it was resolved that Professor Smith's half year's salary be paid in advance to him, on the terms mentioned in his letter, and subject to the approval of the general meeting of Trustees.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, }
4th March, 1856. }

The Annual Report to the Colonial Committee of the Church of Scotland, was read and adopted.

The Rev. Dr. George read a protest against the action of the Executive Committee in alienating a portion of the College land to the Corporation for the purpose of widening Arch Street, and which protest was ordered to be entered on the Minutes. The Hon. John Hamilton and Mr. Drummond were appointed a Committee to answer the same.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, }
1st APRIL, 1856. }

Dr. Stewart having made application for the balance of the £250 granted for the use of the Medical Department on 2nd August, 1854, and also presented statements shewing how the money already drawn had been expended, the application was granted.

The half-yearly allowance to Queen's College Preparatory school for the six months ending 31st March, was ordered to be paid.

The Secretary was directed to prepare a Synopsis of the proceedings of the Executive Committee for the past year, and to lay the same before the next meeting.

Mr. Alex. Somerville having applied for a little time to pay an instalment of his purchase money, his application was granted.

A Circular dated Kingston, March 13, 1856, and which had been addressed by the Secretary to all congregations from whom no contribution for the past year had been received, was read.

The Senatus Academicus were requested to report upon the condition of the College Library. It was further resolved that no books should be taken out of the Library during

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the Summer months, excepting by Students resident in Kingston.

The sum of sixteen pounds was granted to the Senatus Academicus, to be spent in prizes at the close of the present Session.

The sum of six pounds was granted to Mr. Robert Campbell, being four pounds for his services as Librarian, and two pounds for the additional labour of compiling a Catalogue.

QUEEN'S COLLEGE, }
6th MAY, 1856. }

It was resolved that the lands belonging to the College, in various sections of the Province, should be appraised with a view to their sale, as opportunities might be found.

A Draft of the Synopsis, and the Treasurer's accounts for the past year, were submitted, and ordered to be printed.

Messrs. F. A. Harper and John Mowat, were appointed a Committee to audit the Treasurer's accounts.

An arrangement was entered into with Mr. James Morton, by which he is to occupy a field belonging to the College upon certain conditions, and to fence it in a substantial manner.

A report upon the present condition of the College library was submitted.

The Rev. Dr. George, the Rev. Dr. Williamson, Mr. Harper, and the Secretary were appointed a committee to lay the claims of the College before the approaching meeting of Synod, and to make an urgent appeal for aid.

The Committee then adjourned to Wednesday, the 4th of June next, on which day the annual Meeting of the Board of Trustees is to be held.
