## TENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

I beg to lay before you the Tenth Annual Report of the Toronto Public Library. The termination of the tenth year seems an appropriate occasion on which to review the progress made since the opening of the institution.

In 1883 the Library and Reading-rooms were commenced in what at that time seemed large and commodious quarters, but the continuously increasing number of readers has forced us, step by step to add to our accomodation and to part with all our tenants, until the Circulating and Reference Libraries and Reading-rooms now occupy the entire building.

The issue of books has kept pace with the general improvement as will be seen by the following comparison :

The number for 1893 is composed of 268,896 volumes taken out for home reading and 21,470 read in the rooms.

The alterations which were being carried on during the past winter prevented free access to the books in the Reference Library, and it was not until the completion of this portion of the building in May last that any considerable number of readers could be accomodated, and further in order to extend the scope and usefulness of the Library, the experiment has been tried of placing within reach of the reader all the principal encyclopædias, dictionaries, etc., the use of which no record could be kept. Consequently the number of volumes read show a decrease in this department. The success, however, of the experiment, fully warrants any departure we have made in this direction.

The long hours during which the Library requires to be kept open necessitates the service of a double staff, and therefore the expense for salaries forms the largest item in the annual expenditure. This has been for the past ten years :

The increase in 1889 was caused by the establishment of two of the Branch Libraries at the close of 1888.

In this connection it is interesting to make comparisons with similar institutions in other cities on this continent, and I have extracted from the Los Angeles report for 1893 a comparative table, showing the relative position of this Library.

Most of these libraries do not include the wages of janitor, engineer, pages, and extra assistance, while in the case of Toronto all are comprised under the one heading. It is very gratifying to know that our expense account for salaries is lower than that of any city of this continent in proportion to its population or its circulation and number of books on its shelves.

I think it is proper also to mention that this Board did not wait until January 1894 to economise. In March 1893, they prepared a scheme by which two of the Branch Libraries could be closed and a saving effected of \$4,000 per annum. I regret, however, that the action of the City Council in threatening to cut off part of our grant if this scheme were carried out, prevented its adoption. In my opinion it was an uncalled for interference with the rights and duties of the Board when endeavoring to conduct its affairs on business principles.

The completion and opening of the Reference Department marks

an era in the history of Reference formed by the citizens in 1888. They have written or 39,808 volumes in this pose. The card catalogues provided for reference already make use of them.

During the year 1893, the Library Board obtained permission to have their new building ready for use. In accordance with the provisions of the charter, conferring

The Branch Building Committee and papered, furnished, and made them bright and airy.

In July last, the International Library Association at Chicago, held a successful meeting. Instructional, European and American, and most recent developments were exhibited. Such a meeting, but keep our Library up to date, the continent.

During the year 1893, persons, glad to occupy the halls free and ready a meeting room, resolved to open the basement, for the reading matter furnished, and hand the fitting-up of the

an era in the history of the Library. The formation of a Library of Reference formed one of the principal features of the scheme laid before the citizens in 1883 and its value has been dwelt upon by all who have written or spoken on the subject. It now contains about 39,808 volumes, which have been carefully selected for the purpose. The card catalogue is complete to date and every convenience provided for readers. Judging from the number of those who already make use of it, its success is assured.

During the last session of the Provincial Parliament, we joined the Library Board of the City of Hamilton in making application for permission to have janitors or caretakers appointed special constables. In accordance with our joint request an Act was passed, 56 Vict. 36 chap., conferring this power.

The Branch Libraries have received the careful attention of the Building Committee. During the past year all have been repainted and papered, furniture has been renovated and everything done to make them bright and clean.

In July last the Chief Librarian attended the meetings of the International Library Congress and of the American Library Association at Chicago, and he reports that both were eminently successful. Instructive and interesting papers by the most prominent European and American Librarians were read and discussed, and the most recent devices for assisting the reader and saving labor were exhibited. Such meetings are not only profitable to the Librarian, but keep our Library in touch with the most progressive libraries on the continent.

During the winter season a considerable number of unemployed persons, glad to obtain shelter and rest, frequent the reading rooms, occupy the halls and prevent legitimate readers from obtaining that free and ready access to the periodicals which they should have. To meet this and to afford a resting place for this class it has been resolved to open for the winter months a special room, 30 x 90, in the basement, for their accomodation ; chairs will be provided and reading matter freely distributed. Your Building Committee have in hand the fitting-up of the room for this purpose.
