PROCEEDINGS
OF
THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE SOCIETY,
HELD ON MONDAY, JUNE 9th, 1845,
IN THE WESLEYAN-METHODIST CHURCH, St. CATHERINES, C. W.
The President of the Conference, Rev. H. WILKINSON, in the Chair.

The Rev. GEO. F. PLAYTER, Corresponding Secretary of the Society, read an abstract of the Report of the state of the Missions, when the following Resolutions were proposed and unanimously adopted by the Meeting :—

1. Moved by the Rev. ANSON GREEN, and seconded by the Rev. JOHN CARROLL,—

That the Report just read be adopted.

2. Moved by the Rev. RICHARD JONES, and seconded by the Rev. GEO. COPWAY, Indian Missionary,—

That the result thus far, of Missionary operations in this Province, both among the Indians and Destitute Settlers, not only demands the fervent expression of our grateful acknowledgments to Almighty God, but also encourages us to continue this labour of love with an unwavering purpose, until the object desired be accomplished.

3. The new Constitution of the Society having been read, it was moved by the Rev. THOMAS BEVITT, and seconded by the Rev. JOHN RYERSON,—

That the new Constitution just read be adopted, for the regulation of the Society.

4. Moved by the Rev. LACHLIN TAYLOR, and seconded by the Rev. WM. HERKIMER, Indian Missionary,—

That the following Ministers and Gentlemen be appointed Officers and Members of the General Committee for the ensuing year :—

REPORT.

THROUGH the good Providence of God, the operations of the Missionary Society of the Wesleyan-Methodist Church in Canada have gone on, during the past year, in a steady and, on the whole, satisfactory manner, among the poor natives and colonists of the Province. The supporters of the Society have not lessened in number, nor declined in zeal and liberality. The actual expenditure of the Society has been met, and no debt impedes the progress of its operations. Still, while thankful for the past and confiding for the future, it is proper to say, that with a greater liberality a greater and a more glorious work might certainly be accomplished. The Missionaries have faithfully occupied their posts, and, with various degrees of success, have preached the Gospel of Christ to perishing men. The Committee feels deeply the necessity of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on all the Mission stations, or the contributions of Christians and the labours of Missionaries will be,—not as bread cast “upon the waters” to be found “after many days,”—but “as water spilt upon the ground which cannot be gathered up again.” Let prayer for the Spirit be made by the Churches, that the labours of Missionaries may be successful, and that doors may be opened for the Gospel in parts beyond our present Mission stations. The Committee now proceed to the Twentieth Report of the Society’s operations,

and will speak first, as usual, of the Missions among the Indians, and next, of those among the poor settlements of the Province.

INDIAN MISSIONS.

With the influx of Europeans to the American continent, after its discovery by Christopher Columbus, was introduced the religion of the European nations. Spain, Portugal, and France, sent portions of the Popish priesthood for the conversion of the aborigines in South and North America. Great Britain assisted in the common cause by Ministers of the Reformed faith and worship. For three centuries the work of christianizing the natives of this continent has, with various degrees of activity, continued, and is still advancing. Various Protestant Churches are now in the field. The Methodists are endeavouring to perform their duty. The Missionaries of the Methodist Episcopal Church are in the Indian territory of the United States,—stretching from North to South 500 miles, and 150 miles from East to West, and containing a variety of tribes including 100,000 persons. In the vast territory of the Hudson Bay Company, lining the Northern boundary of Canada, and extending to the ice-covered waters of the Polar seas, a few Wesleyan Missionaries of the English Conference have taken up posts, and discourse of the Gospel to the servants of the Company and the Indian tribes, hunters of the forests and fishers of the rivers and lakes. This Society forms some links in the chain of operations, extending from the shores of the Gulf of Mexico to the Polar seas of the North. Nor have the three Methodist bodies laboured in vain. About 6000 of the native Indians are at this time members of the visible Church of Christ,—of which 4,500 belong to the

Methodist Episcopal Church, U. S., about 1000 to the Wesleyan-Methodist Church in Canada, and the remainder to the Wesleyan Connexion in England.— Whilst we are thankful for what good has been effected, we lament that it is so little compared to what is needed and desired.

The attention of the Christian Church is chiefly attracted by the pagan nations of Asia, Africa, and the islands of the oceans. The condition of the natives of America is but little thought of. Yet, large bodies of Indians roam the continent of the two Americas, "having no hope and without God in the world." Thick are the pagan natives in Patagonia, Terra del Fuego, Brazil, the Guianas, and the basins of the great rivers Orinoco, Amazon, and the La Plata. In North America, the native tribes prevail in the great territory West of the Mississippi, and in the vast regions North of Canada and West and North-west of the Canadian seas, to the borders of the Pacific ocean. Tribes of Aborigines are also to be found in Mexico and Guatimala, in the isthmus of Darien. The native population of America, at this very time, comprises about 8,000,000 of human beings, descendants of the great and numerous tribes found on the Western hemisphere by Columbus and the early discoverers, speaking the tongues of their forefathers, and exhibiting the peculiar mental and physical characteristics of the original American races. True Christianity is known by thousands; Popery tens of thousands are acquainted with; but the great bulk are yet pagan in religion and uncivilized in life. Nor is the state of the roaming tribes likely to be soon improved; for the attention of the Christian world is mostly attracted by other continents and the scattered islands of the sea. What can be done for the cinnamon-coloured man of America? Who will go into the solitary forest, or canoe the unnavigated lakes and rivers, to talk to the poor Indian of Christ? Alas! many falls of the leaf will come, and many snows will cover the leaf, before nature's

untutored children shall know "the only true God and Jesus Christ whom he hath sent." Your Committee feels that the Churches in Canada, in the United States, or in England, are not zealous enough for the welfare of the man whose land the colonist inhabits and enjoys. Nor are Missionaries of the high order numerous enough. Having hinted at the large field for Missionary operations on this western continent, waiting for occupancy, the Committee proceed to the consideration of that work under their care and responsibility.

Manual Labour Schools for teaching the Indian youth the mechanical arts and agriculture, are felt to be indispensable for winning them from the migratory habits of their forefathers, and for inducting them into the manners and customs of civilized life. The erection of such schools is in contemplation by the Committee. The Rev. Peter Jones is now in Great Britain soliciting assistance of the evangelical Churches for this object, and has met with encouraging success.

The Indians of Canada, who have embraced Christianity and adopted a settled life, have for many years been dissatisfied with the situation of their temporal affairs, and have at different times appealed to the Government for redress. The chief complaint has been, of the insecurity of their tenure for holding lands. In 1842, a Commission was appointed by the Government to investigate the Indian affairs. A list of twenty-four queries was drawn up, and forwarded to Missionaries and others for replies. The Report of the Commissioners is now printed, and contains—

1st. A general history of the relations between the Government and the Indians since the conquest.—2nd. A general view of the past and present conditions of the Indians,—and 3rd. Present mode of conducting Indian affairs, with recommendations for its amendment. It appears that there are seven tribes of Indians in Canada East at present who occupy seven villages or settlements:—Iroquois at Caughnawaga; Iroquois at St. Regis; Algonquins and Nipissings at the Lake of Two Mountains; Abenaguais at St. Francis; Abenaguais at Becancour, (near Three Rivers); Hurons at Lorette; and Micmacs at Restigouche. Besides these there are a few wandering Indians,

whose whereabouts is uncertain, and who are of the Têtes de Boule and Amalacite tribes. The total of the Indians in Lower Canada is estimated at 3301 persons. The Indians in Canada West are the Six Nations, (Mohawks, Oneidas, Senecas, Cayugas, Onondagas, and Tuscaroras) on the Grand River; Delawares on the River Thames; Chippewas and Munsees in Caradoc; Oneidas in Delaware Township; Chippewas, Hurons, Shawnees, and Munsees at Amherstburgh; Chippewas, Pottawatamies, and Ottawas at various places; Mohawks at the Bay of Quinte; Mississagas at various places; Algonquins near Kingston: forming a total of 8862 persons. These are exclusive of any of the Indian tribes under British Dominion in the North West, and also of wandering Indians in the United States, who used to receive presents annually from the British Government, a practice now ordered to be discontinued. The number of the Indians is stated to be on the increase, partly from the excess of the births over the deaths, and partly by a rather numerous immigration of tribes from the United States.

Some alterations have lately taken place in the management of the Indian affairs, which have given satisfaction. It is hoped that all cause of complaint will be removed.

The reports from the Indian Missions are generally satisfactory. The number of Indian members of the Church continues nearly as last year. The Schools, a very important department of the missionary work, are still anxiously regarded by the Committee. Improvements in agriculture are yearly seen among the settled tribes. The labours of the Society are visibly under the blessing of Almighty God. We are glad to find, that, from the liberal subscriptions of its increasing friends, the work will proceed.

S A U G E E N G.

The Saugeeng mission is the farthest of our missions from the white settlers, and lies nearest to the uncivilized and pagan Indians of the woods, some of whom have visited the mission and have heard the Word. Most of the expense of the mission is defrayed by the Indians themselves, from their Government annuities. There are 147 Indian members of the Church. The

Indian Missionary, George Copway, thus reports of the mission :—

SAUCEEING MISSION STATION, *May 19th, 1845.*

To the Corresponding Secretary of the Missionary Society of the Wesleyan Methodist Church.

REV. AND DEAR BROTHER,

I am happy to inform you that the Lord has blessed us here in this mission during the two past years I have laboured among these Indians. I can say that I have never spent such an interesting year as the past. I can speak of the faithfulness of our people in attending to the means of grace.

Our meetings have been constantly interesting, and many of the poor pagans have of late been brought to realize that there is mercy for the Indian. Some of those that never before would attend our meetings while they were here, attended our Camp Meeting last fall. They were made to feel the force of the truth of the Gospel; and three families gave up all their heathenish notions by casting away their idols, and heartily embracing the Gospel of Christ.

During the year there has been about eleven increase, notwithstanding some removals from the mission. Some of the Indians formerly residing at St. Clair have removed to this place this spring, and we expect more will be here during the summer from other tribes, and this will form a considerable Indian settlement in future.

There have been three deaths since Conference; and every one died very happy. A few days ago one of our promising men died with an affection of the lungs. He took sick in February last while out hunting, and came home sick this spring, and grew worse and worse. Just before his death he had a bright evidence of his acceptance with God. He continued, as long as he had strength, to exhort his friends and relatives to be faithful and meet him in Heaven. Just the day before his death he said to his friends, that "soon after twelve o'clock to-morrow I shall leave you;" and added, that he wanted to see them all at that time; and when the time arrived his friends were near, and after speaking of the happiness he felt, and the joy which was before him, he stretched his withered hands and bid farewell to his relatives, and in less than five minutes expired, amidst wails of grief of friends on earth, but shouts of joy of those in heaven. He spoke of angels by his bed, who, as he said, were waiting to "waft his spirit home." Many a poor wandering soul, who has been brought under the influence of the Gospel, has thus died happy in the Lord, who otherwise would have died in heathenish darkness, had the good people never sent us those good men who have pointed us to Christ and him crucified.

The exhorters and class-leaders on this mission are in general very zealous. They are attentive to their duty, and always ready to act with their Missionary in any good concerning their welfare. During

the year they have gone about forty miles on the Northern coast for the spiritual benefit of those that are living there; and when I did not go to Owen Sound, while brother Herkimer was away, they were always ready to go.

The School has been regularly kept up during the year, with the exception of a few days in the time they were busy making sugar this spring. There have been 65 scholars in daily attendance, more or less.

I must say, for brother Jackson, the school-teacher, that he is decidedly the best Indian school-teacher I have ever seen anywhere; and the consequence has been, the children are well advanced in their studies.

The appearance of our village is more lively than it was when I first arrived here two years ago, when there were but two more houses beside the old Mission-house we then lived in; and now we see comfortable houses stretching along the high banks of the river nearly a mile long.

A year ago this winter the Indians sent a Petition to His Excellency the Governor-General, requesting him to allow the salary of their Missionary out of their annuity; to which His Excellency was pleased to allow the sum of £100 per annum. I am happy to see your Committee was pleased to credit the Saugeeng Indians that amount in last year's Report.

These Indians have been very kind to me. They have also built a comfortable Mission-house out of their annuity last summer. They have also built a new School-house, with some assistance from your Society, where we have had our meetings during the past year. They have also a Mission Church under Government contract at present, which will contain 300 persons,—I expect it will cost them £375. Several more houses are building this summer for the accommodation of the Indians.

During the year the Indians have made considerable improvement in farming, and have made some valuable addition to their stock.

C R E D I T.

The Missionary laments the uncertainty connected with the residence of the Indians on the Credit River, as tending to hinder the improvement of the location and the cultivation of the ground. He also laments the temptation to use ardent spirits, which the Indians are so frequently exposed to. The number of members reported is 38 whites and 114 Indians, being a small increase over last year. The Rev. S. Belton thus reports to the Committee:—

I am sorry that it is not in my power to give you such a gratifying account of the state of this Mission as from its age and former

standing might be expected,—it being one of the oldest in the catalogue of your numerous and very useful mission stations. I would not intimate, however, that the labours of the past year have been altogether in vain. We have had some tokens of good. There have been several conversions; and in some at least a visible improvement in their spiritual state; and, what is the crowning glory of missionary efforts has been witnessed during the past year, in the happy and triumphant deaths of four persons connected with this Mission. But there are hindrances to great prosperity here, as in other places; and one of some importance is, the uncertainty which seems to hang over their future condition. The Indians think they will have to leave here sooner or later; and this belief is strengthened by the corresponding testimony and wish of the settlers at Port Credit. This state of affairs operates unfavourably to their rapid improvement in the arts of civilized life; though in this respect they are slowly advancing.

To their religious prosperity there is an almost insurmountable obstacle, in the avidity with which certain individuals cultivate the baneful propensity for ardent spirits; thus ensnaring and destroying the simple and unwary—while, at the same time, the agents of this evil employ every means to escape the penalty of the law. The official members of the Church in this place are not unconcerned spectators of the injury thus inflicted upon their people; and the following Resolutions, passed at a late Leaders' Meeting, will show their anxious desire and determination to bring the authors of this evil to punishment:—

Moved by William Sutton, seconded by David Sawyer, and unanimously passed:—

“That intemperance is becoming an alarming evil amongst our people, and we deem it our imperative duty to use every exertion in our power to bring the venders of Ardent Spirits to punishment.”

The second Resolution was in regard to the Observance of the Sabbath. It was moved by David Sawyer, and seconded by Thomas Smith, senr., and unanimously passed:—

“That the observance of the Sabbath Day be strictly enforced amongst our young people and our community generally.”

It is of vital importance for the constant and permanent improvement of the Aborigines of this country, that they be settled in some place of the possession of which they may be secure; so that the Indian will feel assured that his improvement will descend as an inheritance to his posterity. Then, and then only, will he be contented, enterprising, religious, and happy.

MUNCEY.

It is with great pleasure that the Committee learns that the Indians of the three tribes members of the Church have been steady and correct in their christian walk. Only eight out of a membership of more than 200 Indians have been cut off from the Church for evil conduct during the year,—a fact showing that, with the oversight of a faithful pastor, an Indian membership may be as much relied on as a white. Agriculture is advancing among the natives, who have raised more the last than in any former year. The mission contributes largely towards its own support. The Rev. C. Flumfelt gives the following report of the mission :—

In closing the labours of the year on this mission, we see abundant cause of thankfulness to Almighty God for the degree of prosperity with which he has been pleased to crown our feeble efforts.

We cannot say that the mission is enjoying that state of prosperity that we ardently wish ; but it is in a healthy condition. We have 3 Indian congregations, and one composed of Whites, on this mission ; their numbers as follows, viz. :—Ojibways, 121 ; Oneidas, 55 ; Munceys, 38 ; Whites, 8.—Total 222.

The religious character of our Indian brethren has been consistent during the year, with few exceptions. There have been the following changes :—

The temporal state of the mission is improving. During the past year each branch of the mission raised a sufficiency of grain for their own consumption, with a considerable surplus ; and their crops of wheat, corn, and potatoes, will (with the blessing of God) furnish them with a much larger amount of produce than has been raised by them in any preceding year.

The School was in a languid state when I came here, and it was found necessary to remove the Teacher and employ another. He commenced teaching April 1st ; since then, the average attendance has been from 20 to 25 per day, who appear to be making tolerable proficiency in their different studies.

As it regards finances, we have paid into the Missionary Fund £57 3s. 11½ ; and the Indians of the different tribes appear anxious to do all they can to assist in this way.

In conclusion, it appears evident that this mission is in an improving condition, and I sincerely pray that it may continue to improve until all the red men within its bounds shall be brought under the influence of religion and civilization.

GRAND RIVER.

We are sorry to learn that the affairs of this locality have not improved since our last Report. Sectarianism prevails. Some seek to undermine our old established mission, as if no other opening could be found for the labours of ministers and the expenditure of the contributions of christians. The jarring of the English Wesleyan Conference Agents with our mission is particularly painful. The Rev. Hamilton Biggar writes :

My expectations, when I last wrote, of a speedy termination of conflicting efforts in Methodism on this mission, I am sorry to say, have not been realized. I judged from the exceeding low state of the missionary party here, and was confirmed in this by the information I received on my way to Conference, from one of the missionaries, that the returns from this mission were 13 members. But since then, another agent has been employed, and other efforts made ; and while we are aware that desperate efforts may in some measure be justified by a desperate state ; yet to one, who in his simplicity is wont to think that Christianity needs not the cunning of men, but the power of God for its success, *the furnishing of provision, by a Missionary Society, for the entire congregation, to get up a Camp Meeting*, savours too much of man and too little of God. In my absence, attending Missionary Meetings, our mission suffered loss from the same quarter. Had their enlargement been made by possessing ground wrested from the usurper, I should have rejoiced : but when accomplished by taking a piece of their neighbouring vineyard, and adding it to their own, sorrow fills my heart. In these things I am repeatedly reminded of commercial transactions, which we frequently see mentioned in our newspapers : such and such a lot of flour changed hands at such and such prices. On what terms changes have been effected here, I am not able to say, nor is it of importance to know. Were it not that I recollect, and painfully too, of the many that have changed hands, whose advantages have been far superior, and very probably with far less efforts to induce them, I should be completely astonished. With our losses we have had our gains, which are promising both for usefulness and stability ; nor do we know, that, in this, we have entered upon other men's labours.

I mentioned, last year, the inconvenience the Indians have in attending the chapel ; that inconvenience has not diminished, but increased.

The Indians have recently made to the Government a surrender of all their lands in this section, lying on the north side of the river; and to sustain the mission, there must be at least some establishment on the south side. A little below us on the south side, and in the very centre of the settlement, the New England Society Missionaries and Baptists have their establishments, whilst ours can scarcely be included in the outskirts.

The School has been, as was last year, partly missionary and partly district, including the children of both Whites and Indians.

The same amount of labour has been bestowed by your Missionary among the white settlements as was last year; yet we have not the pleasure of informing the Society of so great an increase. Conversions we have had of a very pleasing nature, and considerable many; but our deductions have been unusually large, principally owing to removals; some have fallen asleep, and others have not distinguished themselves as did Gideon and his three hundred men, when they passed over Jordan, "faint, yet pursuing."

OWEN SOUND.

The Indian missionary, Wm. Herkimer, has laboured here during the year. He has preached the Gospel among his countrymen, and has established a Temperance Society,—of which many of the Indians became members. The members of the church are 3 Whites and 54 Indians.

LAKE SIMCOE.

The effects of Puseyism are felt even in some of the Indian settlements of Canada. Episcopalian Ministers, like Popish Priests, inform the Indians of their only having the right of preaching the Gospel and administering the Sacraments. To effect their purpose further, misrepresentations are made use of, unworthy of the cause sought to be promoted. The number in Church membership is 166, of which 132 are Indians. Of the general state of the mission we have the following report from the Missionary:—

This mission embraces Indians and back settlers. The Indians are located in two villages, the principal one being in the township of Rama, situated at the North-east corner of Lake Simcoe. Here the Missionary has resided, watching over and preaching to them six

times a-month. The other mission family is located at the mouth of the river Severn, on Lake Huron, twenty-eight miles north of Rama ; here two days every two weeks is spent by the Missionary,—the other part of his work lies in the townships of Orillia, Oro, and Medonte. Altogether, we have ten appointments in every two weeks, and one hundred miles' travel, with a part of it by canoe.

The first part of the year we had peace and some encouraging prospects. The Lord gave us tokens for good, our congregations increased, great attention was paid to the Word, and we have reason to believe that there were some conversions. The latter part of the year has been a trying season, principally owing to the attempts of an Episcopalian minister to break up our mission among the White people by exciting their prejudices, among the Indians ; by arguing on their temporal interests, saying that to have their great Mother the Queen's favour they must be of her Church ; the Governor General's favour would be secured by the same way. They were told they could not be loyal and be Methodists, and some were persuaded that they would become very poor if they did not leave the Methodists and join the Episcopal Church. His Excellency sent a message to the Chief and his tribe, informing him that he wished them all to remain peaceable, in the Church of their first choice ; and we have good reason to be thankful for the preserving mercy of our God ; nearly all our members have remained firm in their attachments to our Zion.

We have two Schools in operation on the mission the past year. At Rama the school has been kept about half the time. The missionary taught in the school as much as he could when at home ; a young man was employed near three months in the winter ; the number of children is above 40, the average attendance at school was 20. The school at the Severn has been taught by brother Joseph Benson (a young Indian brother of piety and promise,) the last nine months of the year ; the number of children is about 20 ; average attendance at school, 15. The books at both schools are nearly worn out ; they both need a fresh supply.

The number of members in society at the close of this year is 167. 28 have been taken on trial during the year, 13 have been dropped or expelled, 6 have withdrawn, 6 have removed to other places, 4 have been received from other missions, giving an increase of 7 over last year. There have been 4 deaths and 12 births among the Indians during the past year ; the deaths were 3 children and 1 adult. Altogether, we have reason to praise God for the past, and trust him for the future ; and we indulge a hope that the coming year will be much more prosperous than the past. May the good Lord grant it!

SNAKE ISLAND.

This island in Lake Simcoe was included, during the year, in the Newmarket Circuit. The mission is in

an encouraging condition. The Rev. Ezra Adams thus reports :—

I am happy in being able to say that the greater part of the Indians at Snake Island are doing well. There are four Classes, containing 65 Indians and 4 white members—the most of whom are decidedly pious. The School, which consists of 26 scholars, is promising. The Indians appear to be slowly improving in the art of husbandry, enlarging and fencing their fields. They are preparing to erect a new Meeting-house ; and have appropriated £12, 10s. from their annuities to aid in paying their school-teacher, Br. William Law, who was one of the first who engaged in giving them religious instruction, and in whom they place the utmost confidence. May the Parent of all mercies throw about these Children of the Forest the arms of his providence and grace, and guide them safe to their future and better home !

The School Teacher has furnished a report of the School. It appears that there are 31 Indians, boys and girls, from 4 years of age to 14, under instruction, besides several young men.— Eight of the boys are learning to write.

SCHOOGOG LAKE.

A tribe of Indians resides on an island in this lake. All the adults but two are members of the Church, and of the Total-Abstinence Society. The Committee are glad to learn that the School, under the care of Mr. D. G. Fletcher, is in a prosperous condition. Most of the Indian children can read in the New Testament. The school teacher, who also acts as a local preacher, furnishes the following detailed and interesting report of the mission :—

It will be borne in mind, that the Indians who are located here constituted the Balsam Lake Mission until recently. Having vacated their land, by reason of its sterility and distance from market, with some other reasons not necessary to mention here, they made a purchase of about nine hundred acres in one block in Big Island. It will be readily anticipated therefore that I cannot report on large improvements, substantial buildings, or pleasant meadows ; but this I can say, that considering the limited time of their residence here, only eighteen months, they have shown a strong inclination to become what

every philanthropic mind could wish them to be ; namely, good farmers ; and, what is better, good christians. Although their means of subsistence was small, and their mode of life in some respects changed for the worse, yet they encountered the tall trees of the forest with considerable spirit, and succeeded the first winter in chopping about forty acres of timber, about fifteen of which they cleared away in the spring, and put the ground into crop. This spring they have logged the remainder, together with some more chopped during last winter, and the prospect now is that the close of this season will bring with it an abundant supply of corn, potatoes, pumpkins, &c. They seem much pleased with the productions of last year's labour, and say, " no Balsam Lake like this." There are in this tribe of Indians a number of active, enterprising men, who, I have no doubt, will in a few years exchange the gun and spear for the better weapons of husbandry—the plough and harrow. Amongst the foremost, I may say foremost of all, stands their worthy chief, as a pattern of industry, integrity, and piety : few indeed are the way-marks to the Heavenly country who shine brighter than he. I may say, without hesitancy, that his heart is constantly set on fire of love both to God and man. With such a man at their head, it would not be unreasonable to suppose that a zeal for heavenly things would be manifested in proportion to their earthly attainments. Such has been, and still is, the case ; for as soon as a place was secured large enough for a chapel and dwelling-house, the work of building commenced, and before the first season closed—to their praise be it spoken—the two houses were completed ; and although not large, yet serve the purpose for which they are intended very comfortably. There is half an acre of ground attached to each building, the one for a burying-ground and the other for a garden. But empty houses did not satisfy them. They therefore applied for, and did not rest until they obtained, some one by whom they might be instructed, and from whom they might

" Hear of Heaven and learn the way."

With regard to the state of Society at present, I have great pleasure in saying, that, with one or two exceptions, all seem to be striving to attain to the fullness of their redemption. All the adults, except two, are members of our Church ; and all, with the same exception, are members of the Total-Abstinence Society. There have been three accessions to our number from amongst the ungodly, and I can say that all our meetings have been crowned with blessings. There are at present forty-eight members in connexion with the society, who are divided into three classes, and placed under the care of six leaders—two leaders to a class. During the past six months there has been but one death, (a happy one) and six births ; and while here I may say, that in general, the health of the Indians is good. In all there are one hundred and five in the tribe, and but one case of consumption. My humble opinion is, they are not more subject to the disease than the whites.

With regard to the School, it is in my power to report favourably. Although not large, yet it is flourishing. During the winter, I had upwards of twenty scholars: some of them, however, were young men, and their assistance is needed in tilling the ground; consequently I am reduced to eighteen in number, the most of whom can read in the Testament. In the course of another year there will be about ten more who will be old enough to become subjects of tuition, and who, together with the present number, will make a fine school. I have not taken any white children under tuition, as I had no instructions to that effect, although many warm applications have been made for that purpose.

In connexion with the Peterborough Circuit, there is a Society of 17 Indians reported to the Conference and appearing in the "Minutes," but no report has been forwarded to the Committee.

MISSIONS AMONG WHITE SETTLERS.

Having given the reports from the Indian missions, the Committee now proceeds to give an account of the operations of the Society's missionaries among the poor White settlers of the Province.

GOSFIELD.

Of this mission the Rev. Solomon Waldron has sent the following report:—

This station embraces the following townships, viz. :—Tilbury, Romney, Mersea, Colchester, Gosfield, and Malden,—Rochester west, Tilbury, and Maidstone, having last year been set off as a separate mission, from which a separate report will of course appear, embracing the principal mission ground in this section of our Zion.

There is, however, a small tribe of Indians connected with this station, but for the want of an Interpreter we have been able to render them but little service. 'Tis true we succeeded in establishing a school, taught by a native for a short time, but when the time of the fall hunts arrived they left the station, and the school was discontinued. We have visited them occasionally on their hunting ground, but to little purpose, as we said, for the want of an Interpreter. Could this tribe be induced to remove to some mission they could be saved, but in their present roving state there is but little hope.

TILBURY.

The following mission, as mentioned in the preceding report, was a part of the Gosfield mission. The Rev. S. Snider has travelled this locality during the year, and he thus reports of it:—

The Tilbury Mission embraces the townships of East Tilbury, West Tilbury, Rochester, and Maidstone. The inhabitants are chiefly emigrants from the British islands, with some Canadians. Maidstone and Rochester were visited a few years ago by some of the Local brethren from the Gosfield Circuit, subsequently by the Preachers travelling on that circuit; but West Tilbury and East Tilbury were visited barely once by a Travelling Preacher previous to last August. Persons have been heard to say that they had lived eight or nine years in the woods, and never heard one discourse on any religious subject. There has been regular preaching at six places, and occasional visits paid to another. The people generally have been kind and well-disposed; and their good attendance and orderly behaviour in the place of worship clearly indicate good sense; respect for the ordinances of religion, and a willingness to hear. On some occasions it was nearly impossible to restrain the strong emotions of the mind while contemplating these once favoured sons of Britain, now located in the wilderness, and literally running wild. The congregations average from 30 to 40 hearers. There were 26 members found in connexion with our society in Rochester and Maidstone, and 22 have been added in East and West Tilbury.

WARWICK AND ADELAIDE.

This mission has been under the care of Rev. Wm. Dignam, who gives the following account of it:—

The lapse of another year has made some changes in the Church of Christ. Some are gone to a world of spirits, some are gone to other places of residence, some are gone to the world again, and some are gone, and some are going, to Nauvoo. I look with amazement at the ways of the Lord! Notwithstanding upwards of one hundred souls last year brought to Christ, I cannot say there has been one soul genuinely converted this year. This shows that "it is God that giveth the increase." Yet there have been new classes formed in destitute places; there, many backsliders have been reclaimed; the Gospel has been preached in regions beyond; the wavering have been established; the weakly have been strengthened, and the face of the mission bears more the feature of Methodism. Last year was a year of breaking down, this year was one of building up; last year we hauled to land,

this year we cast the bad away. There are 14 classes on the mission, 234 members, 13 class-leaders, and 7 local labourers. Though much hindered by the influence of the ague, the Lord enabled me to hold meetings in 64 places on the mission. And I fondly hope the day is dawning when this place will pay, with good interest, what the wealthier parts have so kindly contributed; and I for one will hail its approach. Temperance meetings, feasts, and lectures, formed a great part of the winter's exercises, and in this respect stands forth zealously to oppose the use of ardent spirits in assemblies throughout the mission. I have not obtained all the statistical knowledge in the Sabbath School department. One Sabbath I lectured to about 80 in a Sabbath School.

GUELPH.

The Guelph Mission, under the superintendence of the Rev. Stephen Brownell, is in a rising state. He says :—

This mission is very laborious and too extensive for one Missionary to travel advantageously. The roads are extremely bad; there are rivers to cross, over which there are no bridges within the limits of the mission, so that both spring and fall the Missionary has many extra miles to travel to accomplish but little. There are several bridges about to be built which, when finished, will render the mission less laborious. The Churches alluded to in the former report have been raised, but remain in an unfinished state, owing to want of funds. We anticipate getting them fitted up in a rough manner during the ensuing year, so that worship may be conducted in them.

I have taken a bond for another Church site in a conspicuous place; the deed cannot be legally obtained until April next, one of the granters being a minor. We have nine regular appointments in the fortnight, and 123 miles travel. Our average number of hearers is about the same as last year, as our population has not increased. We have two Sabbath Schools, embracing 100 children and youth. The school at the village of Elora was kept up regularly during the winter. The attendance was very good. This mission embraces the following townships, viz :—Guelph, Waterloo, Welsley, Woolwich, Nichol, Garrafraxa, and Arthur. I think there should be two missionaries sent to the mission next year, so that the town of Guelph may be served efficiently. Our prospects are better in the town than they have been at any period since the dissolution of the "Union." I have not had time to make any extra effort during the year without neglecting the regular work, which I did not think proper to do. Owing to several removals, there will be a decrease on the mission of five members. Our funds are all on the increase. We have obtained more quarterage, more for the Contingent and Superannuated Preachers' funds than last year.

DEVONSHIRE.

This westerly mission was travelled by the Rev. Thomas Williams. His report contains several things worthy of much consideration by the Society. Says he:—

This mission was formed last year, by setting off two appointments from the London Circuit in what is called the "Devonshire Settlement," and discretionary power was given to me to extend my work, to the utmost of my ability, in the whole Huron Tract.

During the first three months I took up and laboured in the country lying on the London and Goderich roads, from the township of Biddolph to the town of Goderich—about fifty miles in extent—making an occasional tour into the eastern part of the district to Fullarton and Blanchard, spending my alternate Sabbaths at Goderich and Devonshire settlement. In September last I was visited by the Chairman, who advised me to withdraw my attention from Goderich and spend my alternate Sabbaths at Devonshire and Blanchard, which I have continued to do to the end of the year, making only occasional visits to Goderich and the adjacent country. My regular labours during the year have extended through the townships of Biddolph, McGillivray, Stephen, Osborne, Flay, Stanley, Tuckersmith, Fullarton, and Blanchard; and my occasional labours into Goderich town and township, Ashfield, Hullet, Mitchell, Downie, and Wawanosh; and Colborne may be added, as their openings in them. In all of the above-named places my congregations were increasingly large, attentive, and interested; and even at the occasional appointments anxious desires were always expressed for a continuation of my labours. In some of the above-named townships I have had the honour to have preached the first sermon; and in one, I am the only preacher who ever officiated in it, though it has had inhabitants sufficient to hold Township Meetings and send a member to the District Council for three years.

Although I have been led to extend my work beyond what I could regularly attend to, yet, with the help of three or four local brethren and exhorters, the means of grace were regularly kept up at most of the appointments; and, through the blessing of God, we have prospered in a good degree. Many old Methodists have been gathered together, and a goodly number hopefully converted to God, during the year, some at almost every appointment; and in one place, where at Christmas last there was not a Methodist, there has been a class of 27 members raised up, most of whom have experienced the influence of grace in the renewal of their hearts and the change of their lives, and they have contributed most liberally to the support of the preacher of any class on the mission. But even here, where our labours in the Lord have been so much blessed, and where there is such need of our

exertions, we do not get along without opposition, and we meet it from those who are teachers of what they call "a more British kind of Methodism." They have *never* failed, on the least appearance of our increasing influence, to cry out their *watchword*, "Rebels," "Rebels!" But, notwithstanding this, our course has been onward; and even these people, who were so recently acquainted with our Ministry and our position as a Church, are beginning to see the foolishness and baseness of such unfounded and unproveable *slanders*; and a growing conviction is prevailing amongst them that the Ministers of the Wesleyan-Methodist Church in Canada are better suited to communicate that religious knowledge, (of which there is still such destitution) by their knowledge of the country, and interest in the country, than any "newly-imported Missionary" can be, among a people already educated and truly British. It has been a matter of regret among our friends, and especially at Goderich, that Mr Appleford, who was stationed as a Missionary here in 1842, was so soon removed, when the prospect of his usefulness seemed to be so encouraging, and that this District has not ever since been occupied by a Missionary of our Church.

There are now eleven regular appointments on the mission, and five occasional ones, and I know of places where seven or eight others might be taken up with a prospect of doing good. When I came on the mission I found 55 members in society; 61 have been added during the year. The people are building a good log church, for which a deed has been secured to the Conference; and they are beginning to talk of building one or two others, and giving a lot of land for a parsonage. They have raised £9 0s. 10d. towards paying the salary of their missionary, and £7 2s. 6d. for expenses, and I have no doubt that in a short time they will do as much towards the support of their ministers as any circuit in their circumstances in the Province, and occupy as respectable a position in our Church.

There are a few things more, in regard to the prospects of this country, which I would beg to mention for your information:—1. There are many large settlements which were never yet visited by our Missionaries or any other, and cannot be visited till there are additional labourers sent. New settlements are forming almost every month, and many Methodists are moving into the district from other parts of the Province, and from the old country. These things must necessarily make constant demand for increased labour.

2. The town of Goderich is a place of considerable importance. We have had no regular preaching there since the dissolution of the Union. I have preached there about six times during the year, with increasing encouragement. We have some warm friends there, who express anxious desires for the services of a minister of our Church. One man (Mr. John Taylor) offers a house rent free to a Missionary for one year, or for half the rent for two years. There is a commodious school-house in the town that will comfortably seat 200 persons.

They will be this summer altogether without preaching every alternate Sabbath in the forenoon. It appears to me that, if possible, these things should induce our Church to send a Missionary for Goderich and the adjacent country.

Y O R K.

The state of the York Mission is shown in the following communication from the Rev. Sylvester Hurlburt:—

I suppose some account will be expected from us of this Missionary Circuit at the close of the year. It is made up of what was formerly called the Walpole Mission: three Sabbath appointments from the Grimsby Circuit—one of which is in the village of Dunnville—and three Sabbath appointments from the Hamilton Circuit. It embraces the country lying on each side of the Grand River, from the village of Caledonia to nearly its mouth—a distance of almost thirty miles. In another direction, it extends from Lake Erie to very near Lake Ontario; extending, more or less, into six or seven townships. The number in Society is 116. The travelling is extremely bad at some seasons of the year, as the soil is mostly a stiff clay; the country new, and not much improved. We have generally found the people willing to hear, and in some places giving a decided preference to our ministry. In a number of places appointments have been taken up where there had been no regular preaching, and in some neighbourhoods there is no other preaching. One entire new class has been formed, consisting of eleven members, mostly new converts. We are not able to speak of great success; that is, of a great increase of members. We can say, however, that we have laboured faithfully, and hope it will not be altogether in vain.

We have two Chapels on the circuit; one of which was erected last season in this village—a neat and commodious place of worship, capable of seating nearly two hundred persons. We are indebted principally to our predecessor, L. O. Rice, for this house of worship, as it was through his perseverance and diligence that the place was got up. We are sorry, however, that the facts of the case compel us to say that it is burdened with a heavy debt.

Our friends on the circuit have shown a willingness to support the funds of our Church, according to their ability, which is proved from the fact, that although but two Missionary Meetings were held on the circuit, the sum of fifteen pounds and a few shillings were realized; about ten pounds of which were raised in the village of York. The Contingent and Superannuated Funds have also been well sustained.

We have given a good deal of our attention to Sabbath Schools, and have succeeded, with the assistance of our friends, in getting up a rather interesting Sabbath School in the village of York, numbering

something over twenty scholars. Another small school has been commenced in the village of Cayuga, about six miles farther down the river; and though not a Methodist school, we have given it all the support in our power, feeling it to be our duty, in every lawful way, to promote these nurseries of piety. There are other Sabbath Schools on the circuit, partly Methodist, and partly not, as members of our Church, with members of other churches; and children of Methodist parents, with other children, are engaged in them. In one neighbourhood there is a Methodist Sabbath School kept during the summer months, but discontinued during the winter, on account of the bad state of the roads and the distance the children have to come. Great embarrassment is experienced for the want of proper Sabbath School books; the people mostly poor, and unable to buy. Permit us to say, that we think, as a Church, we are not sufficiently alive to the importance of Sabbath Schools, and to the means of affording religious instruction to many, by circulating cheap publications. Other denominations do much in this way, and are certainly in advance of us in their attention to Sabbath Schools—apparently more zealous in their efforts to promote them. Much of our ministerial labour will be lost, until, as a people, we take care of our children. It is a most afflicting thing, to a correct and pious mind, to see groups of children allowed to assemble together in the streets and in the fields to spend the Sabbath in idleness, if not in wickedness.

We are rejoiced to hear of the prosperity of our brethren on other circuits—to hear of the prosperity of the work of God in other places, and by other instruments. In fact, we are firmly of the opinion, that the aim of every minister should be, not so much the building up of a party merely, as the extension of the kingdom of Christ; and that we should rejoice in its extension, whoever may be the instrument.

M O N O.

The poorsettlers within the boundaries of this mission, as in many other parts, are almost wholly indebted to this Society for the ordinances of religion. The work is in an encouraging state, as appears from the following report from the Missionary:—

In compliance with the request of the Missionary Committee, I now give you some account of the Mono Mission. This is a new mission, the roads are very bad indeed, and the people are very poor. But our Lord says, the poor have the Gospel preached unto them; and surely they need it here. Wickedness prevails here to a great extent; but thank God that, during the year, I have seen many sinners slain by the Word of the Lord, and healed by the balm of the blood of Christ; and were it not for Methodism, in this back country, I don't

know what the people would do. No one cares for their souls on this mission. I have 15 appointments, 8 classes, 146 members, 30 admitted on trial during the year, 12 converted to God, and 3 Sabbath Schools. The people here have done all they could for the cause of God. Also, during the year, I have built a parsonage, and have obtained one acre of land to be deeded to our Church; also, sites for two preaching-houses; and these houses are raised, and I hope they will be fully finished during the summer—and the people seem to be anxious to promote the interest of our Church. The societies are all doing well. The blessed Lord has been pouring out his Spirit on them lately. This mission embraces 5 townships. I find that visiting from house to house has a good effect upon the people; and I hope the time will yet come when this mission will not be the least among the missions in western Canada.

ST. VINCENT.

The labours of the Rev. John Neelands have been blessed to the people during the year, and the mission is in an improving condition. We have the following particulars:—

The St. Vincent Mission embraces the townships of St. Vincent and Sydenham—the White village of Owen Sound in the latter township—a part of the townships of Derby and Sullivan, extending about 40 miles south of the said White village, along the Garrafraxa road, leading to Oakville, on Lake Ontario. The gracious Head of the Church has been pleased to visit this mission during the past ecclesiastical year. The last year, we reported 93 Church members; this year, 145; and our preaching appointments are fully doubled in the past year, and an inviting prospect of enlargement. A large majority of our people profess to enjoy the blessing of justification by faith, and, I believe, are growing in grace, and pressing toward the enjoyment of perfect love that casteth out tormenting fear, so that we have much encouragement to trust in the Lord and go forward.

As the Indian Mission of Owen Sound is contiguous, and has been under the superintendance of the St. Vincent's Missionary, he has given the following account of it:—

The Indian Mission at Owen Sound consists of about 53 Church members, located in the village, on the north shore of Big Bay. Many of these poor innocent people are decidedly pious, but they are much exposed to temptation by intoxicating liquors, which their white neighbours are but too ready to furnish them with. The Indians

possess a large tract of fertile soil here. We are much gratified to learn, that a general Council of Chiefs, from various tribes, will convene the present month, to consider the utility of establishing a Manual Labour School on the Indian lands here. Should this be accomplished, and judiciously organized and wisely conducted, it will, we hope, ensure, in a great measure, that much desired object, viz., the christianizing and civilization of these poor suffering wanderers.

The Council of Chiefs spoken of did convene at Saugeeng in the month of June last. A Camp Meeting was first held, and about two hundred chiefs and other Indians pitched tents in the woods. Religious exercises continued six days. The Council began July 1st, and continued four days. Various topics were discussed. One thing is especially worthy of notice. A large tract of country belongs to the Ojebway Indians of Saugeeng and Owen Sound. Their Chiefs proposed to the Council, that all the scattered tribes of the Ojebway nation should collect and become a settled people, and generously offered their territory for the tribes to settle on. The Chiefs of thirteen tribes rose successively, accepting the offer, and returned thanks to their patriotic countrymen in the manner and style of the unpolished citizens of the forest.

BARRIE.

The Barrie Mission is in an improving state. The Rev. Horace Dean thus reports :—

In compliance with the requirement of the Conference, I send you the following as the report of this mission :—The field of labour is extensive—the roads for the most part bad—the settlements scattered and thin. There has been a growing attachment to the means of grace during the past year, and we have been enabled to gather several new congregations, and to form some new classes. We have 23 regular appointments, scattered over 9 townships. In addition to the above, the townships of Sunnidale and Nottawasaga have been visited several times during the course of the past year. The people have done something towards all of our institutions, though the sum may appear small, from the numbers in society and the extent of country embraced in this mission; but it should not be forgotten that the country is comparatively new and *poor*. The amount raised this year is in

advance of any previous year by several pounds. The great Head of the Church has been pleased graciously to pour out his Holy Spirit on this mission during the past year, and the blessed effects are seen in the quickening of the membership. In most of the classes there has been an increase of grace as well as numbers. The whole number of members on the mission is 258, which makes a net increase of 56. There is a number of Sabbath Schools within the bounds of this mission, in connexion with our Church. In conclusion, I would say, that this is an important and not uninteresting field of labour, and will in time take its station among the circuits in the regular work. May the Lord bless this mission more and more!

CARTWRIGHT AND MANVERS.

The Rev. Matthew Connor speaks encouragingly of the state of this mission :—

With respect to temporal matters, I think the mission is as much as twenty per cent. in advance of last year. The bountiful Donor of all our blessings has blessed the people with a more plentiful crop of wheat last harvest than has ever been reaped before in these townships. This "year of plenty" has been mercifully given, as it has enabled the people measurably to discharge debts which have been increasing during several "years of scarcity." The circumstances under which I entered upon the scene of my humble labours were not the most favourable, as there was no expectation of, and therefore no preparation for, a married preacher on the mission; which, together with other things, not necessary to be mentioned, rendered my temporal matters for the year of no secondary consideration. But, through the mercy of God, we have been preserved, and are alive and in health this day.

There has been nothing very encouraging amongst us during the year, yet we humbly trust something has been done to the glory of God. Temperance societies have been raised up and organized; attendance on the public means of grace has been increasing; and in many instances there has been a deeper interest taken in the things which pertain to the advancement of the cause of God. Though some have got tired of the way, and returned to the world, others have been induced to forsake the world and take God for their portion. In the fall of the year, immediately after the fruits of the earth were gathered in, the Lord was graciously pleased to pour out his Spirit upon a certain part of our work, and several precious souls were added to the number of his people; and by the same Divine agency, in other parts, we have had several accessions to our Church, while some respected brethren from other parts have pitched their tents among us.

BROCK.

The Brock Mission appears in a thriving condition. The Rev. Gilbert Miller thus writes:—

I received my appointment at the Brockville Conference, June 14th, 1844. Arrived with my family, July 6th, 246 miles. Found that the preacher in charge the preceding year had been most of his time quite sick, his wife had died; and, through much sickness and other causes, some of the classes had been discontinued, and some of the appointments partially given up. Of 240 members returned on the printed minutes, I could find but 194, many of these living at too great a distance to meet regularly, either in class or at public preaching.

In passing once around this mission, we have to travel through more or less of the following townships; namely, Brock, Thorah, Georgina, and Reach, in the Home District; and Mariposa, Fenelon, Verulam, and Ops, in the Colborne District—making a circuit of more than 200 miles, with 25 regular appointments, and a number of extra meetings. Four additional classes have been formed, and several of the former classes have been enlarged during the present year: so that notwithstanding deaths, removals, withdrawals and expulsions, we have an increase above the number found at the commencement of this year of 17 members. We have peace in all our borders.

Our Missionary Meetings, four in number, were well attended and well supported by the people, but not by one individual member of the deputation; and had it not been for the providential services of our good brother, Rev. R. Darlington, from the Peterboro' Circuit, and the long, kind, patient forbearance of our respected friends on the mission, a few small, dark coloured collections would have been the only result. But, through the kind providence of God, our temporal wants have been well supplied—our finances have much improved—our borders have been enlarged—our labours and influence increased. The members and friends of Methodism, on the eastern parts of the mission, have requested the labour of a third preacher for the present year. The labour is considered quite too much for two preachers. The health of my respected colleague, Br. Dayman, failed in March last, and I was left alone in my labour until Conference. Our Missionary collections, remitted to the general treasurer, amounted to nearly £15. Our Contingent and Superannuated collections were also good. A great majority of the people through these comparatively new townships are from Europe, and some considerable efforts have been made to sow the seed of discord and break their connexion with our Conference. Yet these efforts have failed, and our members and friends appear more determined than ever to maintain the unity of Methodism in connexion with the Canada Conference.

The Temperance Cause has not been forgotten. Several of the former societies have been reorganized and enlarged; several new

ones have been formed, embracing between 300 and 400 members. In some neighbourhoods, opposition has been awakened, aroused, met, and overcome. In other places, this spirit of opposition rather preponderates, and dram-drinking and drunkenness continue to be encouraged and supported, even by professing christians.

ASPHODEL.

The Superintendent of this mission, the Rev. Wm. Young, has laboured under severe indisposition during a part of the year. Still the mission has prospered. A new Church has been erected, and another is nearly finished. All the connexional funds have been increasingly supported; and several have been converted from the error of their ways. The number of members is 268. There are 2 Sunday Schools, 11 teachers, 60 scholars, and 102 books in library.

MARMORA.

The Rev. John Williams has travelled this mission the last year. The mission is enlarging and improving. Its separation from the Sidney Circuit is doubtless a benefit. The following report is furnished:—

In looking over the Missionary Report of last year, I observe that this mission was not reported. Whatever was the cause of this omission I am not able to assign, but certainly it was a duty obligatory on my predecessor to make some returns, especially as it was the first year after the mission had been detached from the Sidney Circuit, and had received the labours of a missionary *exclusively*. By this it was brought into rather a new relation in our Missionary department.

This mission embraces the townships of Madoc and Marmora. It is situated north of the Sidney Circuit, and lies between the Asphodel and Sheffield Missions; yet there is a great extent of woods, almost impenetrable, between the settlements visited by the Asphodel and Sheffield Missionaries and those of this mission, so that an interchange in our labours would be quite impracticable. And although the preachers from Sidney attended to these townships for several years, it was not without making great sacrifice. Not only had they to pass through a great extent of wilderness, but also had to encounter several extremely bad bridges, bogs, and mud-holes. Several times the preachers, while on their way to these back appointments, have fallen into these—shall I call them “sloughs of despond;” and as Bunyan says of “Mr. Pliable,” they would often get out the wrong side of

the slough, and return home without filling the appointments. This was especially the case in the spring and fall of the year. These unavoidable disappointments were greatly felt by the people, and they therefore presented a petition, two years ago, to the Bay of Quinte District Meeting, requesting to be set off as a distinct mission, and to have a young preacher to reside among them. In accordance with the desire of the people, the Rev. Michael Fawcett was appointed, who laboured faithfully, and to some degree successfully, during the year. Through his instrumentality many were added to the Church, especially young persons. I wish I could say that they have all kept faithful—it is not the case. Several in a few weeks were carried by their youthful feelings after the fascinating allurements of the world. Thus the good seed which had been sown was soon choked. The first quarter after my arrival on the mission I might call a “pruning season.” It was thought more beneficial to cut off the rotten branches than permit them to affect the whole tree. The remaining part of the year things went on more prosperously; yet, however, during the whole of the past winter, the members were exposed to very powerful temptations, arising chiefly from the great number of lumber-men employed in these townships; and it is but too common for such characters to introduce their Sabbath-breaking and drinking usages. Notwithstanding these great trials and oppositions, the members generally have been united. They feel happy and contented in the Church of their choice, and they are determined to co-operate, by every means in their power, for the extension of the blessed and heaven-born principles of Methodism. In the township of Madoc I have six appointments in two weeks; in Marmora four; and in Rawdon one monthly appointment. There are 11 appointments in all. We have six classes, which are mostly led by the preacher. The friends of missions will understand that our missionaries are *regular class-leaders*. Every Sabbath that I have been on this mission I have met two classes as regularly as I have preached, and generally on the week-day. Where Methodism is in its infancy, we find great difficulty in procuring suitable leaders. But to return. We have 107 members. Our congregations, both on Sabbath and week-day, have been regular and good. We have no churches erected on the mission as yet. Our meetings are held chiefly in school-houses, and some two or three in private houses. The financial state of the mission is quite encouraging. This year the people have contributed as follows:—£7 13s. 2½d. table expenses; £8 6s. quarterage; for moving expenses £2 9s. 6d.; for horse-shoeing £0 14s. 6d.; and towards the Superannuated Fund 9s. 4d.; and Contingent Fund 6s. 2d.; so that the aggregate raised, including everything, for the past year, is £19 18s. 8½d. Considering the circumstances of the people, they have done nobly for the support of Methodism. Any person visiting the township of Marmora would wonder how the people procured any kind of support. The land is exceedingly stony. Some of the great ledges of rocks have quite a majestic appearance, and are enough to inspire the mind with emo-

tions of sublimity. The quality of the land in Madoc is quite superior to that of Marmora, and, no doubt, in a little time will become a flourishing township. Settlers are penetrating into the township of Elziver, which lies east of Madoc. There are ten or twelve families gone in, and are complaining for the want of means of grace. They are very importunate in soliciting our sympathy. I should have complied with their wishes; but most unfortunately, when the snow was going off this spring, it carried away the bridge which had been constructed across "Black River," thus intercepting the Elziver road; and as I had not courage to swim the river, was compelled to relinquish the hope of visiting them for that time. I am informed that most of the land in Elziver is of an excellent quality; if this be true, it will not remain long unoccupied. Brother Wm. Harrison, one of our Local Preachers from Sidney, has located in this new township. I was told that he calls occasional meetings, administering to the few inhabitants the Word of Life, pointing them, in their present lonely situation, to Jesus, the sinner's friend. May the Lord bless brother Harrison and his family in their solitary retreat!

There are three Sabbath Schools on this mission, which are superintended and taught by members of our Church. One in Marmora has been in operation nine or ten years. Much credit is due to brother Joseph Leggett, and to brother H. Jones, for their unwearied diligence in keeping this school so long in operation. It has about 30 scholars. The other two schools referred to have been organized only a short time. Between the two, they may have 40 or 50 scholars.

In regard to the future prospects of this mission, I conceive that they are promising. Madoc is growing fast, and will soon be the centre of the mission, as the labour will extend west into Marmora, which is the poorest part of the mission, and east into Elziver; thus forming a compact circuit for one man,—and in proportion as the roads improve, the work will be less laborious.

WOLF ISLAND.

This island certainly needs the faithful services of ministers of the Gospel, as will appear from the following account from the Rev. Daniel Wright:—

Wolf Island Mission embraces the township of Wolf Island, opposite the town of Kingston, and four miles distant; the population of which is about 1200 persons, or 250 families. There are, in all, nine regular and occasional preaching places—the congregations in general small, which may arise in part from the diversity of opinions entertained by the people on the subject of religion, and in part from the circumstances of the people. Some follow sailing, and others lumbering, which, with their intercourse with strangers, by reason of almost constant travelling across the island, prove detrimental to the

progress of religion and to the improvement of the morals of the inhabitants.

This mission differs in some of its leading and characteristic features from the missions in this Province generally, inasmuch as the destitution thereon, strikingly apparent, is rather voluntary than necessary. On other missions, the spiritual and moral destitution is very deeply lamented by large numbers of the settlers, whilst in this instance, with a few honourable exceptions, the people glory in their shame, and virtually hold forth a premium for the greatest proficient in profaneness and irreligion, in its varied forms. In the next place, on other missions, the unanimous cry is—Send us the Gospel, and no matter by whom; but send us the Word of Life, and we will be thankful. On this mission, sectarian and party feeling has disturbed the peace of society, and retarded the progress of religion. During the past year, the seeds of discord were, in my opinion, sown by one preacher or more of Episcopal Methodists in Canada—some of the fruits of which have already been seen and lamented by the most judicious and worthy on both sides of the question.

We have 12 members in Society, and although impediments lie in the way of the higher state of improvement at which we should aim, yet a gradual improvement is being made in the morals of the people, and especially the principles of Total Abstinence have gained strength the past year. The encouragement afforded us in our difficult yet important work, by some respectable people on Garden Island, was not a little. Capt. Cameron, the proprietor of the Island, Messrs. Calvin, Black, and Charles, though not members of our Church, were amongst the most liberal supporters of the missionary work on Wolf Island, during the year ending June 3rd, 1845. In all, there are nine preaching places; the congregations in general small. We have one Sabbath School, organized in April, which is prospering, and will, we trust, be a blessing to the youth of the isle.

AMHERST ISLAND.

The state of this mission will be learned from the report of the Rev. Cyrus R. Allison:—

It is well known that this mission has “no certain abiding place.” It has sometimes belonged to the Waterloo, and sometimes to the Bath Circuit; and sometimes it has been an independent mission. For the two last years, it has been connected with the Bath Circuit, and had the labours of one of the preachers every second Sabbath, with a few appointments on week days, and occasional local preaching. There have been a few additions to the Society; but from the reflux of emigration, the number of members will decrease annually. The principal reason for the inhabitants leaving the island, as soon as they can purchase elsewhere, is, the impossibility of obtaining any other title than a lease for a few years of the land. But, notwithstanding

there are many discouragements connected with this part of our work, it will not do to give up this people and let them struggle alone. They are some of the most stable and worthy part of our population, and do all they can to assist in all our institutions.

In conclusion, I am sorry to say that the island has been greatly injured by the number of grog-shops which are "licensed to sell" upon it. The justices of the peace saw fit, in their wisdom, (to accommodate the travelling public) to authorise *four* (I think) of these holes of *strife, crime, and death!* Several persons have died this year from intemperance.

G A N A N O Q U E.

Through the zealous exertions of the Rev. Vincent B. Howard, the debt on Gananoque Chapel has been greatly reduced. The cause appears to be prospering. He thus writes:—

This part of our work, for many years, has laboured under peculiar embarrassments, from the fact, that it has been but a broken limb of other circuits, and very poorly attended to,—some of the most important neighbourhoods being left altogether without the ministration of the Word. While such a state of things continued, prosperity could not be expected; but a brighter day was dawning, when our much esteemed Br. Miles was sent to labour here. Through his instrumentality much good has been effected. When I commenced my labours in 1844, I found six regular preaching-places, two Sabbath Schools, four Classes, two Leaders, and three Stewards, which were the only official members we had on the Circuit; one Chapel, involved in a debt of more than £200. We have succeeded in establishing two new preaching-places; in forming three new Sabbath Schools—one in the village of Gananoque, with about 60 scholars; in forming one new Class, and appointing two new Leaders, and three Circuit Stewards, and reducing the debt on our Chapel nearly one-half. We have had about 20 conversions during the year. Taking into consideration the funds we have raised for different purposes, we have realized from the mission about £50 more than were taken up last year. On the whole, I consider that this mission bids fair to be one of the most interesting and important fields of our labour.

B U C K I N G H A M.

The Missionary appointed to this part of the Ottawa country, thus reports:—

This mission comprehends five townships, and a large seigniory of about 18 miles in length, known as the Papineau Seigniory, or La Petite Nation; the townships are Herington, Augmentation, Lochaber,

Buckingham, and Cumberland on the south side of the Ottawa River, in Canada West. There are at present ten regular appointments, which are attended once in two weeks, and two occasionally attended. From the localities of the places, and the general state of the roads throughout the year, this mission is rendered rather a hard field of labour. There is another circumstance connected with the mission which renders it very laborious to the missionary, viz. : at only seven of the twelve appointments have we societies; and on the mission there have only been, during the year, three leaders; so that for the two years last past we have known little of local help. However, we have not laboured in vain,—the great Head of the Church has been with us. At several places, during the winter, we held Protracted Meetings, but, in consequence of a want of praying labourers, we could not continue our meetings long. Believers were built up, and encouraged to labour on in the cause of our God. At one of our little meetings, during its continuance, eight stood up and spoke of the good they had received, only one of which joined in Church fellowship with us; the others, being members of other churches, wished to remain in the church of their choice. Though our number is considerably less this year than last, it is chiefly owing to removals.

There is one thing connected with this mission for which our Missionary Society deserves great credit—that is, it pays a missionary for preaching regularly once in two weeks to several congregations chiefly composed of members of other churches—in fact some of them entirely so. During the year the friends have put up a parsonage which does them great credit, considering their circumscribed means; and, we presume, were the same efforts made by preachers and people on the circuits throughout the connexion as have been made on this mission, every circuit would have a parsonage; for when placed in juxtaposition with older circuits, it is only seen what might be accomplished were corresponding efforts made.

G L E N G A R R Y.

The Committee has received no report from the Gleggarry mission, situate at the eastern extremity of Canada west.

P E M B R O K E.

The members in society are 68. But no report of the mission has reached the Committee.

S T. A N D R E W S.

Some poor settlements on the St. Andrews Circuit are assisted by the Society; but the Superintendent preacher has furnished no report.

TY E N D E N A G A.

The Society has appropriated some yearly assistance to this township; but the Superintendant of Sidney Circuit has not favoured the Committee with the state of the mission.

The Committee have now given the Society and the public all the information which they have received of the religious condition of the missions under their care and responsibility.

Looking over the large field cultivated, the Committee cannot help feeling that a great amount of labour is accomplished by the moderate means placed at their disposal.

The field, however, can be greatly enlarged. There are doors of usefulness opening yearly in the new parts of the Province, which are settling on by the younger class of the colonial population, and the adventurous and industrious emigrant from the islands of the three kingdoms. There are also openings among the native tribes which are not yet occupied by Christian missionaries.

Let all then do their duty: let every one, according to the ability which God hath given him, cheerfully restore to the Lord what his cause requires for its extension and support; adopting at the same time, in the spirit of faith and prayer, the inspired language of the Psalmist, "Gird thy sword upon thy thigh, O most Mighty, with glory and majesty: And in thy majesty ride prosperously, because of truth and meekness and righteousness." So shall the obstacles which hostile influences now oppose to the progress of the pure Gospel be all surmounted; and the Divine Saviour, by extending his kingdom in all lands, with an increased rapidity proportionate to the efforts by which it has been resisted, "shall make the wrath of man to praise Him, and the remainder of wrath shall he restrain."

REVISED CONSTITUTION
OF THE
Wesleyan-Methodist Missionary Society in Canada.

*As adopted at the Annual Meeting, held in St. Catharines, on the
9th June, 1845.*

ARTICLE I.—This Institution shall be designated the *Wesleyan-Methodist Missionary Society in Canada*.

II.—The object of this Society is to excite and combine, in a plan more systematic and efficient than has been heretofore accomplished, the exertions of the societies and congregations (and others who are friends to the conversion of the heathen and the extension of the Gospel) in the support and enlargement of the Indian and Domestic Missions which are carried on under the sanction and direction of the Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Canada.

III.—Every person subscribing and paying, annually, the sum of one pound or upwards, and every benefactor presenting a donation of ten pounds and upwards, shall be deemed a member of this Society, and entitled, as such, to a General Annual Report.

IV.—All Methodist Missionary Societies which have already been formed, or which may be formed, for the several Districts in the Province into which the Methodist Connexion is divided, shall be entitled "Auxiliary Methodist Missionary Societies" for the Districts in which they have been, or may be, formed. All Methodist Missionary Societies already formed, or hereafter to be formed, in the particular *circuits* of any district, shall be entitled "Branch Methodist Missionary Societies" for the circuit in which they are or shall be established. And Sabbath School and Juvenile Christmas offerings are also earnestly recommended, where exertions of that nature are likely to be advantageous.

V.—The Chairman of each District shall be, ex-officio, Secretary and Treasurer of the Auxiliary Society of his District: and every Superintendent of a Circuit shall, by virtue of his office, be Secretary and Treasurer of the Branch Societies of the Circuit over which he presides.

VI.—The money raised in any Circuit for the Methodist Missions by Branch Societies, or other local associations, and all other moneys, in whatever way collected for the same object, shall be regularly paid once every half-year, or oftener, into the hands of the Treasurer of the Auxiliary Society for the District in which the said Circuit is situated, with the deduction only of such sums as may have been disbursed for the incidental and local expenses of the Branch Society. And the Treasurer of every District Society shall remit to the Treasurer of the General Society in Toronto, semi-annually, or oftener, all sums so received by him from the various Circuits in his District, deducting only therefrom the necessary incidental expenses incurred by the Auxiliary Society.

VII.—The Secretaries of every Branch Society, or other local association, shall forward, annually, to the Secretary of the Auxiliary Society of their District, a list of all the Benefactors and Subscribers during the preceding twelve months, with an account of their respective contributions. And the

Secretaries of every District Auxiliary Society shall also forward annually to the Secretary of the General Society in Toronto, a similar list of all the subscribers and benefactors in all the Circuits of their Districts, an abstract of the accounts of the Auxiliary Society, showing its gross receipts, its local payments, and its remittance to the General Treasurer.

VIII.—All benefactors of ten pounds and upwards, and all subscribers of one pound and upwards, annually, to any of the Auxiliaries or Branch Societies in connexion with this Institution, shall be deemed, in right of such benefaction or subscription, members of the General Society.

IX.—All persons who collect to the amount of three pounds and upwards, annually, for this Institution, or for any of the Auxiliaries, Branches, or Associations, shall also be members of the General Society, and entitled to receive a supply of each Annual Report.

X.—An annual public meeting of the members and friends of this Society, connected with such religious service as may be deemed expedient, shall be held at the place of the Session of the Conference, on the first Monday after the meeting of the Conference, at the hour of half-past six o'clock, P.M. At this annual meeting the officers of the Society shall be appointed.

XI.—A General Committee shall be annually appointed by the Conference, to whom shall be intrusted (in the intervals of the annual assemblies of that body) the superintendence of the collection and disbursements of all moneys received for the Missions which are now, or may hereafter be carried on under its sanction, and by the Ministers in connexion with it. The Committee shall consist of the President and Secretary of the Conference for the time being, and of twelve others—seven of whom, at least, shall be lay gentlemen, members of the Methodist Church in or near Toronto. At any meeting of the Committee, seven shall be a quorum for the transaction of business.

XII.—The Conference, at each of its annual meetings, shall appoint a Committee, consisting of the President and Secretary of the Conference, the Chairmen of Districts, and five others, whose duty it shall be to audit all the accounts of contingent expenditures during the previous year, and recommend (as far as may be necessary) the appropriations for the support of the missions during the ensuing year.

XIII.—The Chairman of Districts shall have authority to draw upon the Treasurer quarterly for any sums, within the amount specified, which the Missionary Committee shall judge necessary for the support of the mission and mission schools under their care. The chairmen shall require regular quarterly communications to be made by each of the Missionaries on their respective Districts to the Corresponding Secretary of the Society, giving information of the state and prospects of the several missions in which they are employed.

XIV.—It shall be the duty of the General Missionary Committee to furnish the General Treasurer of this Society with a schedule setting forth the number of missions and mission schools, the place of location, and the amount appropriated for their support respectively, and the sum total of appropriation for the current year.

XV.—This Constitution shall not be altered but by a general meeting of the Society, on the recommendation of the Conference and Committee.
