

REPORT OF SESSION.

It is with feelings of thankfulness to the Giver of all good that the Session report to the congregation at the close of another year.

The first six months was uneventful, the work being carried steadily on in the various organizations. In July the congregation was called to enter on one of those critical stages which is the experience at some time or other of almost every church. The General Assembly having chosen our Pastor to be Secretary of the Foreign Mission Committee of the Western Section, the duties of which required him to give up the pastorate, the congregation with great regret gave consent to the call, which terminated a relationship of over 7½ years of the most happy and prosperous kind. We trust that the loss we have sustained will be lasting gain to the whole church.

ICH

The effect of Mr. MacKay's withdrawal from the pastorate of our church has been somewhat lightened by his continuing among us as a member, and by acting as Moderator of Session during the vacancy.

The congregation having heard a number of ministers decided to extend a call to the Rev. Robt. Johnston, of Lindsay. We trust that, whatever the result may be the guidance of the Holy Spirit will be ours and that the Harvester of souls will yet gather in many from this corner of the great field.

We desire to bring before the members of the congregation the necessity of an addition being made to the Session at an early date, in consequence of the resignation of Mr. J. B. Harris, and the continued absence from the city of Mr. James Stewart as well as the increasing membership of the church.

The congregation have lost the valuable and efficient services of Miss Lawson, organist and choir leader of the church, on account of her removal to the United States. In order to secure the services of a successor to her such as the congregation should have to teach and conduct the psalmody of the church, the Session recommends that the salary be increased to \$450 per annum.

It is worthy of note that an honored worker in this congregation, Mr. M. Swartout, has devoted himself entirely to the work of the Master, and is now laboring in British Columbia. May blessing attend his work, as well as of those of our number now in the toreign field, in all nine persons.

The work in the Sunday School continues to be hampered by the inadequacy of the accommodation, notwithstanding the effort made to use all available space. It is hoped that the congregation at no distant date, will see their way clear to make such improvements in the building as will satisfy the urgency of the case.

The various other branches of church work are heartily commended to the interest and support of the whole congregation. May God's favor be ours still, so that we may become more worthy co-workers with him as the days of our probation draw to a close. A

MANAGERS' REPORT.

The Board of Managers in presenting this their Fourteenth Annual Report and Financial Statement desire to congratulate the congregation on the measure of success which has this year attended their efforts notwithstanding the commercial depression which has been and still continues. They have pleasure in reporting that the ordinary revenue from envelopes and open collections amount to \$5,719.31.

They regret however to report that the congregation is not adopting the envelope system as freely as they should, the contributors by envelope having decreased in number from 275 to 254 during the past year, sustaining a loss of \$170.00 while the open collections have only increased \$90.00, thereby causing a falling off in the aggregate amount of about \$80.00. The rate per sabbath for the year 1892, being only about \$110.00 as against \$111.50 per sabbath for the year 1891.

TACK-

The Board would remind the Congregation that before incurring turther liability it is necessary that there should be a sufficient increase in the contributions to warrant such further expenditure. The outstanding liabilities are:—

and would strongly recommend that an earnest attempt be made to reduce the mortgage and pay off the floating debt. It is now six years since the present building was erected and which will soon be in need of repairs, but before undertaking such an expenditure the said liability should be reduced.

Your Board as in former years earnestly recommends all members and adherents to reconsider their weekly offerings with a view

to a general increase and in order to secure uniformity, beg to suggest to the congregation the desirability of increasing their contributions 10%.

The Board desire to explain that there is a loss of revenue from their inability to accommodate those applying for sittings and if the prosperity of the congregation is to be maintained, pew holders will require to make room for strangers and those who do not attend regularly, should not take offence if their sittings are occupied.

Your Board in accordance with the instructions given them at the last annual meeting, beg leave to report, that they have done the neccessary excavation in the basement for the preservation of the church property.

It is my duty at the end of another year to report progress in Sunday school work, as the great aim is the gathering in of the young to Christ's kingdom, so the weighty and all-important question meets us—"What has been the result of our work during the year now closed?" In presenting our seventh annual report we desire to give grateful praise to Him in whose service we have been privileged to engage, for the measure of success which has crowned our efforts.

The increase in our membership from 41 to 79 has been due, largely, to the visiting of the congregation by the members. We regret that out of this large increase so few have taken any active interest in the Society. The average attendance has been 22 members and 8 visitors. The annual membership fee is now only 25 cents.

The work for the Indians in the North-West was entered into with the usual vigor. Goods to the value of \$110 were prepared, and \$25 in cash was paid the Supply Committee. The Society gave two "at homes"; at the first a collection was taken for the North-West clothing fund, and at the second the goods which had been prepared were exhibited. At this latter meeting, the Society presented Mrs. Thos. Bryce with a life membership certificate and address in appreciation of her earnest and untiring services.

In June, the Society was addressed by Mrs. Nicoll, wife of our missionary to Mistawasis Reserve in the N.W., but ere two months had passed she was called to serve in the Master's kingdom above.

In October, Mr. Nicoll gave a very interesting and instructive address on his work among the Indians, thus our sympathy and prayers have been especially directed to this field.

In October the annual Thank Offering service was held, the meeting was addressed by Mrs. Frost, of the China Inland Mission, and \$80.00 was offered in thanksgiving to the Giver of all good.

Through the wreck of the S.S. "Roumania," the supplies for the schools and hospitals in India were lost, this Society contributed \$5 worth of goods towards renewing the supply.

In closing this report, our earnest prayer is that God who has blessed our feeble efforts for the advancement of His kingdom may stir up our hearts to fuller consecration and greater liberality, and that this year may be one of rich spiritual blessing, both to our own Society and to the work at home and abroad.

The Missionary in charge of the cluster of preaching stations in south-eastern Assiniboia known to us as the "Winlaw Mission" has been doing faithful and efficient service, as his own letters and those of Dr. Robertson, both of which have been read to the congregation, will abundantly show. This is a very important work and one which is very much appreciated in that sparsely settled district, and requires every encouragement at your hands. 
