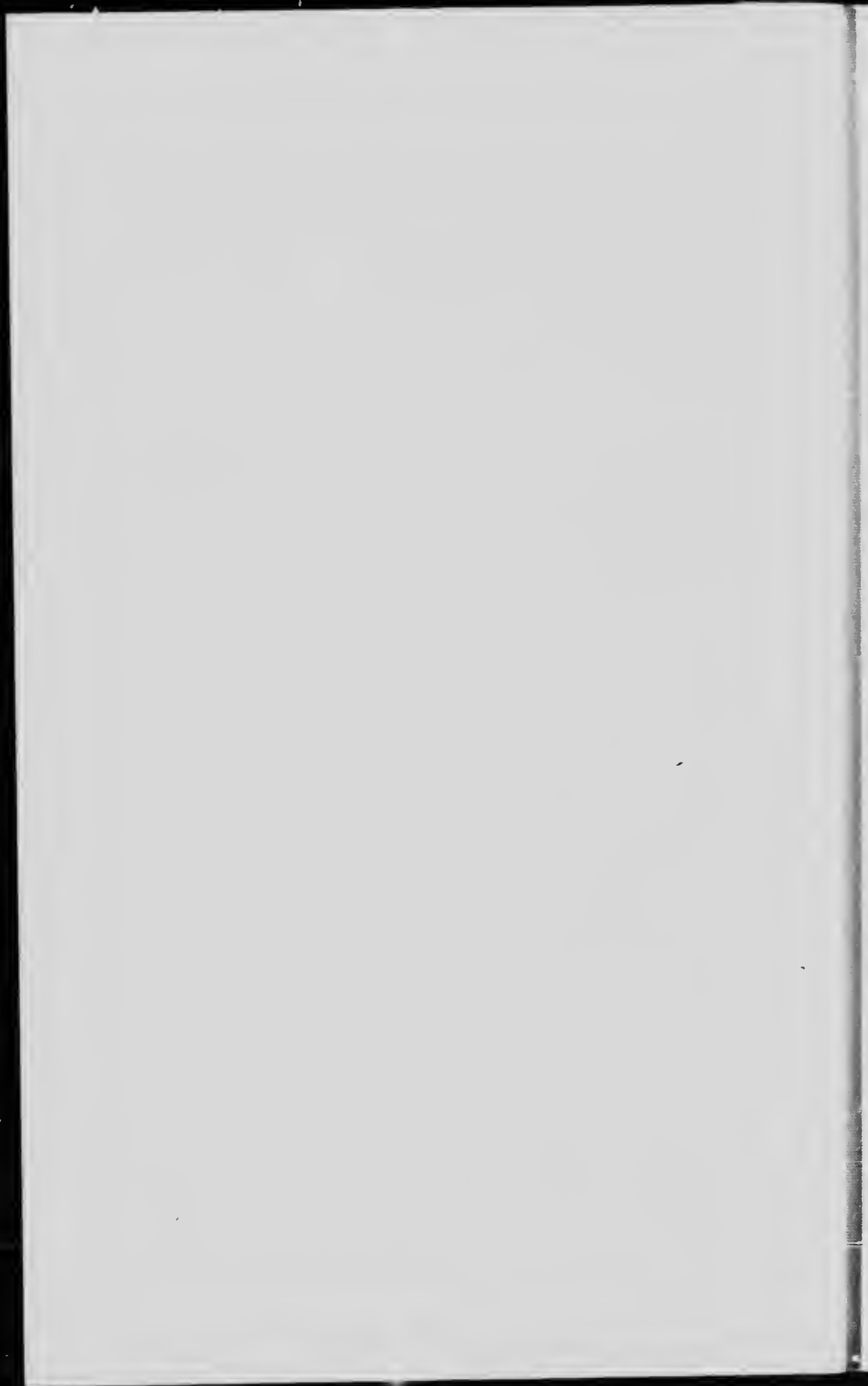
MICROCOPY RESOLUTION TEST CHART

PREFACE.

L'inventaire des ouvrages et journaux de langue anglaise publiés dans la Province de Québec comporte la même physionomie que celui de langue française paru en 1905, avec cette différence toutefois que le nombre des volumes inventoriés présentement n'est pas tout à fait aussi considérable. Cependant il est certain qu'il en a été imprimé plus en anglais qu'en français. La lacune aurait pu être comblée, si nous n'avions pas systématiquement élagué une foule de ces petites brochures ou plaquettes sans valeur intrinsèque. A l'instar de ce qui a été fait pour la partie française, nous avons apporté un soin tout particulier à donner une liste aussi complète que possible des livres et brochures imprimés durant la période des incunables, c'est-à-dire depuis 1764 jusqu'à 1820 inclusivement. Nous nous déclarons satisfait du résultat. Cette liste comprend 128 numéros, lesquels ajoutés aux 142 de l'inventaire français, nous fournissent un chiffre total de 270 incunables. D'autres bibliographes pourront en découvrir quelques autres, mais nous est avis qu'il leur faudra y mettre beaucoup de bonne volonté.

On remarquera, sans doute, que nous avons inséré les travaux des membres de la Société Royale du Canada qui ont élu domicile dans la Province de Québec, ainsi que les conférences imprimées dans les Mémoires de la Société Littéraire et Historique de Québec. Cette mention était due à ces écrivains sérieux qui contribuent à enrichir nos archives nationales au moyen d'œuvres de haute portée scientifique, littéraire et historique, sachant d'avance que la publicité de ces travaux ne dépassera guère le volume des Mémoires de la société à laquelle ils appartiennent.

Cet inventaire renferme une liste de plus de 2.900 livres et brochures dont la presque totalité a vu le jour à Montréal et à Québec. Montréal a produit deux fois plus que Québec. Les autres ouvrages se répartissent entre Sherbrooke, Trois-Rivières, Stanstead et Lévis. D'autres, écrits par des Canadiens de la

Province de Québec, ont été imprimés à Londres, à New-York, à Toronto, et dans d'autres villes étrangères. Voici de reste leur classification :

Le reste, au nombre de 15 environ, nous vient d'un peu partout.

Au cours de la période de 1764 à 1820, la littérature anglaise marche un peu de front avec la littérature française. On n'y rencontre aucun ouvrage de quelque importance, si ce n'est peut-être, en 1815, l'Histoire du Canada de Smith, vertement critiquée en 1827 par l'abbé Maguire, chapelain des Ursulines de Québec. A part cette histoire, qui n'est pas sans mérite, et quelques brochures de Robert Christie sur les administrations des gouverneurs Prevost, Craig, Drummond et Sherbrooke, on ne rencontre que des catéchismes, des sermons prononcés par des ministres du culte protestant, des procès rapportés *in extenso*, des ordonnances. C'est encore l'enfance de la littérature coïncidant avec l'enfance de l'imprimerie.

Cette période, si peu fertile, ne devait pas durer. Bientôt des revues se fondent et vivent à l'aide d'une collaboration assidue et très soignée. C'est, en 1823, le *Canadian Magazine and Literary Repository*, qui fournit, après deux années d'existence, quatre gros volumes du plus haut intérêt. C'est, en 1824, le *Canadian Review and Literary and Historical Journal*, qui, dans le même espace de temps, nous apporte aussi quatre volumes de 250 pages chacun. C'est, en 1832, le *Museum*, autre revue littéraire, publiée à Montréal comme les deux précédentes, qui se popularise dès la première heure à l'aide de la collaboration si intelligente de Mary Graddon. C'est enfin, en 1838, le *Literary Garland*, qui vécut quatorze ans sous l'habile administration de John Gibson. Cette dernière

revue devait dépasser les autres par l'abondance des matières et le talent des écrivains. Tout un essaim de littérateurs, hommes et femmes, s'y sont donné rendez-vous, pour en faire le grand organe de la littérature anglaise. C'étaient W. Spink, Hugh E. Montgomerie, E. T. Fletcher, Fennings Taylor, Andrew Robertson, Miss Mullins, devenue plus tard Madame Leprohon, Miss Foster, Madame Cushing, Madame Cheney, et combien d'autres ?

Ce beau mouvement littéraire n'a pas été surpassé. Et l'on s'en fera une idée encore plus juste en signalant les personnes qui y prirent la part la plus large. Qui ne connaît J. C. Fisher, auteur de l'inscription latine que l'on trouve gravée sur le monument dédié à Wolfe et à Montcalm, Newton Bosworth, auteur de *Picture of Montreal*, David Chisholm, Adam Kidd, W. F. Hawley, Alfred Hawkins, A. W. Cochran, Robert Abraham, David Wylie, Henry Taylor, M. E. Sawtell, Adam Thom, J. G. Ward, John Fleming, et enfin l'historien Robert Christie. L'histoire du Canada de Christie, publiée entre les années 1848 et 1855, est l'œuvre capitale de cette époque; de même que l'Histoire de Garneau qui fut sa contemporaine, elle mit au grand jour, sans avoir recours à l'appel aux préjugés, l'œuvre des politiques anglais depuis 1760 jusqu'à l'Union des provinces.

A partir de 1850, le mouvement littéraire semble décroître dans une certaine mesure. Cependant des revues se fondent, mais soit qu'elles durent peu, ou que les écrivains fassent défaut, il est facile de constater la pénurie dans tous les genres. Il n'y a que les sermons qui semblent avoir quelque vogue. On en imprime à répétition. Le fait est que si on réunissait tous ceux qui furent imprimés alors, on en ferait une jolie collection. Nous en avons inventorié plus de cent, il en reste, bien certainement, dont les auteurs nous sont inconnus.

Les auteurs les plus en vue durant la période décennale de 1850 à 1860, méritent cependant d'être connus: Sheridan Hogan, Charles Heavysege, Charles Roger, A. L. Spedon, Ebenezer Clemo, Augusta Baldwin, le Révérend J. Douglas Borthwick, le Révérend Wilkes, Dunbar Ross, et Jas. William Dawson. Il en est parmi ceux-ci qui n'étaient qu'au début de leur carrière littéraire, et dont la réputation devait grandir avec le temps.

De 1860 à 1870, le nombre des écrivains augmente; les productions de plusieurs, quelles que méritoires qu'elles soient, n'ont immortalisé aucun d'eux. Les noms les plus connus sont ceux de Thomas D'Arcy McGee, de Madame Leprohon, de C. Heavysege, de Henry J. Morgan, de J. G. Ascher, et parmi les

savants, J. W. Dawson, Sandford Fleming, Thomas Sterry Hunt, W. E. Logan, hommes vraiment distingués, et dont les œuvres vivront longtemps après eux. Sir Sandford Fleming est le seul survivant de cette époque déjà lointaine.

Au cours des vingt années qui suivirent, c'est-à-dire de 1870 à 1890, les mêmes noms reviennent sur la scène, accompagnés de plusieurs autres non moins marquants. Extrayons de la foule les suivants: John Reade, John Lespérance, Robert Sellar, W. D. Lighthall, C. Thomas, J. M. Lemoine, le Dr. Drummond, George Stewart, J. Croil, J. Fraser, le Dr. J. M. Harper, S. E. Dawson, le Révérend John Campbell, A. C. R. Selwyn, les professeurs Bovey et Penhallow, le Dr. Douglas, A. Sandham, H. H. Miles, Geo. T. Lanigan, le Dr. W. J. Anderson.

Enfin de 1890 à 1906 la littérature, l'histoire et les sciences atteignent un niveau plus élevé. Dans les sciences naturelles, le progrès est encore plus sensible. Les professeurs de l'Université McGill sont à la tête du mouvement ascensionnel. Les Dawson, avec Sir William à leur tête, entassent écrits sur écrits dans les revues scientifiques, et se font une réputation universelle. L'histoire du Canada, surtout relative à la ville de Québec, est dignement représentée par le grand ouvrage de Doughty et Parmelee. Des monographies de grande valeur apparaissent, signées par W. Wood, W. D. Lighthall, F. C. Wurtele, Sir James Lemoine, S. E. Dawson, W. McLennan, le Dr. Harper, G. E. Hart, E. T. D. Chambers. La poésie s'honore des noms de George Murray et du Dr. Drummond; la numismatique est étudiée dans tous ses détails par R. W. McLachlan. Enfin l'élan est général, et s'il continue ainsi, nous pouvons espérer que la littérature anglaise, dans notre Province, marchera de front avec celle des autres provinces, surtout avec celle d'Ontario où des travailleurs sérieux ne ménagent aucun effort pour arriver au premier rang.

* * *

L'inventaire des journaux et revues comprend 681 numéros. Nous en avons inventorié 807 pour les journaux français. Cette différence, assez notable, s'explique par le fait que peu de journaux anglais ont vu le jour en dehors de Montréal, de Québec et d'Ottawa. Ce chiffre ne dépasse pas 25, tandis que 223 journaux français furent publiés dans nos petites villes et même dans certains villages de la province. Nous répèterons ici ce que nous

avons écrit en 1905 au sujet des journaux et revues publiés en langue française: "Malgré tout le soin apporté à ce travail, nous ne nous flattons pas d'avoir accompli une œuvre parfaite, étant donné le fait que beaucoup de journaux n'ont eu qu'une vie éphémère, et que, dans bien des cas, il n'en est rien resté, pas même le souvenir dans les lieux où ils paraissaient." Quoi qu'il en soit, nous croyons que notre *Inventaire* sera utile, même avec ses imperfections.

II., Cap. 1, in that case made and provided. *Quebec: Printed by Brown & Gilmore.* 46 p.

(Cet opuscule fut réimprimé à New York, en 1768, par John Holt. On remarquera sans doute la longueur du titre, qui est hors de proportion pour une brochure d'aussi courte haleine. Quelques bibliophiles prétendent qu'il y eut une brochure antérieure à celle-ci; elle aurait été publiée en 1765, avant même le *Catéchisme du Diocèse de Sens*. C'est un in-quarto de 36 pages intitulé: *Presentment of the Grand Juries, their workshop's strictures thereon, and the Grand Juries remarks on these strictures*. M. le Dr Neilson nous assure l'avoir en sa possession, et croit savoir, d'après les livres de compte qui lui sont parvenus de Brown & Gilmore, par l'intermédiaire des Neilson, ses ancêtres, qu'elle parut quatre ou cinq mois avant le *Catéchisme*. Il existe une autre brochure intitulée: *Motives for a Subscription towards the Relief of the Sufferers at Montreal, in Canada, by a dreadful fire on the 18th of May, 1765, in which 108 houses were destroyed, etc.*, 18 mo. 76 pp. *Montreal, 1765*. Bien qu'à première vue, celle-ci semble avoir vu le jour à Montréal, cependant il n'en est rien, car il n'y avait pas encore d'imprimerie à Montréal, en 1765.)

Après la disparition de Brown, en 1789, Samuel Neilson continua d'imprimer l'almanach, mais il ne le reprit qu'en 1791 et l'imprima aussi en 1792. Il n'y en eut point en 1793. Mais, en 1794, John Neilson, successeur de Samuel, se chargea de l'impression de ce petit almanach, qui devenait de plus en plus intéressant. Neilson le continua d'imprimer sans aucune interruption, depuis 1794 jusqu'en 1841 inclusivement. La série complète de ces petits in-12 est aujourd'hui bien difficile à trouver. Tous sont utiles au point de vue statistique, politique, civil, religieux et militaire. On y trouve des renseignements qu'il est impossible de se procurer autrement. La collection la plus complète que nous connaissions est celle de l'Université Laval, surtout pour la période de 1780 à 1800. La bibliothèque de la législature de la Province de Québec n'en possède aucun avant 1794, mais elle a tous les autres depuis cette date. La série complète forme 59 volumes à format peu variable pour les cinquante derniers volumes.

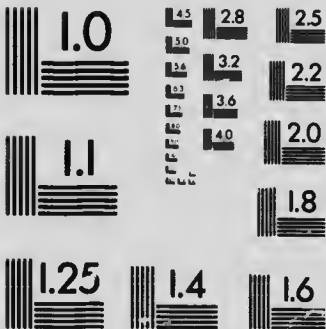

3. *Quebec (The) Herald and Universal Miscellany and Advertiser*. Fondé à Québec, le 24 novembre, à 8 pages, grand in-quarto, et hebdomadaire, ce journal était imprimé par William Moore. Le 1er volume forme 452 pages, et le second, 408. On prétend qu'il dura environ quatre ans.

1792

4. *Quebec (The) Magazine*. Le *Magasin de Québec*. Fondé à Québec en août, ce journal paraissait une fois par mois, en français et en anglais, à 68 pages par numéro. C'était plutôt une revue, rédigée par une Société de gens de lettres. Imprimée d'abord par Samuel, puis par John Neilson.

1794

5. *Times (The)*. Fondé à Québec le 24 juin. Hebdomadaire, in-quarto. La partie française, car ce journal était publié dans les deux langues, porte pour titre: *Le Cours du Temps*. Imprimé par W. Vondenvelden. Dura environ un an.

1795

6. *Montreal (The) Gazette*. La *Gazette de Montréal*. Publiée par Edwards le 3 août 1795, dans les deux langues, et porte le caractère officiel. Ce journal existait encore en 1801. Vécut-il beaucoup plus longtemps? Nous n'avons pu le constater de visu, mais il est assez probable qu'il disparut vers cette époque.

1796

7. *Montreal (The) Gazette*. La *Gazette de Montréal*. Fondée le 17 août 1796, par Louis Roy, qui la publia seul jusqu'au 17 août 1797. Alors J. M. Roy et John Bennett en prennent la direction. A partir du 20 octobre 1797, J. M. Roy la publie seul, mais elle cesse bientôt de paraître.

(Il y eut donc, à Montréal, dans le même temps trois *Gazette de Montréal*. C'est un état de choses assez curieux à constater).

1803

8. *British (The) American Register*. Fondé à Québec le 8 janvier et imprimé par John Neilson, par numéro de 16 pages à double colonne. Hebdomadaire. Malgré son titre anglais, cette espèce de revue contient plusieurs écrits français. La langue anglaise toutefois y tient la meilleure place. Disparaît le 6 août de la même année.

1805

9. *Quebec (The) Mercury*. Fondé à Québec le 5 janvier, par Thomas Cary. Publié d'abord chaque semaine sous le format in-quarto à 8 pages, devient bi-hebdomadaire le 17 mai 1816 et paraît ainsi jusqu'en 1832, alors qu'il est publié trois fois par semaine. A partir du 12 janvier 1863, le *Mercury* paraît tous les jours. Disparaît avec le numéro de 17 octobre 1903.

(Journal politique, commercial et industriel demeuré dans la famille des imprimeurs Cary jusque dans ses vieilles années).

1807

10. *Canadian (The) and Montreal Advertiser*. Fondé à Montréal par Nahum Mowor et le Révérend Stephen Miles. Vécut plusieurs années et semble disparaître avec le Dr. B. Workman, qui le rédigea de 1829 à 1834.

1811

11. *Canadian (The) Visitor*. Fondé à Québec en mai 1811, et imprimé par John Neilson. Ne paraît pas avoir vécu bien longtemps.
12. *Montreal (The) Herald*. Fondé à Montréal le 19 octobre, et imprimé par William Gray, 17, rue Saint-Paul. C'est le plus vieux journal de la Province de Québec après la *Gazette*.
13. *Commercial (The) List*. Fondé à Québec en mai 1816. Hebdomadaire au début in-quarto, puis in-folio. C'était l'organe des marchands anglais de Québec. Subsiste environ pendant vingt ans.
14. *Mercantile Journal*. Fondé à Québec le 4 septembre 1816, pour prendre les intérêts du commerce. Imprimé et publié une fois par semaine chez George J. Wright, No. 2, rue Sainte-Geneviève, vis-à-vis le jardin du gouvernement.

1820

15. *Scribbler (The)*. Imprimé à Montréal, par James Lane, ce journal appartenait à Samuel H. Wilcocke de Burlington, dans le Vermont. Il portait pour sous-titre: "A series of weekly Essays . . . on Literary, Critical, Satirical, Moral and Local Subjects, interspersed with pieces of poetry by Lewis Luke Macculloch, Esq."

(En 1822, Macculloh publiait à Burlington le *Free Press*, alors que le *Scribbler* paraissait à Montréal).

1821

16. *Inquirer (The)*. Fondé à Québec le 1er mai, ce journal était mensuel à 16 pages in-octavo par livraison. Tenait de la revue plutôt que du journal. Imprimé par W. H. Shadgett, du bureau de l'imprimerie nationale et britannique, Côte de Léry (rue Ste-Famille actuelle). Subsiste moins d'un an.

1822

17. *Free (The) Press*. Fondé à Montréal le 20 octobre 1822.

1823

18. *Canadian (The) Magazine and Literary Repository*. Revue publiée par Joseph Nickless, rue Notre-Dame, Montréal, et imprimée par Nahum Mower. Mensuelle à 96 pages in-octavo. Paraît de juin 1823 à juin 1825, et forme en tout quatre gros volumes intéressants.
19. *Canadian (The) Spectator*. Publié à Montréal, par J. Waller, et paraît encore en 1828.

1824

20. *Canadian (The) Review and literary and historical journal*. Revue fondée à Montréal le 1er juillet 1824, par H. H. Cunningham. Disparaît en 1826, et forme quatre volumes d'environ 250 pages chacun. Revue très bien faite, rédigée par David Chisbolme, rédacteur de la *Gazette* de Montréal.

1825

21. *Colonial (The) Journal of Lower Canada*.

1826

22. *Quebec (The) Medical Journal*. Revue plutôt que journal fondé à Québec, par le Dr. F. H. Tessier. Paraît dans les deux langues depuis janvier 1826 jusqu'à la fin de l'année 1827. Imprimée d'abord chez Francis Lemaistre, rue Ste-Famille, puis à la basse-ville, rue Notre-Dame. Forme deux volumes in-8. Cette revue médicale paraissait tous les trois mois.

1827

23. *Christian (The) Sentinel*. Publié à Montréal.
24. *Elector (The) L'Electeur*. Fondé à Québec le 16 juillet et publié en français et en anglais. Imprimé par F. Lemaistre, rue St. Joseph (Garneau) haute-ville. Parut environ pendant un mois et demi plusieurs fois par semaine.
25. *New (The) Montreal Gazette*. Fondée à Montréal le 16 juillet 1827.
26. *Star (The) L'Etoile*. Journal commercial, fondé à Québec, le 5 décembre. Hebdomadaire jusqu'au 1er mai 1822 puis bi-hebdomadaire jusqu'au 4 décembre 1830, date de sa mort. Mi-anglais et mi-français à son origine, ce journal finit par n'être qu'anglais. Imprimé par Lemaistre, No. 11, Côte de la Montagne, pour Daniel Wilkie, éditeur. Ses principaux collaborateurs furent les juges Stuart et Black.

1828

27. *Irish (The) Vindicator*. Publié à Montréal le 12 décembre 1828.
28. *Miscellany (The Canadian)*; or, the religious, literary and statistical intelligence. Revue mensuelle publiée à 32 pages, à Montréal, en avril 1828. Ne vécut que six mois.
29. *Vindicator (The)*. Publié à Montréal en 1828, vécut un bon nombre d'années. Il fut rédigé de 1832 à 1837, par Thomas Storrow Brown. Un autre journal, portant le même nom fut publié vers 1878, par Osborne; ce sont deux journaux différents.

30. *Gazette of Education*. Fondée à Montréal le 13 octobre 1830.

1831

31. *Monthly (The) Magazine*. Fondé à Montréal en mars 1831. Paraissait encore en 1862.

1832

32. *Museum (The) or Journal of literature and arts*, edited by L. Gosselin. Publié à Montréal par L. Gosselin avec le concours de sa femme, Mary Graddon. Cette revue disparut en 1834.

1833

33. *Daily (The) Advertiser*. C'est le premier journal quotidien, fondé à Montréal par H. S. Chapman. T. Storrow Brown y collabora au début.
34. *Settler (The)*. Publié à Montréal.
35. *Weekly (The) Abstract*. C'est l'édition hebdomadaire du *Daily Advertiser* cité n.º 33, lequel dura aussi longtemps que le quotidien.

1834

36. *Farmer's (The) and Mechanic's Journal and Eastern Townships Gazette*. Ce journal, le premier des Cantons de l'Est, et d'où est sortie le *Gazette* actuellement vivante, fut fondé par Walton et Gaylord. Son titre disparut en 1838 pour faire place à la *Gazette* de Sherbrooke. V. No. 52.
37. *Transcript (The)*. Publié à Montréal; d'abord tri-hebdomadaire, puis quotidien. Eut aussi une édition hebdomadaire, en même temps que la quotidienne et la tri-hebdomadaire. Ce journal fut enregistré au greffe de Montréal le 4 juin 1838, par Donald McDonald. Il fut rédigé tour à tour par Robert Abraham, de 1849 à 1854, et par William Bristow, de 1858 à 1860. Le *Transcript* vivait encore en 1872.

38. *Canada Temperance Advocate*. Fondé à Montréal le 1er mai 1835, dans le but de plaider la cause de la tempérance, de l'agriculture et de l'éducation. Était imprimé par J. C. Becket, par livraison de 16 pages in-quarto, et paraissait tous les quinze jours. Vécut d'assez longues années.

40. *Morning (The) Courier*. Fondé à Montréal, le 21 février 1835, par Rollo Campbell, et fut enregistré le 3 juin 1838, par P. M. Shaw. C'était un journal quotidien. Le Rev. Daniel Falloon y collabora assez longtemps. Le *Morning Courier* existait encore en 1843.

1836

41. *Bytown Gazette*. Journal politique fondé à Ottawa (alors Bytown) en juillet 1836, par M. French. Était hebdomadaire et imprimé rue Duke près du pont Pooley.

42. *Independent (The)*. Fondé à Ottawa le 24 février 1836, par un nommé Johnstone qui en fut en même temps le rédacteur et le propriétaire. Hebdomadaire à couleur politique. C'est le plus ancien journal d'Ottawa. Il eut une existence éphémère.

43. *Union (The)*. Fondé à Québec et rédigé par W. Bristow dans l'intérêt de la candidature de M. Andrew Stuart, qui brigait les suffrages des électeurs du comté de Québec. Feuille essentiellement politique, morte au lendemain des élections.

1837

44. *Liberal (The) Le Libéral*. Fondé à Québec le 17 juin, et paraissait dans les deux langues. Le rédacteur français était R. S. M. Bouchette, et le rédacteur anglais, Charles Hunter. Bi-hebdomadaire. Journal radical. Dura cinq mois.

45. *Morning (The) Herald*. Fondé à Québec le 25 avril par Alfred Hawkins et un nommé Bean. Journal dévoué à la constitution du pays, qui dura un peu plus d'un an.

46. *Telegraph (The) Le Télégraphe*. Journal moitié français, moitié anglais, fondé à Québec par N. Aubin et P. A. De Gaspé. Paraissait trois fois par semaine, et était imprimé par Peter Ruthven, No. 6 Côte de la Montagne. Vécut quelques mois seulement.

1838

47. *Canada (The) Baptist Magazine*. Fondé à Montréal dans les intérêts de la Congrégation des Baptistes. Feuille à caractère plutôt religieux. Vivait encore en 1862.

48. *Canadian (The) Quarterly Agricultural and Industrial Magazine*. Fondé à Montréal par William Evans, le 1er mai 1838. Revue agricole de 72 pages in-octavo par livraison. Dura peu.

49. *Family (The) Herald*. Fondé à Montréal.

50. *Literary (The) Garland*. A monthly magazine devoted to the advancement of general literature. Publié à Montréal par Lovell et Gibson en deux séries: la première de décembre 1838 à décembre 1842, formant 4 volumes; la seconde, de 1843 à 1852, 9 volumes grand in-octavo avec le sous-titre suivant: "A monthly magazine of tales, sketches, poetry, music, engravings, etc." Cette revue importante cessa de paraître en 1852. Elle fut rédigée par John Gibson pendant treize ans, et la quatorzième et dernière année par Gibson et Madame Cushing sous la

Il commença à paraître en juin sous ce nouveau titre. Walton et Gaylord en demeurent les propriétaires jusqu'en 1870. Le journal est alors vendu à Bradford et Morehouse qui le publient conjointement jusqu'en 1875. A partir de là—la *Gazette* est la propriété des frères Bradford jusqu'en 1884, et de G. H. 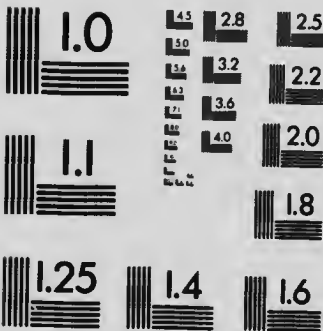
