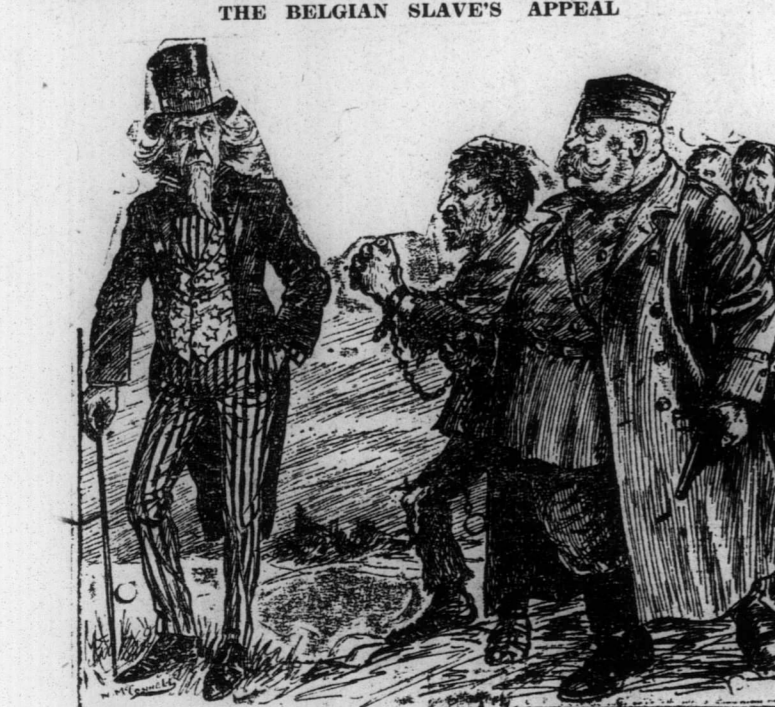

French Forces in Neutral Zone

Diamond Trade on the Increase

By Courier Leased Wire. London, Nov. 22.—A striking improvement in the diamond trade is shown in the annual report of the great combination known as De Beers Consolidated. For the years ended June 30, the net revenue of the concern was \$10,710,460 against \$2,871,295 last year. The actual sales of diamonds amounted to \$13,262,510 and the profits to \$5,186,000. This enabled preferred shareholders to receive dividends from July 1914, to December 1915, a payment of \$5,000,000.

JAGOW TO AUSTRIA

Berlin, Nov. 21.—via London, 22.—It is reported with increasing probability that Gottlieb von Jagow, the minister of foreign affairs, may be appointed ambassador to Vienna to succeed the late Count Von Tschirschy. The possibility has been discussed in diplomatic circles ever since the death of von Tschirschy particularly because it is known that von Jagow accepted his ministerial post reluctantly and never intended to hold it permanently. The Tageblatt gives prominence to this report and declares that Chancellor von Bethmann-Hollweg's visit to army headquarters is connected with filling the Vienna post.

American Ship in Distress

London, Nov. 22.—The American bark Manga Reva was in distress in the Atlantic Ocean off the coast of France and possibly may have been lost, according to a despatch to Lloyds from Falmouth. The bark was reported as arriving at London, November 5, from Rotterdam and probably was west bound. The Lloyds' report says: "The Dutch Steamer Ryndam reports that she received an S.O.S. signal Sunday in latitude 47 north, longitude 14 west from the American ship Manga Reva, saying 'come as quickly as possible. Am drifting before the wind with no boats.'"

The Ryndam signalled she was coming at full speed and sent a wireless despatch to the American Steamer Rockingham to proceed to the assistance of the Manga Reva, the Rockingham being the nearest vessel to her. "The Rockingham steamed direct towards the spot where the Manga Reva was supposed to be and should have been near her at two o'clock on Monday afternoon. The Ryndam later received a message from the Rockingham saying she could not find anything of the Manga Reva, and both the Ryndam and Rockingham proceeded on their voyages. The Rockingham before departing sent a wireless saying a French auxiliary cruiser was looking for the Manga Reva."
