It is a great mistake, says an exchange, to suppose that, because our farm products are very cheap at the present time, the farmers are doing nothing but to sell their produce. It is equally true that everything they have to buy is unusually cheap, and that when they come to strike the difference between profits and loss they will find the advantage and gain decidedly in their favor. For instance, take the following figures: In 1816 one bushel of corn would buy one pound of nails; in 1886 one bushel of corn will buy ten pounds of nails. In 1816 a pair of woolen blankets cost as much as a cow; in 1886 a cow will buy five pairs of woolen blankets. In 1816 it required sixty-four bushels of barley to buy one yard of broad cloth; in 1886 sixty-four bushels of barley will buy thirty yards of broad cloth. In 1816 it took twenty dozen of eggs to buy one bushel of salt; in 1886 twenty dozen eggs will buy ten bushels of salt. In 1816 it required one hundred of wheat to buy one yard of calico; in 1886 one hundred of wheat will buy twenty yards of calico.

How New Brunswick compares with Maine. The Nova Scotia Secessionists Write a Book, and give themselves away.

Stories of depression, retrogression and discontent in the Maritime Provinces are stock features of Grievances in Ontario. It was only a week that a stump orator, in the presence of his audience, declared that New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island, by assuming to misgovernment, was so bad that the people were leaving in boats, and that those who remained chafed looked for relief in the repeal of the union or in annexation.

What do the people of Prince Edward Island think of the repeal of the union? They are well satisfied with their position as a part of the Dominion of Canada. Mr. S. M. M. P. for Brant, and one of the late's lieutenants, was the politician who stands as an answer to the sections to the contrary.

With reference to New Brunswick, an interesting comparison of its position with that of the neighboring States of Maine has been made. According to this statement, Maine in 1860 just double the population of New Brunswick. In the twenty years following New Brunswick has increased by 200,000, while Maine has increased by 2,400,000 in ten years, a smaller increase than in the N. B. Portland and Bangor, without fire, lost a larger population than did St. John, which is taxation smaller. Comparing Maine with New Brunswick, the latter is certainly in the better position. Its population is growing more rapidly than that of Maine, its taxation is smaller. New Brunswick can gain nothing by repeal or annexation, and does not look for either. This seems to answer the story of discontent in New Brunswick.

There now remains but Nova Scotia to be dealt with. The recent development of the manufactures of this province, the great strides taken by the coal industry and the prosperity of the fishing industry might have been used as testimony in favor of the view that the province is not so depressed as the stories of decay and discontent which are related regarding Nova Scotia for political purposes in other parts of the Dominion.

It is evident that on the whole prosperity reigns in the East. Of course there is everywhere a desire to make what is good better. The man who has fallen into a state of poverty, and who has lost all hope of rising in position or wealth. So it is with communities.
