A gentleman from Montreal testified, according to the best of his belief, that he was one of the raiders. On his being examined by Payette, the Montreal goolor, this morning, that officer at once declared that he was not one of those who had been in his custody. There being some circumstances of saspicion Judge Maguire directed that he should be sent to Montreal, in company with Swager and Spurr.—The three were this afternoon accordingly dispatched across the river in charge of the police, and will proceed to Montreal by to migat strain.
