



He has also found that the steam horse power, contrary to the belief generally entertained, is often materially exceeded by that of the horse. Thus the costs of traction on the Montparnasse-Bastills line of railway proved to be for each car, daily, some fifty-seven francs, while the same work when performed by the horse cost not exceeding forty-seven francs. 
