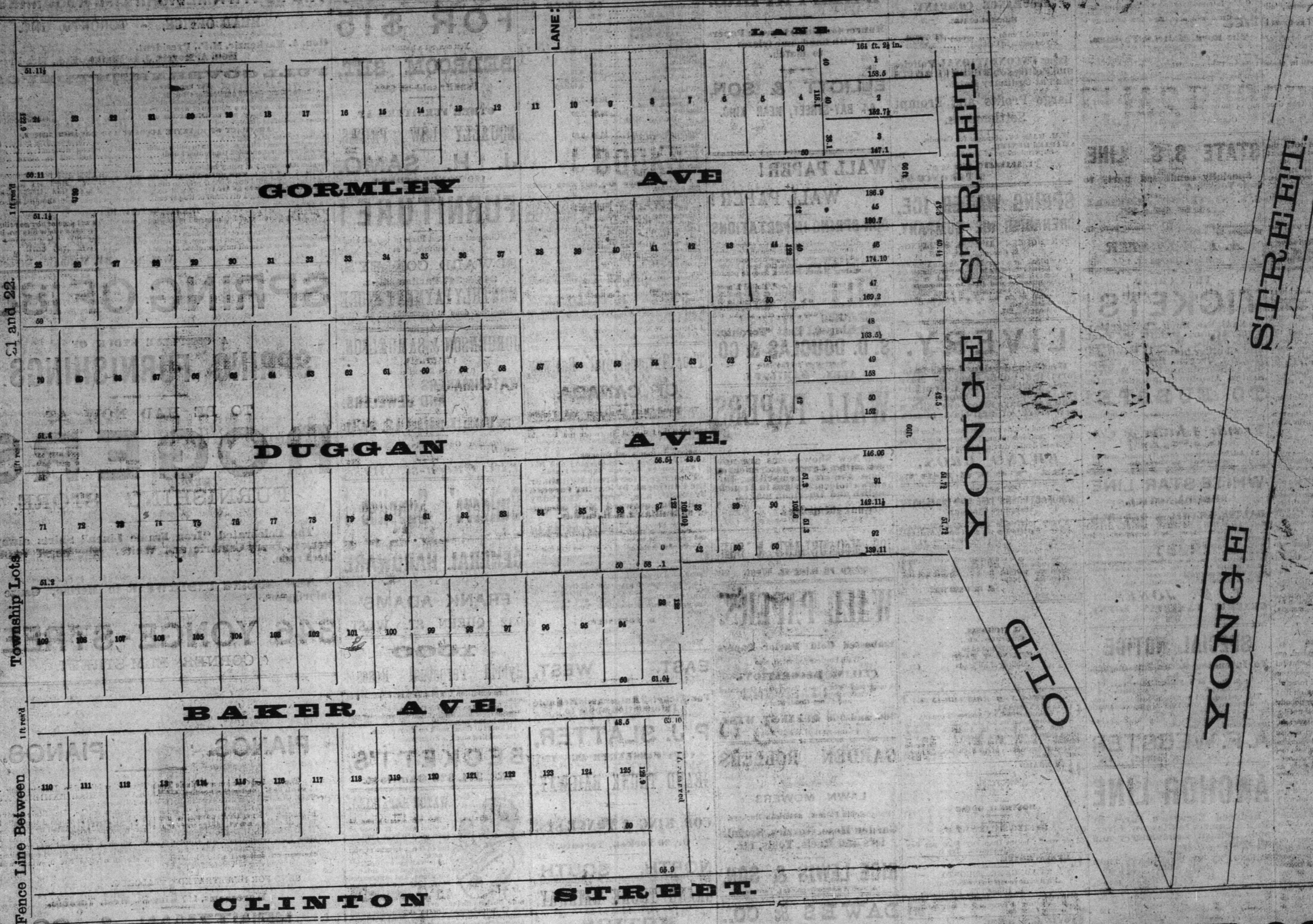

"Animal's Steam Power. In an article published in one of the French scientific journals the writer states that, from a comparison made by him of the results of animal and steam power, as employed in France at least, the first named is really the cheaper motor; that is, in the conversion of chemical to mechanical energy, ninety per cent was found to be lost in the machine, against sixty-eight in the animal. He also found that the steam horse power, contrary to the belief generally entertained, is often materially exceeded by that of the horse. Thus the cost of traction on the Montparnasse-Rue line line of railway, proved to be for each car, daily, some fifty-seven francs, while the same work when performed by the horse cost not exceeding forty-seven francs. In view of these and similar facts bearing on the question, the conclusion arrived at is that moderate powers, the conversion of chemical to mechanical energy is more economically effected through animals than through steam engines. 246
