General Booth's Social Scheme.
General Booth thus outlines his social reformatory scheme. In Great Britain the army has 230 institutions, classified as follows:—Stam posts, 64; rescue homes, 48; ex-convict homes, 12; food depots, 21; shelters, 35; labor houses, 19; labor factories, 17; farm colonies, 6; total, 230. He says that seventy per cent. of "lost" girls who are placed in situations by the army are still saved, after three years. Poor men who are "down," he thinks, through losing their chance or through illness, can be lifted up if only there is some one to lift them. It is not a crime to have lost all one has, and to have to pawn one's clothes, he says, and to have to pawn one's farm colony scheme, he went on, "is the transfer of 'drifted' persons from the overcrowded almshouses. These persons are not submerged, but are in such circumstances that their poverty may lead them to be submerged. Their habits may be changed so that they may help to form what I consider the glory of any country, an honest, hard working population, contented with plenty to eat, and having a happy halcyon time of it."

Do you suppose I'm such an ass, he went on vehemently, "as to want to transfer a lot of leaders, abandoned women and criminals to my colony?" Then he asked referring to the word "ass," "Do you say that in this country?" There was a chorus of "Yes," from the reporters present. Then the General asked that the word be changed to "simpleton."

"In my farm colony in England I have 300 strapping fellows who work from six in the morning to six in the evening every day," he said. "They got a little money and they save some of it, and they're courting the girls in the village. They are being made into good men. They are the product of our efforts, money, prayer and love."

"It is not my intent to send only reformed persons to the farm colony, nor to leave them to their fate when they get there. We will have prepared places for prepared convicts, dilapidated cottages and wheelbarrows all ready for them, the ground owned by the army and rented to them. If a man's soul dies we'll bury his soul. My scheme is vastly superior to that of Bunker Hirsch and I am not discouraged by anything Herbert Spencer may have said about such colonies."

"I don't know where my colony will be, but of ten colonies suggested to me, representatives of seven have asked me to ask for land in the borders. But I'm like a man with too many sweethearts, I don't know which to choose."

Writing with Both Hands.
We have all heard of the barber who cuts both hands with a razor, and who then writes the Westminister Budget. Here Mr. Jackson of West Newwood writing to the Morning Post to urge that we should all write in the same bi-manual fashion.

Agricultural.

Potato Root.
Experiments at Rhode Island experimental station showed that the yield of merchantable potatoes was increased 9.9 per cent by spraying the vines three times with the Bordeaux mixture. The larger yield was due to the increase in the number. The actual increase in the weight of the root, was one and one half times, at 150 per cent. greater where no mixture was used than when three applications were made.

The yield of merchantable tubers was increased 34.5 per cent by spraying the vines five times with the Bordeaux mixture. The applications of the mixture did not increase the total number of tubers, but the increase in the weight of the individual potatoes arising from the applications of the Bordeaux mixture was 48 per cent.

The formula used in preparing the Bordeaux mixture was sulphate of copper, 6 lbs., dissolved in 4 gallons of hot water; lime, 4 lbs., dissolved in 4 gallons of cold water. When cold the second solution was slowly and thoroughly mixed with the first solution, and when desired for use it was diluted to 22 gallons with cold water and strained.

The quantity required for the application depends upon the abundance of vines and the adaptation of the apparatus employed in the operation. The object to be attained is to distribute minute particles of the mixture over the entire green surface of vines, for it is known that a very small quantity of the sulphate of copper will prevent the spread of the fungus from germination, and consequently from infecting healthy plants.

This may be accomplished by various simple means, but probably with greater economy and more effectively with some of the apparatus manufactured especially for the application of fungicides or insecticides. Paris green was added to the mixture used in the first two applications, at the rate of 1 lb. to 150 gallons of the mixture.

Farmers should out this out and preserve for reference next summer.

For layers choose Brown or White Leghorns or Minorcas; for general purposes, Plymouth Rocks; for both, Wyandottes.
