A pleasing feature in the work of the present year has been at considerable sums were obtained for Foreign Missions brough the efforts of children. The result of these and other forts only appears in part in the accounts of the Board; ther sums having been raised and paid directly to the mismary object intended.

In the remittances of this year, the entire Diocese, with the

exception of two Missions, has been represented.

During the year the Board has held two public Missionary Meetings. The Lord Bishop of the Diocese presided at the first meeting, held on the 3rd July last, at Saint John. The collection, which amounted to \$53.54, was appropriated to the contingent expenses of the Board, being the only sum so applied since its formation.

A second meeting was held in Saint John on St. Andrews Day last, the collection at which, amounting to \$38.00, was

equally divided between the S. P. G. and C. M. S.

With respect to the principal missionary effort aided through the Board, it may be mentioned that the contributions for our own Missionary Diocese of Algoma have been made in part for its general work, and in part for the Shingwauk Home for Indian boys, and the Waw anosh Home for Indian girls, at Sault St. Marie in the extreme west of Ontario.

The Rev. E. F. Wilson, Principal of these Homes for India children, having expressed an intention of making a shor summer tour through the principal Canadian centres, the Board held a special meeting on May 20th to make the neces

sary arrangements for his reception.

In a statement lately issued on behalf of the Indian Home for children, Mr. Wilson writes as follows:—

"The home for boys is prospering well. We have for boys now under our charge, and, in addition to a good plain education, and instruction in the Scriptures, they are taughtailoring, tinsmithing, carpentering, bootmaking, printing, and farming.

"The Wawanosh home for girls is not yet built, but we hop to commence a part of it this summer, and require about to thousand five hundred dollars more in order to complete in A lady from England has already been engaged to superi

REPORT.

The Committee of Synod formed for the purpose of increasing the number of Church of England Temperance Societies in the Diocese, of reporting on their work, and the best way forganizing a Diocesan Church Temperance Society, in order concentrate the efforts of the members of the Church of England, for the promotion of habits of Temperance, the eformation of the intemperate, and the removal of the causes which lead to intemperance, report:—

1st. That circulars have been sent to all the clergy who had of formed Church Temperance Societies, offering them assistance towards their formation, and that twelve answers have een received, one favourable, the others giving reasons why hey were not ready to form them.

2nd. Fourteen Church of England Temperance Societies re now at work in this Diocese, and have effected much good uring the past year, by holding public meetings, enrolling any members, and calling attention to the evils of Intemperace and their remedies.

3rd. The Committee are happy to state that a Diocesan hurch Temperance Society is established in the Diocese of ova Scotia. They consider that such a Society ought now be established in this Diocese, in order to promote union id co-operation among the different Parochial Temperance cieties, to promote their efficiency and increase their number. 4th. In accordance with the resolution asking them to report the best way of organizing a Diocesan Church Temperance ciety, they would respectfully ask the Synod to pass the fol-

That this Synod appoint a Standing Committee for the pur-

pose of organizing, as soon as possible, a Diocesan Church of England Temperance Society, and that the Presidents of the Church of England Temperance Societies, being clergymen of the Diocese, be ex officio members of this Committee, and such other members of the Synod as the Synod may appoint, and that such Standing Committee do every year report on the work and progress of the Diocesan Church Temperance Society.

REPORT.

To the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop and the Diocesan Symological Fredericton:

The Committee appointed at the last session of the Diocesa Synod to consider all enactments of the local Legislatur affecting the Church of England in the Diocese, and to report upon the codification and amendment of the same, beg to submit the following Report:

Your Committee find that the local enactments affecting the Diocese are scattered through the Statutes of various years and in some cases are not readily accessible. Questions have already arisen as to the construction of some of their provisions which questions it appears very desirable to set at rest. The is also an absence of clear and definite direction in some matters of importance to the Church. Your Committee therefor recommend that the Statutes in question be revised and confided under the direction of the Synod, and they beg to submit the following general plan for such revision:

IV. PRESENTATION TO RECTORIES.—Codification of the Act 32 Vict. c. 6, with the following suggested alterations:

(a) To confine the right of voting in all cases to persons who shall, if required, declare themselves to be members of the Church of England, and to belong to no other religious denomination.

(b) A provision for choice in cases where, through destruction by fire or otherwise, there may be no Church or

Chapel-of-Ease in the Parish.

V. Parishes.—Codification of sections 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 of c. 107 of the Revised Statutes, with the following suggested addition, namely: provision as to the person who shall summon meetings, and fix the time and place for them.

VI. Union of Parishes.—The present law (1 Rev. Stat. c. 107, § 4,) under which a Rector may receive from the Bishop etters of Institution to an adjoining parish, but substituting choice by the people, under the Act 32 Vict. c. 6, for the sanction of the Governor," as required by the present law.

VII. Division of Parishes.—Suggested provisions:

(a) For setting off from any Parish a district to be attached to another Parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

(b) For the division of Parishes, and setting off new Parishes, without the necessity of applying to the Legislature in each case.

VIII. CHURCH-WARDENS AND VESTRYMEN.—Codification f the present law (1 Rev. Stat. c. 107, sects. 5 and 6,) under he following heads and suggested alterations:

(a) Number and qualification of Church-wardens and Ves-

(b) Electors in the case of appropriated Churches.

(e) Electors in the case of Free Churches.

(d) To confine the right of voting, in all cases, to persons who shall, if required, declare themselves to be members of the Church of England, and to belong to no other religious denomination.

(e) Provision for elections in cases where there may be no

Church or Chapel-of-Ease in the Parish.

IX. Free Churches.—A provision under which Churches ay be declared free, or changes made in the fabric or arrangements by a two-thirds or greater vote of the Parishioners, with compensation to any dissentient.

X. SALE OF CHURCHES AND GLEBE LANDS.—Codification

of the present Acts 22 Vict. c. 35, 34 Vict. c. 5.

XI. Provision for the Bishop receiving into the Diocese clergymen ordained in the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States.

XII. REPEAL OF THE FORMER ACTS, in order that as far a possible the entire local Statute Law affecting the Church may

be contained in one Act.

Should these suggestions be received, your Committee recommend that the matters be referred to a Special Committee to report such codification at the next session of the Synod, and that the members of the Church in the several Parishs be requested, in the mean time, to take the subject into consideration, and to forward to the Committee such suggestions as they may desire to make.
