ALLIES BREAK THROUGH THE ENEMY'S POSITION ON YSER

Reports of Christmas Day Fighting in West and East-British Warships on Belgian Coast Continue to Aid Land Fighters

London, Dec. 29—The Morning Post's Amsterdam correspondent telegraphs:
"There was no cessation during Christmas tide in the operations of the allies in the southwestern part of Belgium. On the contrary, the French and English troops co-operated in a forward movement from Lombaertzie to the south of Dixmude and detachments of Belgian troops crossed the river Yser and reinforced a position won by the Belgians some time ago.

"I am able to state that the allies have definitely broken through the Ger-

ions on the Yser. There and along the coast action by the allies is being continued in co-operation with the British warships. The report that Marikerke has been occupied by the allies, is unfounded."

GERMANS FORCED CHRISTMAS FIGHT London, Dec. 29-The Daily Telegraph's corresp "Christmas, instead of bringing a pause in the fighting finds both armies ore hotly engaged than ever. The second Russian army, which is south of the Kalisch road, is holding the line east of the Bzura River. The Germans managed to maintain themselves on this side.

"Near Sucha, General Sezechew, with the characteristic sentimentality of the Russian, ordered 'cease firing' to be sounded half an hour before midnight.

There is still no indication of a marked change in conditions on either the eastern or western battle-front. The Allies report a slight advance in one quarter in Belgium, but admit the loss of some trenches in another. In the east the German and Russian armies are still locked in a deadly struggle, but farther south the Russians claim successes over south th

south the Russians claim successes over the Austrians and assert that they hold all the principal passes of the Carpath-German destroyers. The usefulness of

all the principal passes of the Carpathians.

With regard to the withdrawal of the Russians from the investment of Craeow, reported yesterday, it is explained that this was made necessary by an Austrian attempt to drive a wedge between the Russian armies in that region, and that the Russians at the same time prevented a junction of two Austrian armies and thereby gained a distinct success, forcing one Austrian army to retreat with considerable loss. One Petrograd correspondent asserts that the Austrian campaign in Galicia has practically collapsed.

The loss to Norway, Sweden and Denmark, in vesesls sunk by mines is estimated at \$10,000,000. Today's cables tell of the sinking of another small craft by a mine in the North Sea. With regard to the British raid upon Cuxhaven, the London press expresses the belief that a good deal of damage was done by bombs dropped from the sea-planes, and that the facts are being concealed by the Germans. It is possible that Commander Hewlett, who was reported lost during this raid, may have been vicked.



NEVER EXCELLED IN BRITISH HISTORY

With the opening of spring it is cer-tain that England can throw more than a million excellent soldiers into the war

of the overseas dominions as have passed the process of discipline. By early autumn, or sooner, she can send another million to the front, these having been authorized and provided for. The British the last Imperial Conference. Even then some provisions of the old Naturalization Act to which Canada took exception were found to have been included in the draft of the new bill. This was finally settled, and as a result Canada has gained a rather important point. This is that hereafter a British subject naturalized in Great Britain will be recognized as naturalized in Canada only by virtue of the concurrent legislation passed by the Dominion. The new act reduces the residential qualification for naturalization from three years in Canada itself to five years within the Empire, the last year in Canada. New certificates will be issued to persons naturalized under the former statute without re-naturalization. Where the naturalized person has not lived for five years within the Empire, however, the certificate may be held back until the end of that period, but this will not prejudice their rights under the old Act.

put a stop to military operations of an important nature along the great-er part of the battlefront in Belgium and France. In this territory the positions of the opposing forces remain virtually the same as they have been for weeks past.

In the eastern arena the official reports indicate a similar condition of affairs, so far as progress on the part of either side is concerned. Petrograd reports, however, that be-tween the Pilica river and the Up-

tween the Pilica river and the Upper Vistula the Germans are now on the defensive.

The Russians also report the capture of more than twenty thousand prisoners, to which reference was made in previous announcements. A Petrograd despatch by way of London, says that all the important passes on the Carpathians are again in Russian hands.

The United States government has made strong representations to Great Britain, insisting on an early improvement in the treatment of American commerce by the British fleet. A long note has been forwarded to the British foreign secretary through Ambassador Page, covering the relations between the United States and Great Britain as affected by the British naval policy which is considered "highly objectionable" by the American government.

The British government through the naval nad military authorities, apparently fearing a raid over British towns by German airships, has issued a warning to the people to take cover should the sound of firing be heard.

FIRST FRENCH CHRISTMAS IN ALSACE SINCE 1870

Thann, Alsace, Dec. 29—The population of that portion of Alsace extending from near Altkirch to near St. Die, a strip of territory of about twelve miles, enjoyed a French Christmas for the first time since 1870. The midnight mass of Christmas Eve in Thann was celebrated with exceptional pomp. Col. Albert Carr, director of the Comedie Francaise in Paris, arranged to have several eminent musicians and singers provide the music. In other villages sermons in French were preached at all the Christmas services, by soldier priests. Most of their




