LISTOWEL.

An incorporated village situated on the town-line of the Townships of Wallace and Elma on the Maitland River, 33 miles from Stratford and 22 from Mitchell. The village contains five churches; the Church of England, a handsome frame, 30 x 45 feet, erected in 1863 at a cost of \$1,000. Rev. A. E. Miller, Incumbent. The Canada Presbyterian, is a frame building of imposing appearance, 40 x 50 feet, erected in 1868 and cost \$2,500. It is seated for 350 persons. This congregation was first organized in 1862, under the labors of Rev. Mr. Henwick, and worshipped in the Congregational Church until the present Church edifice was erected. In 1868, the Rev. G. W. Bell entered on this charge as Minister. The Wesleyan Methodist and the Congregational and Methodist Episcopal Churches are each good frame buildings. The Common School is a substantial frame building, divided into three departments, where over 300 pupils receive instruction under the charge of Mr. B. Rothwell, assisted by the Misses Findlay and Climie.

This village possesses superior advantages for manufactures, among which may be found the largest tannery in this section of the country, carried on by Messrs Towner & Campbell. Their buildings are frame and are 282 feet long by 32 feet wide, two stories high, where they use a 25 horse-power engine, and employ 10 hands in the manufacture of Spanish sole leather only.

The foundry of Turnbull & Lockie, the grist saw-mills of Climie, Bellingher & Co., and the extensive Woolen mills of Herman & Bolton, who manufacture tweeds, full cloths, blankets and flannels of all kinds at the rate of 100 yds. per diem, besides carding 55,000 lbs. spinning 4,000 lbs., and dressing 900 pieces of cloth annually. A large business is done by them in custom work. The works were established in 1867. The buildings are frame, 40 x 70 feet, two stories high. A 14 horse-power engine is used, and 15 to 20 hands employed.

The large Cabinet factory of Messrs. Hess & Co. was established in 1866. The building is frame, 100 x 40 feet, two stories high, where a 12 horse-power engine is used, and 18 to 20 hands employed in making furniture and cabinet ware and undertaking.

Messrs. Dawson & Little's carriage factory is situated on Main street, and was established in 1866. This firm employs 10 hands in the manufacture of carriages, wagons, buggies, sleighs, cutters and harrows, with blacksmithing in all its branches.

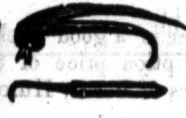

MILLBANK.

The village of Millbank, Township of Mornington, is pleasantly situated on a tributary, (branch or creek,) of the Grand River. It is 17 miles distant from Stratford, with which it is connected by a very excellent gravel road, under the control of the County Council. The distance to Berlin is twenty-two miles. There is a stage carrying a mail from Stratford on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays; and one daily from Berlin, connecting with the morning mail from Toronto. The stream furnishes sufficient water-power to drive a large flour and saw mill. There is a steam Carding Mill and a steam Foundry.

VILLAGE OF MILLBANK.

The Presbyterians, who constitute the majority of the Township, have one of their churches here—a frame building capable of seating 300 persons. The Congregation was organized about 12 years ago and chose for their first pastor the Rev. G. McMullen, now of Woodstock. He was succeeded by the Rev. D. Beattie. The Congregation—at present in charge of the Rev. J. Edgar Croly., B. A.,—have this year erected a handsome manse at a cost of about \$2000 and have a glebe of 15 acres.

The Church of England possesses a neat brick church, seating 200, and a frame manse at present occupied by the Rev. Wm. Logan, who conducts service also at Crosshill and Elma.

The Wesleyan Methodists have a frame church holding about 150 persons, and have for their pastor the Rev. J. Hough.

The School Section have erected a very fine School House and always employ the best teachers; the present teacher, Mr. Wm. Alexander, receiving a salary of \$500 per annum.

The residence of Dr. James Johnson, situated on the corner of the Stratford road is the finest in the village. Population 300.

MITCHELL.

Is an important village and station on the Buffalo and Goderich section of the Grand Trunk Railway, thirty two miles from Goderich and twelve miles from Stratford, the County Town. This village was incorporated in 1857. From that time the progress of the village has been rapid. The number on the Assessment Roll now is over 300 and the assessed value of real and personal property is \$271,000. It contains several good Churches. The Church of England a good frame building with spire and dome. Rev. H. Caulfield, Incumbent.

The Roman Catholic Church is a frame.

The Canada Presbyterian Church is a handsome frame of cruciform shape, the main building is 40×30 , the transept is 60×30 . It was erected in 1857 and improved in 1868, the total cost of the church being \$2,500, having capacity to seat 400. This is the only Presbyterian Church in the place; the Congregation is large. The present Minister is the Rev. J. W. Mitchell.

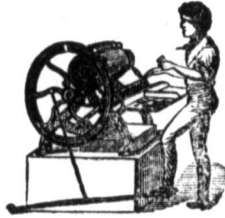
The Wesleyan Methodist Church is built of white brick with cut stone dressings. It is 75×40 —20 feet high with tower and an octagonal gilt spire with bell and vane. The church was erected in 1867 at a cost of \$6,000. Up to that time this was a Mission Station, since then it is an Independent Circuit and has sustained all the institutions connected with the church in a creditable and praise-worthy manner. In connection with this church is a very fine brick parsonage which is not excelled by any in the County. Rev. W. R. Dyer, Minister.

FLOUR MILLS.—The large Flour Mills owned and carried on by Mr. F. Hollands were lately destroyed by fire, but are about to be re-built the present year. Mr. Hollands had expended over \$10,000 in the improvement of the mill, reservoir and surrounding grounds shortly before his great loss.

Mr. J. T. Atkinson's Mill is frame 80 × 40—three stories high, with two run of stone. This mill can dress and pack fifty barrels of flour daily, the custom work averages 100 bushels per diem.

Mr. Wm. Small's Grist Mill was erected in 1868, and is a large substantial frame with two run of stone—his custom work is about 90 bushels daily.

Mr. Walter Thomson's Oatmeal, Split Peas and Pot Barley Mills are frame, 76 × 50—three stories, with two run of stone—steam power to the extent of twenty horse is used. Mr. Thomson is altogether in the merchant trade.

CARRIAGE MAKING, &c.—Mr. Edward Stiles' Carriage Factory on Ontario Street was established in 1860. Eighteen hands are employed by him, and he carries on all the various branches in the line; his buildings are frame, 26 × 50 and brick 68 × 24, with show room 90 × 26 feet.

Mr. James Begg's Carriage and Agricultural Implement Works were established in 1861; the buildings are frame, 114 × 26 feet. Fourteen hands are employed and wagons and agricultural implements of all kinds made to order.

Mr. Wm. Honey is engaged in the same line; his buildings are frame, 20 × 50 feet, with four forges. Five hands are employed and wagons, sleighs, cultivators, harrows, &c., are manufactured, and general blacksmithing carried on.

Mr. David Morton's Steam Saw Mill is frame, 30 × 50 feet, and was erected in 1850. It has the capacity to saw about one million feet of lumber annually.

MONCKTON.

(West Monckton village,) A post village situated on the town line of Elma and Logan, on the gravel road leading from Mitchell to Listowel, and equi-distant (11 miles) from either place. This village has progressed rapidly since its first formation, and now contains a handsome frame church, a good school house, 25 x 36, erected in 1860 at a cost of \$600, where over seventy pupils are educated, under the charge of Mr. John Attridge, first-class teacher and principal of the school.

The large steam saw-mill and lath machine of Mr. E. Winstanley is a frame, 50 x 25, where a million and half feet of lumber and 80M. feet of lath are cut annually. Eight hands are employed in the works, and a 20 horse-power steam engine used.

A tannery—a shingle factory.—The Monckton cabinet factory, carried on by Mr. Wm. Foster; his premises are frame—one 25 x 30, the other 22 x 34—both two stories high. He manufactures all kinds of cabinet ware, and was awarded the first prize on fancy veneering at the Provincial Exhibition of 1868. Four hands are employed by him.

SEBRINGVILLE.

A post village and station on the Buffalo and Goderich section of the Grand Trunk Railway, five miles from Stratford the County Town, seven from Mitchell and forty from Goderich. The village contains one church—the "Evangelical Association," built of Brantford white brick in 1869, and cost \$5,000. The building is 38×60 feet, with tower and dome of plain Gothic style of architecture and seated for 350 persons. The basement story is used for Sabbath School and Lecture Room. This Congregation was organized about 1844. The Rev. Peter Alles, Minister.

FLOUR MILLS.—Messrs. Hill & Brother's Flour and Grist Mill is built of brick 36×50, 2½ stories high with three run of stone; they use steam and water power combined; employ four hands and can dress and pack 75 barrels of flour and grind 200 bushels of custom work daily. This firm has also a large stave and heading factory giving employment to 10 men.

Mr. A. Gettler's Flour and Grist Mill is built of brick 40×55 feet, three stories high with three run of stone. It is capable of dressing and packing 90 barrels of flour and 150 bushels of custom work daily, using steam power only.

TANNERIES.—In this branch of business, the tannery of Messrs. Eby & Moritz claims a notice. It was established in 1869; the building is frame containing twelve large vats; the power is steam—they tan upper and harness leather, kipp, calf and sheep skins.

In the mechanical pursuits, Messrs. R. B. Johns & Co., are engaged in manufacturing carriages, wagons, sleighs, cutters and agricultural implements. They make and sell the celebrated "Anderson and Johnston's patent Hay Rake." Blacksmithing in all its branches is carried on by the firm.

There are three hotels. The Sebringville Hotel is kept by Mrs. Pigeon in first-class style for the accommodation of guests and the public generally. There are two good stores, a post office, two saddler and two blacksmith shops.

The common school is a handsome building erected in 1864, at a cost of \$3000, where 150 pupils are educated by Miss Jane Elder.

ST. MARY'S.

This fine town is located in the south-east part of the Township of Blanshard, upon the north branch of the River Thames; at its confluence with Trout Creek, and at the Junction of the London branch of the Grand Trunk Railway, with the Sarnia or Main line; twenty-one miles from London, seventy miles from Sarnia, and ninety-nine miles from Toronto. A portion of the land on which the town is now built, originally comprised four hundred acres, formerly owned by the Canada Company. Two hundred acres of which, (with the mill privilege), were purchased from the Canada Company, by the late Thomas Ingersoll, second son of the late Major Ingersoll, of Ingersoll, in the County of Oxford. The remaining two hundred acres, were bought by his brother, James Ingersoll, Esq., the present Registrar of the County of Oxford, at Woodstock.

St. Mary's was incorporated as a village, in January, 1855, under proclamation, made September 21st, 1853.

The place was called "Little Falls," until 1852, for the reason that the River Thames at its confluence with Trout Creek, in almost the heart of the town, flowed over a lime-stone bottom, and formed a little cataract, having a fall of about four feet. This fall is now very much reduced, by the quarrying of stone from the bed of the river.

The present name St. Mary's, was then given it, in honor of the wife of the late Thomas Mercer Jones, Commissioner for the Canada Company, at Goderich; she having donated fifty dollars toward the erection of the first school house in the village. Thomas Ingersoll settled here in 1840; and in connection with his brother, Colonel James Ingersoll, erected a saw-mill, the same year; and in the following year, a grist mill; the old grist-mill has greatly enlarged, and is now one of the largest flouring mills in this section of the country. It is owned and carried on by William Veal Hutton, Esq. In 1841, James Ingersoll purchased his brother's interest in the mills and lands, then held between them.

This is an important station, being the headquarters of the Engineering Department between Toronto and Sarnia, all the carpenter work and blacksmithing for that section of the Road being done here, with a large engine shed for the Locomotive Department. About 100 men are employed in the various branches connected with the working of the Road, whose monthly wages amount to over four thousand dollars. Two magnificent

viaducts, one on the main line to Sarnia and the other on the London Branch span the River Thames and the Trout Creek at this place, which in point of size and workmanship are second only to the far famed Victoria Bridge at Montreal.

FLOURING MILLS.—St. Mary's Mill, W. V. Hutton, proprietor, Queen street; built of stone, 46 by 66 feet, four stories high, four run of stone.

MOORE'S STEAM FLOURING AND GRIST MILLS.—John Moore & Sons, proprietors, Wellington street; built of stone and frame, 30 by 50 feet, four stories high, with four run of stone. The engine is forty horse-power and the machinery of the best kind.

Geo. White & Co's. flour and oatmeal mill is built of frame, 40 by 60 feet, three stories high, with three run of stone. Merchant flouring and gristing is done, and oatmeal manufactured in large quantities.

IRON FOUNDRIES.—W. & T. Haggert, Queen street, employ about 40 hands, and an engine of fourteen horse-power. They manufacture agricultural implements, threshing machines, reapers and mowers, separators, ploughs, cultivators, scufflers, drills, stoves, &c., to the value of over thirty thousand dollars annually.

John Moore & Sons, founders and agricultural implements manufacturers. This is the oldest establishment in St. Mary's, and was established in 1852. The shop is 136 feet by 33, with two wings attached. Reapers, mowers, threshing machines, separators, mill gearing, stoves and general job work. Steam power is used, and about thirty hands employed.

WOOLLEN FACTORIES.—John Illingworth's mills are frame, 80 by 50 feet, two stories high. Water and steam power; employs seven hands; manufactures tweeds and flannels, besides attending to a large custom business.

HARRISON'S MILLS.—John Harrison, steam power; employs 15 hands; capacity to manufacture 37,000 yards of cloth annually, in addition to a large custom, carding and fulling business.

ALEX. ROBERTSON'S flax-mill is a large frame building, 72 × 40; two stories. This mill was established in 1862 by Black and Forrester, and is decidedly the most successful mill in this section of the country. The present proprietor employs thirty hands, and has a 16 horse-power engine to propel the machinery used. He dresses from 80 to 100 tons of flax, and disposes of 4,000 bushels of flax seed annually. Mr. George Black is manager of the establishment.

SMITH & COLEMAN'S brewery is a frame, 60 × 40 feet, two stories, where four hands are employed in the manufacture of beer, ale and porter.

CRAIG & HAMILTON, builders, &c., were established 1864; they employ ten or twelve hands and a 13 horse-power engine, and have planing and matching machines. Wood turning and building is also carried on by them.

ST. JAMES' (EPISCOPAL).—This is a handsome stone building, erected in 1858, at a cost of \$4,800. Rev. J. P. Curran, M. A., Incumbent.

ST. MARY'S ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH is a good substantial stone building, erected in 1861, at a cost of \$3,800. There is a large stone parsonage in connection with this church, and a separate school building in course of erection. Rev. E. B. Kilroy, A. M., Priest.

CANADA PRESBYTERIAN, Widder Street; is a frame building, erected in 1856, at a cost of \$800; there is a manse in connection. Rev. David Waters, M. A., L. L. D.

WESLEYAN METHODIST.—This is a fine stone building on Elgin Street, erected in 1856, at a cost of \$5,000. Rev. Joseph Holmes, Minister; assisted by Rev. J. W. McCallum.

METHODIST NEW CONNEXION.—A neat and handsome stone—gothic style of architecture—having capacity to seat 200. This Congregation for several years worshipped in the old school house, and in 1862 the present building was erected at a cost of \$1,300. There is a good parsonage connected with this church—and eight different congregations on the circuit. Rev. David Smith, Minister; assisted by Rev. W. Smith.

METHODIST EPISCOPAL.—A frame, purchased in 1862 and subsequently repaired. A neat stone parsonage in connection. Rev. Mr. Fansher, Minister.

BAPTIST.—Stone; erected in 1866; seated for 300, and cost \$1,500. The congregation was first organized in 1863, and worshipped in the Town Hall until the present church edifice was erected. Rev. E. B. Sharman, Minister.

MASONIC.—St. James Lodge, No. 73, A. F. and A. M., holds its regular meetings on the first Monday of each month in the Masonic Hall. George Marlatt, W. M.; Chas. Vangunten, Secretary.

I. O. O. F.—**ST. MARY'S LODGE**, No. 36, meets every Tuesday evening, in the Odd Fellows' Hall. A. Faulkner, N. G., C. Vangunten, V. G.

and at the intersection of the Grand Trunk Railway with the Buffalo and Goderich section of the same Railway. When the Canada Company bargained with the Provincial Government of Upper Canada, through the Imperial Government, in 1827, for the purchase of a block of land to settle emigrants upon, there was what was then called the "Garden of Canada" for them to choose from. This was the Western Peninsula, west of the Grand River, which flows into Lake Erie. They chose the triangular block commencing with the east limits of the Townships of North and South Easthope, and extended the same towards Lake Huron, where the westerly limits of the triangle extended from and inclusive of the Township of Bosanquet, to and including the Township of Colborne. There the chief Rivers are the Aux Sable, Bayfield and Maitland. The north branch of the River Thames, which rises north of the Village of Mitchell, County of Perth, with the easterly branch in this county, the River Avon, (which flows through Stratford and into the Thames above St. Mary's) with the Black Creek, Whore Creek, and Front Creek, are the chief running waters in the easterly part of said triangular block. That block was then, in those days, called the "Huron Tract," a name chiefly known now to the first settlers.

The lands then acquired by the Canada Company as the "Huron Tract," were then in the possession of the Indians, and even in 1833, and following years, were frequented by them still, as their hunting grounds. There were, then, in July 1833, no settlers, (except the late J. J. E. Linton, Esq.,) settled in the bush where the County of Perth now is. To the south, the nearest neighbor he had, was near the governor's road, which leads to London, and to the north a few on what was called the "Huron Road," which leads to Goderich. North of that road, to the Georgian Bay, there were no settlers. The Company's lands in 1832 and 1833, were sold at one dollar and a-half per acre.

In 1829, and for years afterwards, the place where the flourishing village of Mitchell is, was known as the "Big Thames," and where Stratford now is, as the "Little Thames." These names up to 1840, were what they were known by. The Canada Company laid out and reserved a town plot or block of land for a village, both at Mitchell and Stratford. The extent of the latter reserve was about two thousand five hundred acres. The first Saw Mill was erected for the Canada Company, by Mr. D. Ford and Mr. John Sebring, at the then "Little Thames," in the first months of 1833. The Grist and Furring Mill for said Company, was erected under the management of same parties in 1834. The latter was the first erected on the Company's lands, and was the only one north and west of the line of London in these western parts at that time. The first settlers in these parts of the "Huron Tract," were Messrs. Sebastian Fryfogel, Andrew Sebach, and Henry Rumstaller. That was in 1829 and afterwards. The first emigrant settlers, as such, arrived in the fall of 1832. In the "Little Thames," there were two or three small log buildings covered with bark, erected by the contractors of the Canada Company. It

may be said that the late William Sergeant, Esq., was the first emigrant settler as a resident of Stratford. He was the proprietor of the "Shakespeare Inn," and held lands in the Township adjoining.

The first Store was opened in one of the log shanties erected west of the bridge early in 1834, by Mr. George Worsley, and afterwards continued in a small frame building opposite, by John C. W. Daly, Esq., for several years. Mr. Daly acted as Postmaster, and had the appointment for many years. The nearest post office in 1833, to Stratford, was at Preston, County of Waterloo. The late Alexander F. Mickle, Esq., was afterwards Postmaster to the 10th March, 1858, when the Post Office was burned and he lost his life in the fire. Mr. Daly acted in Stratford as agent for the Canada Company in the sale of lands, from September 1833. He was succeeded as agent in after years in Stratford, by the late Alexander Macdonald, Esq., late of Toronto. The late Mr. John Monteith, (brother of the present Member for the North Riding of Perth, in the Ontario Legislature, Andrew Monteith, Esq.,) also commenced a store at an early date, which was successfully carried on for years by his brothers. The next store in 1839, was opened by Mr. John Gowinlock, afterwards continued by the late Mr. George Watson. This was at the corner where now is the large brick store of Mr. O'Higgins. As the settlement of the lands and the population increased, so did the trading business of Stratford.

In the settlement of the lands west and east of where Stratford is, there combined the settlers from England, Scotland, Ireland and Germany. The whole inhabitants now of the county are composed of natives and descendants of these countries. What is now the counties of Huron, Perth and Bruce, was then, in 1832, called the London District, and London was the District town. In a few years later, in 1838, the District and County of Huron was formed—Goderich on Lake Huron was the district town—the population of that district then was only 4001.

In 1847 efforts were made by the inhabitants of Stratford and neighborhood to have certain townships separated from the County of Huron and formed into a separate district and county—to be called Bannockburn or Peel—as the name was not agreed upon, though printed in the documents at the time. The population of this portion was then nigh 10,000. The late J. J. E. Linton, Esq., was delegated to Montreal, where Parliament then was, to obtain the separation; but other influences prevailed and the division was not then acceded to. In January, 1849, Mr. Linton was again sent to Montreal, and notwithstanding the many obstacles and dissensions amongst the political parties, he succeeded in obtaining a separation, and had the honor of naming the County with Stratford as the County town, when he called it "Perth," out of respect to the first and successful emigrants to North Easthope, who were from Glengwaich, Perthshire, in Scotland.

In 1852 the County Buildings in Stratford were completed. They consist of the Court House and Gaol,—with offices contained—built of brick, and handsomely placed on a plot of ground granted by W. F. McCulloch,

Esq., above the North bank of the River Avon. In January, 1853, the county was set apart by proclamation of the Governor, and the public business has been since carried on as in all the other counties of the Province. The only change has been by way of a separate building as a Registry Office, which has been erected distinct from the others. It is fireproof.

In 1856, it was stated as to Stratford, that "as a place of internal importance it is destined to become second to no other Town in the Western Peninsula of Canada." It is a point of Junction of the Grand Trunk Railway, and the Buffalo and Lake Huron Railway. To all points of the Province, east or west, by these Railways, there is a communication from Stratford, and by the south of London, and to Sarnia, or to Buffalo direct, or via Hamilton and the Suspension Bridge, there is *also* communication to all travelled parts of the neighbouring United States. As a place of *import*, for wheat produce, from the neighboring townships, the *exports*, by the Railways, show that it is the *first* inland market for exportation of that valuable article of food.

The opportunities for secular and religious instruction are equal, and beyond most similar places. There is an excellent common school building, large size, of two stories, and its instruction is free. There are private schools also in the town: there is a good library, the room for it being in the said school building, under charge of the Mechanics' Institute. There are regularly in the town about eight denominations of professing christians, viz:

ST. JAMES'—Church of England. This is a splendid new brick building, 130 feet long by 52 in width, 25 feet high, of the pure Gothic style of architecture; the spire will rise 133 feet high, and will be finished with ornamental vane, &c. The windows are of richly stained glass. The auditorium is 100 by 50 feet; seated for 800 on the ground floor, and 200 on the galleries. The inside is furnished with grained and stocco work; the galleries are lighted with a tier of windows in each side of the roof. This building surpasses in style of finish any in the County of Perth. Rev. E. Patterson, Incumbent.

ST. JOSEPH'S, Roman Catholic, is a handsome building of white brick, with cut-stone dressings; erected in 1868 at a cost of \$30,000. Its dimensions are 160 feet long by 70 wide, the transepts being 82 feet and height 52. The style of architecture is the second period of Gothic. The windows are all filled with stained enamelled glass, presenting some very elegant scriptural devices. The spire, when completed, will be 180 feet high, in which will be hung a bell 2,000 lbs. weight. The inside consists of nave and side aisles, chancel, porches and vestry. The roof is supported by fourteen pillars. The ceiling is groined with moulded ribs and bosses. On each side of rear of transepts stands an octagonal pillar 50 feet high, which adds much to the beauty and stability of the structure. There are three entrance doors to the Auditorium, which is seated for 1,000 persons on the ground floor and 250 in the gallery. This superior church edifice reflects great credit on

the architect, Mr. John Turner, of Brantford. The Very Revd. Dean Crinnan is the Pastor.

ST. ANDREW'S, Presbyterian Church of Canada, in connection with the Church of Scotland, is a handsome white brick building, Gothic style of architecture; erected in 1868 at a cost of \$7,000, having capacity to seat 400, being 75 by 44 feet in dimensions. The basement is used for lecture room, sabbath school, &c. The windows are all of richly stained enamelled glass. This is the oldest Presbyterian congregation in this part of the country. The Revd. James George, D.D., is the Minister in charge since 1862.

CANADA PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH, on Norman street, is a plain brick building, 56 by 36 feet; erected in 1851, and cost \$2,000. This building is expected ere long to give place to one of greater capacity, as it is inadequate to meet the present want of the congregation. Revd. Thomas McPherson is Pastor since its formation in 1849.

WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH is a plain brick building, 56 by 30, situated on Erie street; erected in 1866 at a cost of \$3,000. There is a neat parsonage in connection with this Church. Rev. Charles Lavell, M.A., Minister.

PRIMITIVE METHODIST CHURCH is a neat frame building erected in 1864; cost \$500.

BAPTIST CHURCH is a handsome frame building, 65 by 45 feet; erected in 1861 and cost \$1,500; seated for 300. This Church was organized in 1859, through the labors of Rev. R. McLellan, and continued to make steady progress since that period. The Rev. J. McLaurin is the present Minister in charge.

GERMAN LUTHERAN CHURCH is a frame, 34 by 28 feet; built in 1863. It is situated on Brunswick street.

SALEM CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH is a plain frame building, 38 by 24 feet; erected in 1847, and cost \$2,400. Rev. E. C. W. McColl, M. A.

The Town Hall, Drill Shed, and other public and private buildings will compare favourably with those of larger places.

The Stratford woollen mill of Messrs. J. Sugden & Sons, on Ontario street, is frame, 78 by 32 feet; 2½ stories high; 15 to 20 hands are employed, and an 18 horse-power engine in the manufacturing of tweeds, full-cloths, flannels and blankets, &c., custom carding, spinning, weaving, dressing, dyeing and fulling, &c.

Lawson & Kerr's woollen mills and tannery.

Wm. Easson's steam saw-mill on William street.

The large foundry and agricultural implement manufactory of Joseph Sharman is on Birmingham street. These buildings cover an area of about one acre, in which 20 hands are employed, and an engine of 12 horse-power used to propel the machinery. The Ohio, Buckeye self-raker, reapers and mowers combined, the little giant threshing machine for a farmer's own use, horse-power wood-sawing machines, straw and root cutters and all kinds of agricultural implements are here manufaboured.

The large planing mills and door, sash and blind factory of Messrs. Scrimgeour Bros., on Huron street, were established in 1857. The mills are frame, 80 by 40 feet and three stories high; six hands are employed, and an engine of 20 horse-power used in planing and matching lumber, wood-turning, and the making of doors, sash, blinds and building materials of every description.

A. Smith's tannery, 62 by 42, is a brick building, sole, upper and harness leather, kips and calf-skins, skirting, pebble, grain and buff are manufactured in good style.

G. A. Hilton is also engaged in the same line of business.

Messrs. Miller Bros. are extensively engaged in the manufacture of carriages, wagons, sleighs, cutters, agricultural implements, pressed steel mould boards, Miller's patent hay-fork, and carry on general blacksmithing. Their buildings are 56 by 40, two stories, and 56 by 28, one story; six men are employed.

R. Lean is engaged in the same line of business; he employs about eight hands. His buildings are frame, 50 by 25 and 40 by 20 feet

Charles Duperoho carries on the business of carriage and wagon-making and general blacksmithing in all its branches; his buildings are frame, 45 by 25 feet, and are situated on Market street.

The large flax mills carried on by Messrs. Marshall & Fuller were established in 1866. They dress 100 tons of scutched flax annually in a frame building, 100 by 45 feet, where an engine of 25 horse-power is used, and 35 to 40 hands employed; in the season of pulling and rotting 200 persons are at work.

The large steam and water, flour and grist mills of Mr. Adam L. Argo, on Water street, 60 by 60 feet, three stories high, with four run of stone, have the capacity to dress and pack 140 bls. of flour daily, and 100 bushels of custom work.

Mr. John Boag's steam flouring mill, on Market street, is a frame, 60 by 50 feet, three stories, with three run of stone, and an engine of 40 horse-power; dresses and packs 100 bls. of flour daily. This mill was established in 1858.

The village contains the large Flour and Grist Mill of Mr. George Malcolm, erected in 1866, of brick with stone basement, 38 by 40 feet, four stories high, with engine house attached and four run of stone, where he can dress and pack 100 barrels of flour daily, and grind on an average 140 bushels of wheat daily, using an engine of forty horse power and employing five hands.

Messrs. John Zimmerman & Co's., Stave, Shingle and Barrel Factory is a frame 40 by 66 feet, with cooper shop, erected in 1869, they use a fifteen horse power engine and employ fifteen hands in all the branches of their business.

TOWNS, VILLAGES & POST OFFICES.

COUNTY OF WATERLOO.

A Y R,

Is an important post village, situated in the Township of North Dumfries, County of Waterloo, about one mile from the Brant County line. It is distant from Paris seven miles, from Galt ten miles, and from Berlin fourteen miles. The Cedar and Smith's Creeks run through the village and afford much hydraulic power. The post office was established in 1838, the present official is Robert Wyllie, Esq.

There are three Churches, viz: Knox's Church, (Canada Presbyterian), a handsome frame building erected in 1844, at a cost of \$1,500, Revd. D. McRuar, pastor; the W. M. Church cost \$1,200, Rev. Mr. Gamain; the Stanley Street Church, (Presbyterian) cost over \$2,000; the Presbyterians (Morrisonians) have a congregation here, Rev. James Howie, minister. The common school buildings are of bricks, erected in 1854, cost \$3,000, and have the capacity to accommodate over 300 pupils.

There is a Mechanics' Institute with a library of over 1,200 volumes, Alexander Petrie, president; one fire company, John Wyllie, captain; a Volunteer Infantry Company, 29th Bat., Waterloo, is in a most effective state, being just re-enrolled under the new Act; Thomas M. Anderson, captain; Jas. G. Watson, lieutenant; J. McKay Anderson, ensign. A Temperance Society, Thomas Easton, president; a Young Men's Christian Association meets weekly for mutual edification and dispatch of business, Dr. W. R. Pentland, president; a Literary Society which meets weekly for debates, readings, recitations, &c., Dr. G. W. Bingham, president.

This village contains several important and extensive manufactures, foremost among which the agricultural works of John Watson, Esq., may be mentioned. This large establishment was started in 1848. Mr. Watson's shops cover an area of two acres, and are built of stone, brick and wood. Steam and water-power are both used in propelling the machinery, and from sixty-five to seventy hands are constantly employed. Reaping, mowing, threshing machines, drills, straw and root cutters, ploughs, and in fact every description of agricultural implement that the most extensive farmer requires as a labor saving machine are here manufactured. About 600 reapers and 50 separators are annually made at these works.

This is one of the most successful establishments in Canada, and its success is only the just reward due to the business energy and integrity of character displayed by its well-known proprietor.

James Piper, Esq., is very extensively engaged in the manufacture of flour. The Nithvale mills and Jedburgh mills are carried on by him. In the Nithvale mills about fifteen thousand barrels of flour are put up annually. There is an oatmeal mill as well, with two run of stone, manufacturing merchant meal only. He has also a saw-mill, doing custom work only. In and about the several mills about twenty hands are employed. In addition to the mills already mentioned, Mr. Piper has erected the Jedburgh woollen and cotton factory. The building is brick, three stories high, and 50 by 60 feet. A great many operatives will be here employed when fully in operation, and this latter enterprise must add largely to the progress of the village.

Mr. David Goldie, proprietor of the Greenfield flouring mills, is doing a very heavy business, and has in connection with the mill a stave factory and cooperage. A large number of hands find employment in all the establishments. This flouring mill is built of stone, is six stories high, and contains six run of stone, with all the latest and most approved appliances for merchant flouring. The stones are dressed with the "Diamond machine," which is one of the novelties of the age. It is not too much to pronounce this mill the finest in the Province of Ontario.

Mr. Peter Cunningham is carrying on the brewing of beer and ale. The brewery is 30 by 50 feet, and two stories high.

In the manufacture of shoe pegs, Mr. James Gladstone has been engaged for a number of years, five or six hands are employed, and water-power used to propel the machinery. From ten to twelve bushels of shoe pegs are turned out daily.

Pump Manufacturing.—In this branch of industry Mr. Robert Knox employs a few hands.

Carriage Making.—Mr. John Bell employs five or six hands in the manufacture of carriages, buggies, sleighs, cutters, &c.

Mr. Thomas McKnight is also engaged in the same line, employing two hands.

Mr. James Kay carries on the business of cabinet making in all its branches, employing three hands.

Mr. Walter Kyle, general blacksmith, employs two hands, and turns out work of excellent finish.

There are other work-shops representing the various trades, where in the aggregate many find employment.

BADEN.

A post village in the Township of Wilmot, and Station of the Grand Trunk Railway, nine miles from Berlin the County Town, sixteen from Stratford and seventy-two from Toronto. Mr. Jacob Beck was the first settler and had the village laid out in 1855. Spring Creek, a tributary of the Nith, runs through the village and affords hydraulic power for the large Flour and Grist Mills of Mr. Beck, and the Flax Mills carried on by Messrs. J. & J. Livingston.

Mr. Jacob Beck's large Foundry, Steam Engine and Agricultural Implement works are of brick, 200 feet long by 38 wide and two stories high, where he turns out steam engines, boilers, and mill machinery in general—agricultural implements and stoves of the best description—and is giving constant employment to 20 hands. Mr. Beck has also the large Flour and Grist Mill, 40 by 60, four stories high with three run of stones; the machinery is propelled by water power. Capacity—seventy-five barrels flour, and one hundred bushels custom work daily.

Messrs. Charles Woodhead & Co., are extensively engaged in the manufacture of woollen goods, manufacturing tweeds, full cloths, blankets and flannels of all kinds, and execute custom work in the very best style.

Mr. M. Morley carries on the large Steam Saw Mill and the shingle, stave and barrel-heading factory; he is doing a large business and has a Planing Mill attached.

The Flax Mill of Messrs. J. & J. Livingston is in full operation, turning out annually thirty-five tons of dressed flax and two thousand bushels of seed. The same firm carries on the large Scutch Mills in Wellesley village.

Mr. Jacob Gabel carries on the Carriage and Wagon Factory, opposite the Woollen Mills.

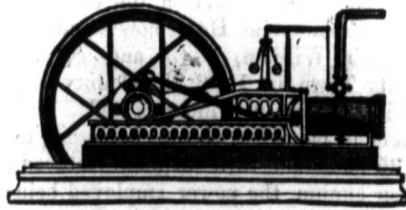

A village situated on lot number six, third concession of the Township of Wellesley, and on Bamberg Creek; twelve miles from Berlin and eleven from Waterloo village. It was settled in 1848 by Lawrence and John Kroetsch. The post office, formerly Weimer, was established and changed to its present name in 1861. Ferdinand Walter first P. M. The village contains a brewery, saw-mill and an hotel. Semi-weekly mails. Population 200.

BERLIN.

Berlin, the County Town of the County of Waterloo, is situated on the line of the Grand Trunk Railway, sixty-two miles from Toronto, and eight miles from Preston. The Town is located in a very healthy and well settled portion of the County, on an eminence sloping gradually towards the west. It has no water power to assist it, but depends upon the trade of the surrounding country, of which it attracts a large and important share. There were many settlements in the vicinity of Berlin as early as 1816. The village site was settled in 1830 by Phineas Varnum, who started a blacksmith shop and a hotel on the corner of King and Queen Streets, where Roat's Commercial Hotel now stands. The first store was opened the same year by William, David and Frederick Millar. Berlin was made the County Town in 1852, the County Buildings were erected in 1853, and in 1854 the town was incorporated. In manufactures there are two cabinet and chair factories; the one belonging to Simpson & Aldous, who employ about 35 hands and turn out manufactured ware to the amount of about \$25,000 per annum, the power employed being a steam engine of twenty-five horse power; the other owned by Isaac Hoffman who employs about 30 hands, and an engine of 20 horse power to propel the machinery.

In connection with Simpson & Aldous's chair factory is a large steam pump-factory—the largest, in fact, in this section of the country, which gives constant employment to a number of hands.

A noticeable improvement on the old wind-mill is the steam flour mill of Messrs. Snider & Rothwell, a frame building, 40 by 60 feet, erected in 1867, which contains three run of stone, and has capacity for turning out 45 barrels per day. Three men are employed in this mill, and its machinery is propelled by a steam engine of twenty horse power.

In the manufacture of leather, Lewis Breithaupt employs 40 men. The tannery contains 144 vats, and turns out leather to the value of \$100,000 per annum. The building is 100 by 220 feet, and the force employed, a steam engine of thirty-five horse power.

That of B. Lang turns out about \$30,000 per annum.

In the building of carriages and wagons, Enoch Ziegler employs nine men, and turns out work to the value of \$8,000 per annum.

The tobacco works of William Oelschlager have a wide and deserved reputation. The business is entirely wholesale, and done principally with Lower Canada and Halifax, Nova Scotia. Mr. Oelschlager employs twelve hands, a steam engine of twenty-five horse power and manufactures tobaccos to the value of \$18,000 per annum.

Berlin can boast of a large button factory,—we believe the only one in Ontario,—owned by Emil Viegelsang, who employs about twenty-five hands in the establishment. Simpson & Aldous's engine furnishes the motive power.

Among the public buildings worthy of note are the Court House and Jail, erected at a cost of \$20,000; the Grammar and Central Schools which cost \$10,000, and the handsome little Gothic church of St. John the Evangelist.

There are two newspapers published in Berlin, viz: one English, the *Berlin Telegraph*, and one German, the *Berliner Journal*.

The Bookstores of Boedecker & Stuebing, and that of Oberholtzer Bowman are a credit to the Town.

CHURCHES.

St. John the Evangelist, (Church of England,) erected in 1862.—Style of architecture modern gothic; size 70 × 30, with chancel, west porch, tower and spire; cost \$2,400. Rev. Mr. Kennedy, Incumbent. Church Wardens—Charles Stanton, and H. F. J. Jackson. Lay delegate to Synod—John Fennell.

St. Marg's, (Catholic).—Erected in 1856; cost \$3,000; brick; seats 450; size 42 × 70. Priests—Revd's. F. Ellend, L.L.D., David Fennessy and L. Faucken, D.D.

German Methodist.—Erected in 1842; of frame; size 34 × 40; cost \$1,000; seats 250.

German Baptist.—Erected in 1854; cost \$1,300; size 40 × 60; material brick; seats 300. Rev. C. Bodenbender, Minister.

Weslyan Methodist.—Erected in 1841; cost \$2,000; seats 200; frame material. Revd's. Thomas A. Ferguson, and John Scott, Clergymen.

St. Paul's, (Protestant, Lutheran).—Built in 1848; frame; size 35 × 50; cost \$1,800.

Menonite.—Erected of frame in 1834, on the site of the old church which was built in 1811; cost \$800, seats 700. Rev'ds Moses Erb and Daniel Wessonner, Ministers.

New Jerusalem Church.—Erected in 1846; of frame; cost \$400; seats 150. Revd. F. W. Turk, Minister.

St. Peter's, (Evangelical Lutheran).—Erected in 1863; of brick; size, 36 × 60; cost \$2,000; seats 1,000.

Berlin Central School.—Situated on Frederick street; erected in 1856 at a cost of \$8,000. Average attendance of pupils 350. Thomas Pierce, Principal.

Berlin Grammar School.—Held in the same building with the Central School, though entirely separate in its management. Average attendance, 20. Revd. John Thom, M.A., Principal.

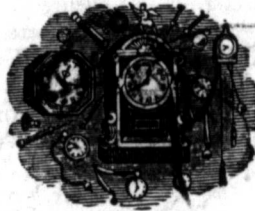

ELMIRA.

A post village in the Township of Woolwich, situate on the stage road from Berlin through Waterloo village, distant from the County Town 12 miles. It is situated in the midst of a good agricultural district and contains some good manufacturing establishments, viz:—a large flouring and grist mill—a woolen factory established by Winger & Weaver, in 1856. It is a large frame building 140 × 30 ft. 2 stories high with 20 horse power engine; the firm have 25 to 30 hands employed in the manufacturing of tweeds, full cloths, blankets and flannels besides custom work. A foundry and wagon and blacksmith's shops with the various other branches of mechanical pursuits are fully represented in the village.

It contains five churches—The Canada Presbyterian, a handsome brick building erected in 1869, at a cost of \$1,500. Rev. E. Graham, Min.—The Wesleyan Methodist, a small brick building erected in 1854.—The German Lutheran reformed, a new brick erected this year, and The Evangelical Association Church, a neat brick building erected at a cost of \$2,000.—The Menonite Church, is a good frame building about one mile north of the village. The public cemetery is in connection with this Church.

G A L T.

*The Town of Galt is situated in the Township of North Dumfries and is the principal Town in the County of Waterloo. The surrounding country is noted for its fertility, and its staples, wheat, barley and wool, have always been considered of superior quality. Statistics prove that Galt is the wealthiest manufacturing town in the Dominion, and that the amount of capital invested in the various branches of industry is only exceeded by a few of the larger cities. The number of manufacturing establishments will be very considerably increased during the present year, several buildings being now in course of erection. In educational matters Galt enjoys an enviable reputation. Its Grammar School, under the management of Wm. Tassie, Esq., head master, has taken a leading position among the classical institutions of the country, and pupils from the United States and all parts of this country constantly attend. The present population of Galt is about 4,000.

DUMFRIES FOUNDRY.—This establishment is on the west side of the river, and deserves especial notice. It was carried on for nearly 20 years by James Crombie & Co., and under their management became famous for the superiority of its manufactures. The present proprietors are Goldie, McCulloch & Co. In engines, boilers and mill-gearing, the quantity of work turned out is immense, and a large number of men are constantly employed throughout Ontario in the erection of flouring mills, saw mills, &c. The woollen machinery department which has been established within the past few years has acquired an enviable celebrity and supplied a want previously much felt in the country. The constantly increasing business has necessitated the erection of several extensive additions to the workshops. The machinery is driven by steam power. The number of hands employed is about 160.

GALT FOUNDRY.—Lutz & Co., proprietors.—This foundry has been in operation for about 27 years, and at present employs about 30 workmen. Agricultural implements, the smaller descriptions of machinery, stoves, ploughs, &c., are the principal manufactures. Water power is used.

GALT NUT WORKS.—Lutz & Co., are also proprietors of this establishment. They have in operation a machine for the manufacture of hot-pressed nuts and can turn out about one ton per day. The motive power is steam and water, and the demand is so large that great difficulty is experienced in keeping up the supply.

VICTORIA FOUNDRY.—J. W. Davis & Co., manufacture stoves, ploughs, tin and sheet iron ware. The motive power is steam.

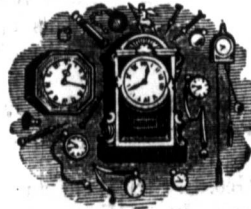

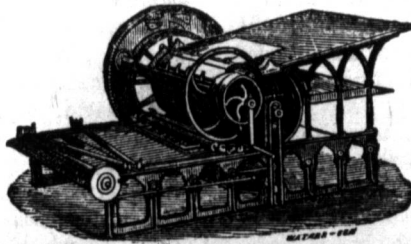

HAYSVILLE.

A village situated on lot 20, second concession, block A., of the township of Wilmot, three miles from New Hamburg station Grand Trunk Railway, eight from Plattsville station, Buffalo and Lake Huron Railway; sixteen from Berlin, twenty from Galt, and seventy-eight from Toronto. The village was settled in 1835 by Robert Hays, William Hobson, and E. Everett, and the Post Office was established the following year—Robert Hays, first postmaster. The village is well supplied with water privileges by the River Nith, and contains a flouring mill, a woollen and cheese factory. There is an Episcopal Church, Rev. H. F. Mellish, pastor, and an excellent school averaging eighty pupils.

The Post Office was originally called Wilmot, but was changed to its present name in 1853. It is named after Mr. Robert Hays, who built the mills here in 1835.

HEIDELBERG.

A post village on the line between the townships of Wellesley and Woolwich, nine miles from Berlin, and seventy-one from Toronto. It was laid out by John Meyer, Christopher Weise, George Ament, Louis Hollinger, Jacob Plum, and Moses Weaver. The post office was established in 1854, John Kressler, first P. M. The village contains a Lutheran Church, Rev. D. Stahlschmidt, pastor, a good school, two hotels, and several mechanics' shops.

HESPELER.

An incorporated village, beautifully situated on the Speed, and on the line of the Guelph and Galt branch of the Great Western Railway, in the south-east of the Township of Waterloo, ten miles from Berlin, the County town. The place was first settled in 1824, and laid out by Michael Bergey, under the name of New Hope, which name it retained until it was incorporated, about the year 1858, as the village of Hespeler. The post office was established in 1848, and Jacob Hespeler appointed postmaster. The village contains seven stores, all doing a thriving business. The river Speed supplies an abundance of good hydraulic power which has been largely taken advantage of through the enterprise of Jacob Hespeler, Esq. The buildings erected by Messrs. Hespeler comprise nearly one half the village and may be briefly noticed as follows:

The Hespeler woollen mills are of stone and consist of two large buildings one 220 feet \times 54, the other 260 feet \times 30, each two stories high. Employment is given to 150 hands in the various branches of the woollen manufactory. The flouring and grist mills are each large stone buildings the one 100 \times 40 feet—the other 80 \times 30 feet, the latter is used for custom work exclusively, while the former turns out about 200 barrels of merchant flour daily.

The saw-mill is a stone building where about $1\frac{1}{2}$ millions feet of sawn lumber are turned out annually.

The distillery was established in 1854—it is a stone building 120 \times 45 feet, 2 stories. The various establishments are now carried on by George Hespeler, Esq.

Messrs. Randall, Farr & Co.'s, woollen and knitting works were established in 1864. The main building of stone is 150 \times 50 feet, 2 stories high, with wing 75 \times 30 feet, two stories high; warehouse, counting rooms and dry-houses are attached to the premises, the whole outlay by this firm was not less than \$50,000. They employ about 150 hands and turn out goods to the value of about \$150,000 per annum.

In the manufacture of agricultural implements, woollen machinery and general castings, Charles Karch, employs about 12 hands, and an engine of 8 horse power; commenced business here in 1862.

Mr. Jonathan Schofield, carries on a good business in the Hespeler custom woollen mills, manufacturing chiefly all varieties of flannels.

The flouring mills known as "Fisher's" are now owned by A. & J. Clemens, the building is frame, 45 \times 50 feet, four stories, contains four run of stone, capacity 100 barrels per diem.

Mr. Lewis Kribs, established in 1864, employs 15 hands and steam power to the extent of twenty horse in the manufacture of lumber, shingles, staves, barrel headings, planing lumber, coopering, &c.

There are four churches, viz: the Canada Presbyterian, built of stone, erected in 1862, at a cost of \$2,500; Rev. M. McKenzie, pastor. The New Connexion Methodist Church was erected in 1868, of stone, Rev. Jas. Hill, pastor. The Lutheran Church was erected in 1867, no regular pastor. The Roman Catholic Church is built of stone, and was erected in 1858, at a cost of \$1,200; no regular priest.

About twenty-five tons of scutched flax are turned out annually, and 1,500 bushels of seed prepared for sale.

NEW HAMBURG.

An incorporated village in the Township of Wilmot, situated on the river Nith. It is a station of the Grand Trunk Railway, 14 miles from Berlin and the same distance from Stratford the County Town of Perth. The village is located in a very rich and well settled section of the country inhabited chiefly by Germans. It was laid out in 1832, and the post office established in 1840, Mr. Wm. Scott, being the first postmaster. The river furnishes abundant hydraulic power which is taken advantage of in propelling machinery for several manufacturing establishments.

The large foundry and agricultural works of Mr. Samuel Merner, are carried on in a large brick and frame building 120 feet x 35, two stories high, with other shops on the same premises; a 20 horse power engine is used, and 25 to 30 hands employed in the manufacture of threshing machines, reapers and mowers, ploughs, cultivators, grain drills, straw and root cutters, sawing machines, all kinds of agricultural implements and tinware to the amount of \$25,000 annually.

Mr. Fredk. Merner's carriage and wagon factory was established in 1849; his buildings are brick 120 x 36 feet, 2 stories high, with wood shop 45 x 30 attached. He uses an engine of 15 horse power and employs 15 hands in carriage manufacturing.

Mr. John Nopper carries on a foundry and agricultural implement manufactory in buildings of brick and frame 130 feet x 36; he employs 10 hands and uses an engine of 15 horse power in the manufacture of threshing machines, ploughs, cultivators and all kinds of agricultural implements of the best description.

Messrs. Parker & Wilson's flour and grist mill is a frame on stone basement, 60 x 40 feet, 4 stories, with 4 run of stone, capable of dressing and packing 100 barrels of flour daily. They grind about 80 bushels daily custom work.

Mr. Geo. A. Read's woollen mills are brick and frame of large dimensions with two sets of machinery. He uses water and steam power and employs 15 hands in the manufacture of tweeds, fulled cloth, flannels and blankets, and all kinds of custom work.

Messrs. Stephen Rau & Son's brewery was established in 1858.

Messrs. W. & C. Young's tannery is a brick and frame building 60 x 38 feet, 2 stories high, where they tan harness and upper leathers, kip, calf and sheep skins. They were established in 1868.

Messrs. Adamson & Cole are extensively engaged in the manufacture of pressed stock brick and drain tiles of every description and best quality.

PETERSBURG.

A village and station of the G. T. Railway, situated on lot number nine, Snyder's road, township of Wilmot, six miles from Berlin, and sixty-eight from Toronto. It was settled in 1838, by Messrs. John Ernst, Peter Wilker, Jacob Stoebler, Segler, and Marteyne. The post office was established in 1840; John Ernst, first postmaster. It contains a Lutheran Church, frame, cost \$1,800, and capable of seating six hundred persons, Rev. J. Shultz, D.D., pastor, one tannery, pot-ash factory; an excellent hotel, kept by John Ernst, Esq., and several mechanics' shops.

The "Diana Tannery," Christopher Zoeger, Esq., proprietor, employs five hands, and is capable of turning out 800 hides, and 1000 calf skins per annum. All kinds of leather are manufactured. The tannery was established about 1848, and now \$20,000 worth of leather is turned out annually. Daily mails. Population about 50.

PHILIPSBURG.

A post village in the Township of Wilmot, three miles from Baden, a station of the Grand Trunk Railway, twelve miles from Berlin, the County Town, and seventy-four miles from Toronto. It was settled about 1843, and the village laid out by Christopher Doering. It has one Church, (Lutheran,) erected in 1851, at a cost of twelve hundred dollars; the building is frame, and will accommodate 500 persons—Rev. G. Schmidt, minister. The school numbers eighty pupils as an average attendance. There is a large tannery in this village, established in 1843 by Christopher Doering. The business is now conducted by C. Doering & Son; they employ eight hands and six horse-power engine, and turn out about twenty thousand dollars worth of manufactured goods per annum; the tannery contains forty-three vats. In connection with the above the proprietors are heavily engaged in the mercantile line.

An incorporated village in the Township of Waterloo, on the line of the Guelph and Galt branch of the Great Western Railway.

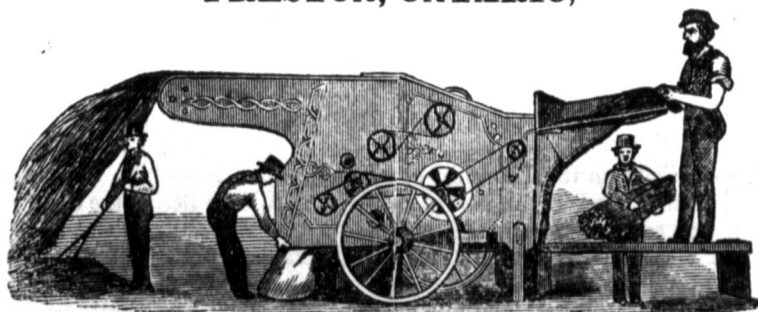

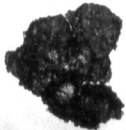

Clare & Beck, iron founders, who manufacture stoves, tinware, and agricultural implements. They employ about ten hands, and do an average business of \$25,000 per annum.

The "Cambridge" flouring mills, owned by A. A. Erb & Brothers, was established in 1814; it contains four run of stone and a chopper; is four stories in height, and has the capacity of turning out 100 bbls. of flour per day. The main building measures 60 by 50 feet, and is built of wood. The same firm have in operation, a saw-mill, sawing about half a million feet of lumber per annum; a stave factory, established in 1855, built of wood and measuring 70 by 40 feet, capable of making six million of staves and heads; and a shingle factory, turning out one million five hundred thousand shingles per annum. The power employed in those mills is steam and water. This firm have a distillery, a stone building, 48 by 60 feet, two stories high. It was established in 1854, and all grades of whiskey are here manufactured. About 50 hands are employed by the Messrs. Erb's.

The Preston chair and cabinet factory, owned by Fred. Guggisberg was established in 1843, and is the oldest in this section of the country. It is built of wood, and is 58 by 36 feet. He employs twelve hands, and an engine of ten horse power, besides water power, to the extent of eight horse. Elegant designs of waved and serpentine mouldings are also manufactured by him.

In the manufacture of woollen goods, James E. Kerr employs twenty hands, and an engine of ten horse-power. The factory is a stone building, 40 by 80 feet, two and a half stories high. Flannels, winceys, fulled cloth tweeds and blankets are turned out to a large amount annually.

In the manufacture of agricultural implements, Wahn & Newton are doing a very extensive business. The firm have been established since 1854, and use steam and water power, giving employment to about twenty hands. The premises are brick and stone, 205 feet long by 35 wide, two stories high. They manufacture threshing machines, reapers, mowers and the patent self-regulator separator, all kinds of agricultural implements, stoves and general castings.

The village contains two breweries, G. Roos's is a stone building, 100 feet by 44, two stories high, with three cellars, each 50 feet long by 18 feet wide. It is the first brewery established in this section.

Jacob Roos's is a stone building, 32 by 52, two stories high, and was established in 1856.

All the mechanical trades are well represented.

Preston contains several good hotels, of which Klotz's, G. Roos's and the North American, Tufford & Co., may be noticed. The North American during the past season has been enlarged, newly furnished, and under its new proprietorship has changed into a first class establishment.

One feature of importance to the village is the Artesian well in connection with the North American Hotel. The well was bored in 1838 to a depth of 360 feet, and forces the water 24 feet from the surface. Many patients can testify to the efficiency of the water as a remedial agent. There are excellent bath-rooms well fitted and furnished with hot and cold water.

The Conestogo river runs through the village, and propels the machinery of Snyder's large flour and grist mills, the extensive woollen factory of Snyder & Brother, where ten hands are employed in the manufacture of tweeds, full cloths, flannels, and the various kinds of custom work.

The large tannery of Messrs. Bowman & Zinkan contains forty vats, and gives employment to twelve hands in manufacturing the different

material frame; number of hands employed, five, and the total cost upwards of \$45,000. The capacity of the mills is 15,000 bbls. per annum.

The Granite mills, established in 1858 by George Randall & Co., are built of stone and brick, and measure 40 × 60 feet. They contain four run of stone, and give constant employment to four hands. The power used is a steam engine of sixty-five horse power, and when in full force the mills have a capacity of 55 bbls. per day. In connection with the mill is a distillery, (60 × 60 feet, brick,) which cost ten thousand dollars; gives employment to six men; and has a capacity of distilling 500 gallons of proof spirit per day. The power employed is derived from the steam engine in connection with the mills.

IRON FOUNDRIES.—The Waterloo foundry, established in 1852, by Jacob Bricker & Co., is a three-storied building, consisting of a finishing shop, 96 by 45 feet, and a moulding shop, 82 by 45. The firm employs thirty men, and a sixteen horse power engine. At this foundry, steam engines, boilers, separators and all kinds of agricultural implements are turned out.

The Union foundry, Werner & Weber, is a brick building, 60 by 40 feet, and gives employment to ten men. The power used is a fifteen horse power engine, and the articles manufactured are threshing machines, separators and agricultural implements of all kinds.

The Waterloo stave factory of Messrs. Snyder & Co., was established in 1860. The Company employ nine hands, and steam power, and manufactures half a million of staves per annum. The building is frame, and measures 40 by 30 feet.

The Waterloo planing mills were established by M. Wegenast in 1867, and employment is given to fourteen men. The power employed is steam, and the articles manufactured are sash, doors, blinds, and cabinet furniture. In connection with the above establishment is a saw-mill, 50 by 30 feet, which gives employment to two hands, and a rake manufactory, employing four to five men.

The Tweed mills, established by W. A. Bockus, consist of a main building, 60 by 30 feet, a second building, 20 by 14 feet, and a fulling and dye shop, one story high, and measuring 50 by 18 feet. The propelling force is a steam engine of eighteen horse power. The articles manufactured are blankets, tweeds, flannels, &c., and the annual value \$15,000, exclusive of custom business.

The Waterloo woollen works were established in 1863 by Paton & Bricker. The factory has complete sets of machinery, driven by an engine of sixteen horse power, and keeping thirteen hands constantly employed. The establishment turns out about six hundred yards per week.

There are three Churches—the German Lutheran, 50 by 40 feet; seats 225; Rev. J. Hoelsche, minister. German Methodist, Rev. Mr. Spies, minister; and the United Brethren.

CENTRAL SCHOOL.—This School, under its present Principal, is in a most prosperous condition, as is evidenced by its daily average attendance, being upwards of 300. an average daily increase of about 50 pupils. The school is well furnished with educational apparatus, including a library of

WELLESLEY.

(Formerly Smithville.)

A post village in the township of Wellesley and on the River Nith—17 miles from Berlin, 79 miles from Toronto, and 9 miles from Baden Station G.T.R. The village was first settled in 1847, by John Smith after whom it was called until 1852. The facilities for manufacturing purposes are the river Nith, and two streams, tributaries of the same river. The post office was established in 1851 and William Brown appointed postmaster; the present postmaster is John Zoeger; the village contains several stores, one flouring mill, having three run of stone and will manufacture about 60 bbls. of flour per day; one saw-mill sawing about a quarter of a million feet per annum; three wagon shops; two boot and shoe shops; a fine hotel, and new hall in connection, called the Wellesley Hotel, and two others; two churches, German Lutheran, erected in 1854 at a cost of twelve hundred dollars, of frame, and the New Jerusalem church, erected in 1858, of frame, at a cost of four hundred dollars. There is a good school with an average attendance of 80 pupils. Money order office. Mails daily. Population 400.

There are two taverns and a post office. Mails daily. Population 100.
