





The power of making special rates for parpower of making special rates for par-ticular cases is one that could not be ex-ercised honestly, even though an honesis man were in Mr. Brydges' position. It is simply impossible for any Government to ensure the honest exercise of such power, and no Government that desires the honest administration of affairs would make the attempt. No Government that desires to reward political aprilsans, to puils political opponents, to give subordinates a chance for peculation without, danger of detection, would put such a system into practice. This new method of man-agement turns the public works of Cana. into practice. This new method of man-agement turns the public works of Cana-da into partisan agencies for the benefit of the Government of the day.
