Madero wanted to oppose him for the office, and as a result had to leave the country. Madero is a member of a very wealthy and influential family. In order to preserve his own safety, he conducted his campaign from New York City. This, however, did not avail him anything and Diaz was elected. There has been a great deal of opposition to Diaz.

Better Representation.

"The people feel that they want better representation. A very large number of clubs called 'Anti-Re-Election Clubs,' have been formed. During October and November many arrests were made of members of these clubs, who declared themselves opposed to a continuation of the Diaz regime. On Nov. 18, however, the first shot was fired at Pueblo, a place four hours' run from Mexico City.
