C A P. XXIX.

An Act to revive and continue, until the First Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and six, an Act, made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for establishing Courts of Judicature in the Island of *Newfoundland*; to continue several Laws relating to the preventing the clandestine Running of uncustomed Goods, and for preventing Frauds relating to the Customs, to the Twenty-ninth Day of *September* One thousand eight hundred and nine, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament; to the suspending certain countervailing Duties granted by an Act for carrying into Execution the Treaty with *America*, to the Twenty-fifth Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and four; to the allowing the Use of Salt, Duty-free, in the preserving of Fish, in Bulk or in Barrels, and to the discontinuing the Bounty payable on White Herrings exported, to the Twenty-fifth Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and four; to the Encouragement of the Trade and Manufactures of the *Isle of Man*, to the

the improving the Revenue thereof, and the more effectual Prevention of Smuggling to and from the said Island, to the Fifth Day of *July* One thousand eight hundred and four; to the more effectual Encouragement of the Manufactures of Flax and Cotton in *Great Britain*, to the Twenty-fourth Day of *June* One thousand eight hundred and six; to the importing Salt from *Europe* into the Province of *Quebec*, in *America*, to the Twenty-fourth Day of *June* One thousand eight hundred and eight, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament; to the free Importation of Cochineal and Indigo, to the Twenty-ninth Day of *September* One thousand eight hundred and five, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament; to the preventing the clandestine Running of Goods, and the Danger of Infection thereby, to the Twenty-ninth Day of *September* One thousand eight hundred and nine, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament; to the Encouragement of the Silk Manufactures, to the Twenty-fourth Day of *June* One thousand eight hundred and eight, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament; to the Duties on Spirits made in *Scotland*, and imported into *England*, to the First Day of *December* One thousand eight hundred and nine, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament; and to the encouraging the Growth of Coffee in His Majesty's Plantations in *America*, to the Twenty-fourth Day of *June* One thousand eight hundred and nine, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.

WHEREAS the Law herein-after mentioned has, by Experience, been found useful and beneficial, and it is expedient that the same should be revived, and further continued; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent

Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That an Act, made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for establishing Courts of Judicature in the Island of Newfoundland, and the Islands adjacent*, which by several Acts of the Thirty-fourth, Thirty-fifth, Thirty-sixth, Thirty-ninth, and Thirtieth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, was further continued until the First Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and three, shall, from and immediately after the said First Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and three, be revived, and the same is hereby revived, and shall continue in full Force and Effect from and immediately after the said First Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and three, until the First Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and six.

II. And whereas the Laws herein-after mentioned, have, by Experience, also been found useful and beneficial, and it is expedient that the same should be further continued; be it therefore further enacted, That the several Clauses in an Act made in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the First, intituled, *An Act against clandestine running of uncustomed Goods, and for the more effectual preventing of Ryads relating to the Customs*, relating to such Foreign Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, as shall be taken in at Sea out of any Ship or Vessel, in order to be landed, or put into any other Ship or Vessel, or Boat, and also relating to Goods not reported and found after clearing Ships, and whereby further Remedies are provided against relanding Goods prohibited to be worn in this Kingdom, and Foreign Goods shipped out for Parts beyond the Seas, and relating to the opening or altering the Package of Goods on board of Ship Outward bound, and also relating to hovering Ships or Vessels of the Burthen of Fifty Tons, or under, and also concerning the Bales or Package in which Coffee shall be exported, and also relating to Rum imported in Casks or Vessels not containing Twenty Gallons at the least; and also relating to Certificate Goods entered in order to be exported to *Ireland*; which were to have Continuance for the Term of Three Years from the several Times of the Commencement thereof, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, and which, by several subsequent Acts, was further continued until the Twenty-ninth Day of *September* One thousand eight hundred and two, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, shall be and the same is hereby further continued until the Twenty-ninth Day of *September* One thousand eight hundred and nine, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.

And be it further enacted, That an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, *An Act to empower His Majesty to cause certain countervailing Duties, granted by an Act of the Thirty-seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, 'An Act for carrying into Execution the Treaty of Amity, Commerce, and Navigation, concluded between His Majesty and the United States of America,' to cease, or be suspended until the Twenty-fifth Day of March* One thousand eight hundred and three, under certain Circumstances, shall be, and the same is hereby further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and four.

And be it further enacted, That so much of an Act made in the Forty-first Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for allowing, until the Fifteenth Day of October One thousand eight hundred and one, the Use of Salt, Duty free, in the preserving of Fish in Bulk or in Barrels; for protecting Persons engaged in such Fisheries from being impressed into His Majesty's Service; for discontinuing the Bounty payable on White Herrings exported. and for allowing a Bounty on Pilchards now cured, whether exported or sold for Home Consumption,* as relates to allowing the Use of Salt Duty free in the preserving of Fish in Bulk or in Barrels, and to discontinuing the Bounty payable on White Herrings exported, which was continued by an Act of the last Session of Parliament until the Twenty-fifth Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and three, shall be, and the same is hereby further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and four.

And be it further enacted, That an Act, made in the Thirty-eighth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the further Encouragement of the Trade and Manufactures of the Isle of Man, for improving the Revenue thereof; and for the more effectual Prevention of Smuggling to and from the said Island,* which was continued and amended by an Act made in the Forty-first Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, and further continued by an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, until the Fifth Day of *July* One thousand eight hundred and three, shall be, and the same is, hereby further continued until the Fifth Day of *July* One thousand eight hundred and four.

X. And be it further enacted, That so much of an Act made in the Eighth Year of the Reign of His Majesty King *George* the First, for the Encouragement of the Silk Manufactures of this Kingdom, and for taking off several Duties on Merchandizes exported, and for reducing the Duties upon Beaver Skins, Pepper, Mace, Cloves, and Nutmegs imported, and for Importation of all Furs of the Product of the *British* Plantations into this Kingdom only, and that the Two Corporations of Assurance on any Suits brought on their Policies shall be liable only to single Damages and Costs of Suit, as relates to the Encouragement of the Silk Manufactures of this Kingdom, and to the taking off several Duties on Merchandize exported, which was to continue in Force for Three Years from the Twenty-fifth Day of *March* One thousand seven hundred and forty-two, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, and which by several subsequent Acts was further continued until the Twenty-fourth Day of *June* One thousand eight hundred and two, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, shall be, and the same is, hereby further continued until the Twenty-fourth Day of *June* One thousand eight hundred and eight, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, so far as relates to the Encouragement of the Silk Manufactures of this Kingdom.

So much of 8 Geo. 1. c. 15. as relates to the Silk Manufactures of this Kingdom, etc. shall be further continued till June 24, 1808, etc.

XI. And be it further enacted, That so much of an Act, made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the Regulation of Distilleries in Scotland, and the Exportation of British made Spirits from England to Scotland, and from Scotland to England, for a limited Time*, as imposes Duties on Spirits made or manufactured in that Part of *Great Britain* called *Scotland*, and imported from thence into that Part of *Great Britain* called *England*, and which was to continue in Force until the First Day of *December* One thousand seven hundred and ninety-five, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, and which, by an Act made in the Thirty-sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, was further continued until the First Day of *December* One thousand eight hundred and two, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, shall be, and the same is, hereby further continued until the First Day of *December* One thousand eight hundred and nine, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.

XII. And be it further enacted, That an Act made in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *George* the Second, for the encouraging the Growth of Coffee in His Majesty's Plantations in *America*, which was to continue in Force from the Twenty-fifth Day of *March* One thousand seven hundred and five, until the Twenty-fifth Day of *March* One thousand seven hundred and thirty-nine, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, and which, by several subsequent Acts, was further continued until the Twenty-fourth Day of *June* One thousand eight hundred and two, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, (except such Part thereof as relates to the Importation and Exportation of Foreign Coffee into and from the *British* Colonies and Plantations in *America*), shall be and the same is hereby further continued until the Twenty-fourth Day of *June* One thousand eight hundred and nine, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
