Probably the most successful mission given in this State was during the past quarter of a century was that which terminated on Palm Sunday, at St. Patrick's Pro-Cathedral, of which Right Rev. Mgr. D'Arcy, which was presided at the beloved rector. The attendance throughout gave joy to the zealous missionaries. This was specially the case during the second week, which was devoted to the men, generally the daughters of Eve bear the palm numerically in approaching the Sacraments in such times of year; but for one it must be said that the men of St. Patrick's will have to be awarded that honor.
The exercises were conducted by Father MacLennan, of the Society of Jesus, assisted by his zealous confreres—Rev. Fathers J. P. X. O'Connor, George Fergus and John O'Rourke of that order. This mission, in its attendance and results, which during the last week, 614 confessions were heard; 75 adults confirmed; 14 persons signed their intention to unite with the Holy Church of the living God.

This exhibit in a parish number about 10,000 souls is an evidence of the earnest work of the Fathers; and should those who have participated persevere in the good resolutions made what joy will follow!

Trials from God.

The difficulty that often comes to our mind and one which some people do not seem able to settle, is that for the most part, it is the good, those who are striving with all the resources of their souls to secure God, who meet with this experience of trial, this test of sterling worth, this tax on patience and good faith. The wicked, it may be observed, seem to prosper. Their souls are out of ship which some lack into port safely and heavily burdened; their business succeeds, health, prosperity and good luck seem to go with them; while to the other hand, the good, those who are striving to lead virtuous, honest lives are the victims in many cases of temporal difficulties. Things don't seem to go right, obstacles which before were never shown arise and almost overwhelm them.

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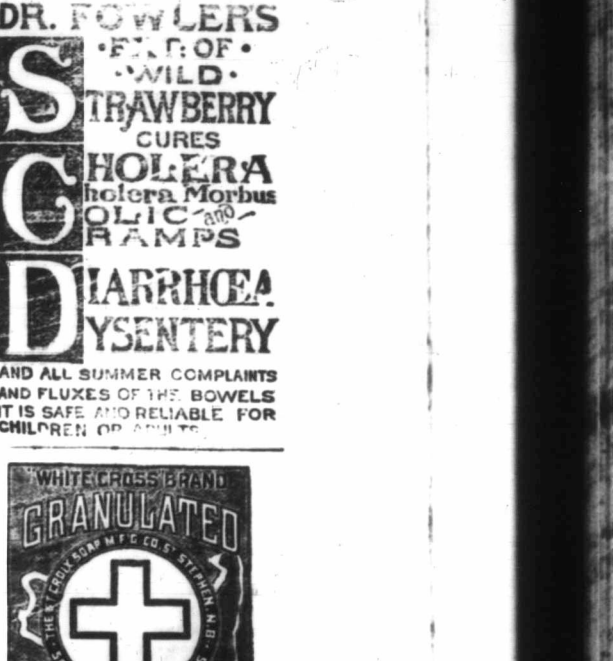
It is announced that the holy father has forwarded the insignia of the pontifical order of Christ to Prince Luipold, regent of Hungary. The Holy Father is presenting the personal qualities of that ruler. The official Observer Romano, of the 21st ult., declares utterly false the persistent negations of the Liberator of Germany and of Italy relative to the invitations extended to his holiness to take part in the labor conference now in session in Berlin. In fact, Emperor William, fully recognizing the priority of the pope in the great social questions, as also his most efficacious and pre-eminent influence in the moral field where the individual takes firmest hold through medium of the papacy, sending to the Vatican, urged the pope to the conference of Berlin of a papal delegate. Since, for obvious reasons, the official representative of the sovereign could not have occupied his proper place therein, his invitation was declined, consequently the German Emperor delegated the chief of Brevins to assist at the conference as indirect papal representative, and to keep the Vatican informed daily as to the proceedings and results of the congress.

THE SESSION.

The Legislature has been nearly four weeks in session. During that time a considerable amount of work has been done.

Hon. Mr. McLeod has displayed admirable qualities of leadership. His position is a most enviable one.

The future duration of the session will, no doubt, depend in a great measure on the course pursued by the Opposition.

HOSPITAL FOR THE INSANE.

The annual report of the Trustees and Superintendent of the Hospital for the Insane, shows the number of inmates in the Hospital on the 1st January, 1889, was 122.

Twenty-four males and twenty-nine females had been admitted, making a total number under treatment 175.

Eight deaths have occurred, due to the following causes, viz: Three from consumption; two from apoplexy; one from diarrhoea; one from enteritis; and one from exhaustion of acute mania.

During the past year part of the Administration Building occupied by the Medical Superintendent, was fitted up for a ward for female patients.

A novel way of endeavoring to obtain a shortening of the hours of labor in workshops was recently tried in Liverpool, England.

Mr. H. C. McDonald undertook to enlighten the House regarding the length of time an elector should be in possession of property to enable him to vote.

When the House was in committee on Thursday night last on the bill respecting the election of members of the Legislature, several members of the Opposition, in their anxiety to make a point against the Government, endeavored to carry them beyond the bounds of prudence.

Mr. Bell delivered one of his characteristic orations. He had considerable to say relative to the multiplication of votes just before an election.

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CANADA'S RIGHTS AND ALIEN LABOR.

The report of the committee regarding alien labor, says the Toronto Empire, should be the subject of the attention of Parliament.
