"On Thursday last, on the arrival of the Asia at Boston, a United States Marshal came on board and arrested Mr. Samuel G. Levey, of Notre Dame street in this city, who was a passenger on the steamer, retaining him in his custody until the following morning, and then proceeding with him to New York. Mr. Levey telegraphed from Boston to New York to his uncle, Mr. Myers, informing him of his arrest. On his arrival there (still in custody of the United States officer) he was met by Mr. Myers, who was given to understand that on the following (Saturday) morning Mr. Levey would be brought before Major Gen.
