He saw in the newspapers that they told how much the Speaker received perhour. It was not on account of the time that Mr. Speaker had to sit in the chair. He is the chief executive power in the Province, and it leads him into considerable expense. Members of both sides of the house are to be seen at his table, and he was supposed to entertain all distinguished strangers. These men who objected to paying the Speaker \$1,500, are the same men who proposed that the Speaker at Ottaws should receive \$4,000 a year. (Cheers.) It was expected that gentlemen of both sides should meet at his table, as it tended to mitigitate the acrimony offpolitical life. THE SAHARA. SOMETHING OF THE EFFECTS OF CONVERT-ING THE DESERT INTO A SEA.

Something of the Effective Convert.

Two plans have been set before the public with regard to the great project of flooding the immense basin of Sahara, known as El Juf, which is now generally conceded to be the bed of a former inland sea. One of these plans is soft in actual operation that preliminary surveys are now in progress under the direction of M. The other plan is that of reopening the ancient outlet of the inland sea to the Atlantic, at a place called Boca Grande, or Great Mouth, and thus filling with water the vast depression of El Juf, which lies far below the level of the coesa. This basin, irregular in shape, extends from within 12 miles of the saccast to as far south as the region of Amsward and Walata, to the north of Timbuctoo. The greatest length of this despression is given at about 500 miles. The breadth of El Juf is much greater in the south, but toward the northwest it seems gradually to get narvower, terminating in the greatest hreadth at about 120 miles, altegether covering an area of the south, but toward the northwest it seems gradually to get narvower, terminating in the great channel which in former years connected it with the Atlantic Ocean. There cannot be any doubt but that El Juf at one time formed part of the Atlantic Ocean, and the greatest hreadth at the connection existed within historic times seems clear eacough. The importance of the advantages to be gained by the accomplishment of this vast enterprise can hardly be overestimated. Soudan has a population of about 38,000,000 of the most intelligent and energetic of all the African races. They have successively been brought under the influence of Carthaman Republican and Moham. HYPO-PHOS-PHITES races. They have successively open brought under the influence of Carthagenian, Roman, Egyptian and Mohammedan civilization. They have formed themselves into independent states, and possess numerous towns of commercial importance. They have established laws and education, and stamped outmany of the worst forms of pagan superstition. They outlivate the soil and carry on seyeral branches of munufacture with remarkable success. The people of Soudan receive their supply of European merchandise across the Sabars from the ports of Morocco, Algeria, Tunis and Tripoli—a system of communication with the outer world which has existed for thousands of years. Caravans proceeding by any of these routes can only make one journey a year, traveling about 2,000 miles of mountainous and difficult country before the nearest market of Soudan is reached.—These paths, formerly used by the merchants of antiquity, now serve the Arab earsyans. Notwithstanding all these difficulties, the annual value of the trade between the northern ports and Soudan amounts to about \$4,000,000. An easier mode of transit would evidently lead to a large developement of this trade.

The distance from Cape Juby to Timbuction, on the Upper Nigar, is about \$000 miles of almost level country, thus being 1,200 miles shorter than the present roates. On the line proposed by Mr. Mackennie there are no less than 22 stations with plenty of water. We have heard of the desert being made "to blossom as the rose;" it is certainly a fascinating idea that a vast arid waste is to be covered by a portion of the waters of the mighty Atlantic.—And if this opening up of the interior of Africa to civilization and commerce is to abolish the African slave trade, with all its attendant horrors, than do we most carnestly wish it's hearty Godspeed.


