

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

HALIFAX, December 7.

In answer to your enquiry, the Vice-President and General Manager of the Commercial Cable Company send the following and quote only meagre reports of the Halifax disaster received. The newspapers say that thousands of tons of munitions on the French steamship "Mont sult of a collision with the Belgian relief ship "Imo." A conservative estimate is, eight hundred killed, thousands is in the Richmond district. There is much suffering among the homeless. The temperature is below freezing. The telegraph and telephone wires were all down for hours. Emergency communication is now restored. Supplies are being rushed from the neighboring cities to relieve the situation. There are no details of specific losses. The cable ship Mackay-Bennett is undamaged but one of her crew was injured. Have not heard of any loss of other our aeroplanes into Germany.
