Calling to his aid Mr. Carrol of Shanty-avenue, and a friend, who were passing on bicycles, Mr. McEachren brought the body to shore. The body was face downwards in the water, and the forenead was somewhat bruised by the action of the waves bringing it in contact with the sands and gravel. The deceased was dressed in a sealskin jacket and black skirt and was apparently about 50 years of age. The patrol wagon took the body home.

Mrs. Gray called upon Dr. Ball, Sherbourne-street, on Saturday afternoon, about 2 o'clock, and received a bottle of medicine: after this time nothing is known as to her movements. 
