

Hold Up in Hotel.



HOW A SIEGE IS CARRIED ON

The predictions as to the length of time Port Arthur will hold out, it means to take a bravely-defended fortified place, it is seen clearly that the Japanese have at the very least many weeks' work from the time they start their operations. In the first place, the Japanese are not the first time a modern siege with high explosive shells and high-angle fire.

There are several kinds of trenches—simple trenches, firing pits, full saps, and the like. The trench is dug from the fort during the commencing bombardment, this is called the "first parallel." They are dug at a distance of 2000 yards from the fort. But in order that men and guns should be able to get to the trenches, approaches have to be cut. That is, a number of trenches leading from the fort to the "first parallel" are dug. These approaches are in zig-zags, as if they were the lines of a railway. The approaches must be made close—"approaches" and "parallels."

"Parallels" is a trench, often many miles long, which fronts the fort. Saps are dug from the "parallels" to the fort during the commencing bombardment, this is called the "second parallel."
