ECLIPSES FOR 1874.

In the year 1874 there will be two eclipses of the Sun, and two of the Moon, and a transit of Venus over the Sun's disc.

I.—A total eclipse of the Sun, April 15-16, invisible in Canada. This eclipse is visible in South Africa, and as a partial one in the southern part of South America.

11.-A partial eclipse of the Moon, May 1, invisible in Canada.

III.—An annular eclipse of the Sun, October 9-10, invisible in Canada. This eclipse is seen as a central one in Siberia.

IV .- A total eclipse of the Moon, October 24.

For the Sick Room.

THE following recipe makes a deliciously refreshing wash in the sick room, and cools the aching head.

Take of rosemary, wormwood, lavender, rue, sage, and mint, a large handful of each. Place in a stone jar, and turn over it one gallon of strong cider vinegar, cover closely, and keep near the fire four days, then strain, and add one ounce of powdered camphor gum. Bottle and keep tightly corked.

There is a French legend connected with this preparation. During the plague at Marseilles, a band of robbers plundered the dying and the dead without injury to themselves. They were imprisoned, tried, and condemned to die, but were pardoned on condition of disclosing the secret whereby they could ransaack houses infected with the terrible scourge. They gave the above recipe.

Another mode of using it is to wash the face and hands with it before exposing one's self to any infection. It is very aromatic and refreshing in the sick room; so, if it can accomplish nothing more, it is of great value to housekeepers.— Hearth and Home.

RECIPES FOR COLOURING.

GREEN.—For every pound of cloth or yarn add three and a half ounces of alum and one pound of fustic. Steep, (not boil) until the strength is out, and then soak the cloth until it acquires a good yellow; throw out the chips and add the indigo compound slowly until you have the desired shade.

BLACK.—For each pound of goods take two ounces of the extract of logwood and one ounce of blue vitrol; dissolve them seperately in hot soft water; saturate the goods first in the vitrol water, then turn the vitrol water into the other, and keep the dye at a scalding (not boiling) heat for twenty minutes; if cotton goods, *boil* for ten minutes, stirring constantly to prevent spotting. To set the color, immerse the goods with scalding hot water, containing a teacupful of salt to three gallons of water; let the goods remain in until cold, then hang them to dry without wringing; koiling suds will set this colour of black dyed silks.

SALMON COLOR.—This color is made by boiling annatto in strong soap suds.

MADDER RED.—Take one pound of madder for every two pounds of yarn or cloth soak the madder in a brass kettle one night, in warm water enough to cover the yarn. Next morning put in two ounces of madder compound for every pound of madder you have soaked. Then wet your yarn or cloth, and wring it out in clean water. Put it in the dye and place it over the fire, and bring slowly to a scalding heat; keep it at this heat for half an hour. The color will grow deeper the longer it is kept in the dye. When the color suits, rinse the article immediately in cold water, and it is finished.

CHEAP SCARLET RED — To one pound of cloth 2 oz. Cudbear, 3 oz. madder compound; mix the two last in an earthen bowl; then take soft water chough to cover the yarn or cloth you intend to color, put it in a brass or copper kettle, and bring it nearly to a boiling heat, and just before boiling add $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. cream tartar, boil a minute or two, then add the cudbear and compound, boil four or five minutes, then wet the yarn or cloth in warm water, wring it out and put it in the dye; boil $\frac{3}{4}$ of an hour, then rinse in clear, cold water, and dry in the shade.

FOR DYEING COTTON GOODS GREEN.—For every pound of goods take 1 Ib. fustic, 1 oz. logwood chips, add a little blue vitrol, according to the depth of shade required, dissolve them all separate, then mix together and put in the goods, let remain until the desired shade is required.

PERMANENT BLUE FOR COTTON.—For 5 lbs. cloth, dissolve 5 oz. copperas in sufficient water to cover the cloth; soak 30 minutes, add 3 oz. prussiate potash to clean water, put the cloth in this and let stand 30 minutes; then air the cloth and add 3 oz. more prussiate potash, dip again and air it, then add 2 oz. oil vitrol; strain and dip again, then rinse well.

CHROME YELLOW ON COTTON.—For 2 pounds cloth, take 4 oz. sugar lead, dissolve in sufficient water, and run the goods through for 20 minutes at moderate heat; wring out and make a separate dye with 2 oz. bi-chromate potash; into this enter the goods for ten minutes at a gentle heat. Repeat the operation a second time, and a fine yellow will be the result. This yellow may be raised to an orange by running through lime water.

FOR FORETELLING THE WEATHER THROUGHOUT ALL THE LUNATIONS OF EACH YEAR, FOREVER.

This table and the accompanying remarks are the result of many years' actual observation, the whole being constructed on a due consideration of the attraction of the Sun and Moon, in their several positions respecting the Earth, and will, by simple inspection, shew the ob-server what kind of weather will most probably follow the entrance of the Moon into any of its quarters, and that so near the truth as to be seldom or never found to fail.

OBSERVATIONS .- 1. The nearer the time of the Moon's change, first quarter, full and last

quarter are to midnight, the fairer will be the weather during the next seven days.
2. The space for this calculation occupies from ten at night till two next morning.
8. The nearer to mid-day or noon the phases of the Moon happens, the more foul or wet

weather may be expected during the next seven days,
4. The space for this calculation occupies from ten in the forenoon to two in the afterneon. These observations refer principally to the Summer, though they affect Spring and Autumn nearly in the same ratio.

Autumn nearly in the same ratio.
5. The Moon's change, first quarter, full and last quarter, happening during six of the afternoon hours, *i.e.* from four to ten, may be followed by fair weather; but this is mostly dependent on the wind, as is noted in the table.
6. Though the weather, from a variety of irregular causes, is more uncertain in the latter part of Autumn, the whole of Winter, and the beginning of Spring, yet in the main the above observations will apply to those periods also.
7. To prognesticate correctly, especially in those cases where the wind is concerned, the observer should be within sight of a good vane, where the four cardinal points of the heavens are correctly placed.
