SOUSA'S PROPOSED POLICY.

Cannot Recommend Sametion of the Convention with England.

Lison, Oct., 15.—In the Cortes today Senhor Sousa, the new prime minister, outlined his proposed policy.

He said he was unable to recommend the sanction of the convention of England, but did not desire to prevent the execution of the clauses already sanctioned. The government identified itself with the national sentiment on this question, and would willingly accept modifications which, while preserving the dignity and interests of the nation, would facilitate the restoration of harmony with our old ally; but he feared, if the Zambesi reports were true, it would be harder than ever to arrive at an equitable agreement, which Portugal always sincerely desired.

The leaders of various parties made short speeches, in which they gave assurance of an attitude of good will toward the government.

The new ministry is not satisfactory to either party. It is believed that it will collapse after having arranged a settlement of the present crisis in public affairs.






