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AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE WOMEN'S HOME.

(Passed the 17th day of April, A. D. 1879.)

Be it enacted by the Governor, Council and Assembly, as follows :

1. Charlotte Stirling, Blanche Ann Sutherland, Mary Smith, Sarah McEwan, their associates and successors, members of the corporation hereby created, according to the rules and by-laws thereof, are hereby incorporated by the name of "The Women's Home," in connection with the Women's Christian Association, for the purpose of reclaiming and receiving into their asylum unfortunate and depraved women who have been tried at the Police Court, before the Stipendiary Magistrate, or the officer presiding.

2. The corporation may purchase, take, hold and enjoy, real estate to the value or sum of sixty thousand dollars, and may sell, mortgage, convey or otherwise dispose of the same.

3. The Directors for the time being of the "Women's Home" may from time to time, as they see fit, receive and keep any person or persons who may voluntarily wish to avail themselves of the advantage offered by such institution, but the terms of their admission, the length of time leaving, the charges and expenses attending their stay, their control, management and general conduct must be made as the said directors for the time being shall approve of and agree to ; provided that all persons so admitted must observe, perform, keep and submit to the general rules and regulations for the management of said institution.

4. The "Women's Home" shall have power to make all such by-laws and rules as may be necessary for the management and conduct of such an institution, and for carrying out the objects of its incorporation.

SIXTEENTH REPORT
OF THE
Women's Christian Association,
OF THE CITY OF HALIFAX.

The work of the Women's Christian Association has been quietly going forward during the past year. The Night School open during the winter months, the work connected with the Women's Home, the Traveller's Aid Society, and visiting of various kinds have been, as usual, faithfully attended to.

Mrs. Wesley Smith resigned her position of President of the Traveller's Aid Society in February in consequence of departure for England. Mrs. Stoddard, 118 Gottingen St., was appointed in her place in May. A parlor concert in aid of the Boarding Home Fund was held at the President's (Mrs. Farquharson's) residence, on the 22nd of May, which realized the sum of twenty three dollars (\$23.00.) On June 10th an entertainment, the principal features of which were Readings by Miss Wallace, was held in the Church of England Institute Rooms for the same purpose which brought the sum of sixty dollars (\$60.00.)

Mrs. C. C. Blackadar kindly consented to take Mrs. W. Smith's place as Treasurer for the Association during her absence in England.

We would recommend the Reports of the Women's Home and Night School to the careful perusal of the subscribers to the Association.

We wish to convey our grateful thanks to the Editors of the "Acadian Recorder," "Evening Mail," and "Morning Chronicle," for so kindly continuing to insert notices of our meetings free of charge. Thanks are also due to the British and Foreign Book and Tract Society for their kindness in sending papers for distribution at Rockhead Prison.

The committee of the Women's Christian Association wish to place on record their sorrow at the removal from their midst of Mrs. J. Parsons the most valued Treasurer of the Women's Home,

A constant attendant at the meetings of the Association, her good judgment and wisdom could always be relied upon, and they therefore feel that their loss, as an Association, is very great.

Another faithful labourer in the person of Miss Mary Starr has also been called away during the past year, and the Association wish also to express their sense of loss in her departure.

Sixteenth Annual Report of the

Another year has passed away since the last record of the Women's Home, bringing with it a more vital interest in this much needed work, and heartfelt thankfulness for the good accomplished.

A refuge for friendless women and girls is a matter of such necessity, that it would seem superfluous to enlarge upon its worthiness.

The daily papers are constantly bringing before us most harrowing scenes and events in the lives of these unfortunates; homeless! friendless! desperate! they *must* be led to a better life.

What can better tend to dissatisfy them with their wretchedness than the softening influences of a Christian Home, and it is, to such a Home, with these aims *only* in view, that we would ask your kind attention.

Forty-three women and girls have been received into the Home during the year, six months being the time prescribed for their residence there.

They have, as in former years, been taught laundry and house-work and most valuable service in this line has been rendered by our zealous matron Miss Bentley.

A service is held each Sunday afternoon by our

President, and Bible instruction given by Mr. James Farquhar, a time-honoured friend of the Institution.

Addresses have been given each week by the clergymen of the various denominations, these services being greatly aided by the singing of "The King's Daughter." Miss A. Merlin has also kindly assisted at the services.

Several of these girls have been sent to the country as servants. Only those who have given satisfaction during their stay in the Home are recommended, unless the applicant understands the case, and is willing to assist in the reformatations.

The committee would express their thanks to the friends who have so kindly rendered assistance to the Home in the way of contributions of clothing, money, &c., and to all who have shown their interest in this work.

The committee would express their thanks to Dr. Cowie, for his gratuitous professional services during this and past years.

It is with sorrow we record the death of Miss Mary Starr, a valued member of the committee, and its former chairwoman.

In closing this report, let us assure you that although the difficulties of such a work are great, and the discouragements many, we enter upon the new year with fresh courage, knowing that He in whose name the work is done, is sure to seal it with success.

REPORT OF NIGHT SCHOOL

FOR THE WINTER OF 1890, UNDER THE CARE OF THE
WOMEN'S CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION, HALIFAX.

The night school, under the direction of W. C. A. re-opened in January, and remained in session during two nights of each week until April, 1890. Number registered 42, over age attendance 20. A good staff of Teachers were in attendance. There were very few visitors at the school during the term. The room was always in the best of order, clean and comfortable, and the Secretary of the School Board, Mr. R. J. Wilson, provided all the necessary supplies.

The closing evening was very pleasant. A tea was provided by the teachers, and some members of the W. C. A. Prizes were given the girls for regular attendance and good behaviour. The Rev. Mr. McPherson kindly presented them. Mrs. Farquharson addressed the school, and tendered a vote of thanks to the teachers from W. C. A. After the programme which was rendered by the girls, consisting of reading, recitations, and singing, Mr. McPherson closed with prayer.
