## REPORT THE

## COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

OF

## TO THE MEMBERS OF THE SOCIETY

## FOR THE YEAR 1877.

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The Committee of Management have the honor to lay before the members the forty-second Annual Report.

The continued commercial depression throughout the country has resulted in many and pressing demands on the charitable fund. The Society has relieved 113 cases comprising 155 persons.

The total amount expended in charity is \$679.03, details of which will be found in the Report of the Sub-Committee of Charity.

In the Treasurer's Report will be found information as to the Society's financial position.

Your committee have pleasure in reporting that the list of membership has been increased by the election of three Life and five Ordinary members, and they would respectfully urge on all who have the Society's welfare at heart continued efforts to induce Englishmen or their descendants to join the Society.

Our anniversary service was held in the Cathedral on the evening of St. George's day when the Revd. C. W. Rawson (in the absence of the Revd. G. V. Housman, M.A., through illness) preached an excellent sermon, prayers being read by the Revd. M. M. Fothergill, and the musical portion of the service being under the direction of Mr. E. A. Bishop, Cathedral organist, assisted by the ladies and gentlemen of the Cathedral Choir a: d others, to all of whom the Society is much indebted.

The/Offertory in aid of the Society's charitable fund amounted to \$115.37.

Your committee have pleasure in expressing their satisfaction with their arrangements with the Finlay Asylum and Ladies Protestant Home for providing temporary homes for deserving cases of distress.

We are under obligation to Captain R. H. Russell, Shipping Master, and to his deputy William Miller, Esq., who with their usual kindness have procured passages to England for several Englishmen desirous of working their way homeward.

We are also indebted to the Richelieu and Ontario Navigation Company for reduction of fare on several occasions.

Our society deplores the loss by death of the following members, viz:-Rev. Jasper Hume Nichols, D. D., Honorary member, Thomas Benson, Esq., life member since 1853, William Crawford, Esq., a life member elected in 1854, and one who for many years took an active part in the Society's affairs and on several occasions filled the office of Vice-President. Also William Cotnam, Esq., an old citizen, and for many years an ordinary member of the Society.

There was one interment in the Society's lot at Mount Hermon, viz: the late Mrs. Butterworth.

# SUB-COMMITTEE OF CHARITY

TO THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

## FOR THE YEAR 1877.

The Sub-Committee of Charity have the honor to report as follows:

Relief has been extended to 113 cases of distress comprising 155 persons, 94 men, 17 women and incidentally 44 children.

The sub-committee are much intebted to R. H. Russell, Esq., the shipping master of the port, for his kind disposition in aiding the Society, and also to his assistant Mr. Miller, the deputy shipping master, in finding opportunities for several men to work their way home.

The Richelieu and Ontario Navigation Company have also tended much to aid the Society, and have, in all cases, forwarded our applicants for half fare.

The sub-committee would respectfully suggest to their successors in office the urgent necessity of being cautious in rendering assistance to the numerous applications which are likely to call upon their sympathies; many of those relieved during the past year were subsequently to the regret of your committee found undeserving.

The Right Revd. George Jehosaph t Mountain, D.D., D.C.L., Lord Bishop of Quebec, was the second son of Bishop Ja ob Mountain, the first Ang ican bishop of Quebec, was the second son to Dishop Ja on Mountain, the first Ang ican bishop of Quebec. He was born 27th July, 1789, at Norwich, England, came to Canada with his father, 1703, and died after a brief illness at Eardfield, his country seat, on 5th Jany., 1863. He was nine-teen years Rector of Quebec, and was consecrated Rishop 14th February, 1836. He was a diligent visitor among his flock, and in the dreadful vi itations of cholera in 1832 and 1834, he literally lived night and day mong the duing and the due with its flock. among the dying and the dead, while in 1847, when the rovince was visited with the plague of typhus fever, and the poor emigrants were dying by thousands at the Quarantine station, the Bishop took his turn at Grosse Is'e regularly with the rest of the clergy; and again when the cholera visited Quebec, 1849 and 1864, he was diligent in visiting the hospitals. During many years and up to the time of his death, Bi-hop Mountain, besides his Life members ip, contributed regularly to the Society a donation equal to four annual subscriptio s, and at all times took a great interest in its proceedings.




