All that East Roskeliae wanted was a water supply, which if the city would grant, the legs would be knocked from under the annexation row.

The other gentlemen present strongly advocated annexation. Mr. Oler stated that the owners \$200,000 worth of Roskeliae land, the total assessed value of which was \$225,000, were in favor of the scheme. On motion of Ald. Lamb, the interests of whose constituents in St. David's are identical with those of the Roskeliae, it was voted to recommend that provision be made for the annexation of East Roskeliae.

The question of adding the Annex was talked over, S. H. James appearing to support the scheme. Ald. Lamb appearing to be a land speculator's dog, who is making money out of the city.
